3. Non-Resident Enrollment

Students enrolled only in Guided Independent Study (correspondence). Courses sponsored by Continuing Education and Special Programs. (Definition revised Annual Report 1997/98)

4. Graduate Students/Declared Candidates (Page 3)

Graduate students who have been accepted for graduate study by a department of the University. It does not indicate that they received admission to candidacy.
