

The men who populate the Missouri Valley Conference track world will hardly bolt out of bed in shock when they hear that Chris Bucknam is excited about Northern lowa's prospects for the upcoming seasons.

After all, the Panthers' head man is always upbeat, and he always has good reason to be. In the nine years since UNI joined the Valley, Bucknam has turned his men into consistent contenders for the indoor and outdoor championships, winning six overall. He's coached individual champions like hurdler Joey Woody, sprinter Devon Davis and pole vaulter Jacob Pauli, and there usually seems to be a purple-clad relay team rounding the turn first.

What may cause a raised eyebrow is Bucknam's notion that his optimism must be curbed, if only a little. He saw injuries and the absence of some redshirted athletes contribute to UNI's second-place finish at last year's Missouri Valley Outdoor Meet after the Panthers claimed the indoor title. So he knows that even the strongest of programs are far from invulnerable to the competition, or to mere bad luck.

Having said that, Bucknam can find as many reasons for excitement in 2001-2002.

"We're in pretty good shape," said Bucknam. "We're well-rounded and talented. We'll see what we can do with that this year.

"We're going to be the team to beat -- indoor and outdoor. But that's why they have the meet. We don't underestimate anyone in the Valley and we don't assume a thing. We'll take it one meet at a time and have a championship attitude at every meet."

Bucknam also thinks the Panthers can be a force at the NCAA level, and history indicates why. Woody and Pauli have both been national champions for UNI at the outdoor and indoor meets, respectively.

"We've been in the top 20 before," said Bucknam. "We'd like to be in the top 10. Maybe this is the year we can get it done."

Of course, UNI will have to do it without some talented athletes from the 2000-2001 men's team. Pauli and his NCAA Indoor crown are gone. So are All-American weightman Dave Jennings, distance man Levi Timar, and All-MVC sprinter Jeff Adam. Defending Valley steeplechase champion Mate Nemeth has returned to his native Hungary because of a family illness.

But that's merely the bad news. Bucknam can point to a solid mix of veterans and newcomers up and down his roster.

Take the sprints and Devon Davis. The senior is a two-time Most Valuable Athlete in the Valley, the reigning league outdoor champion at 100 and 200 meters, an NCAA qualifier who posted a blazing 10.19 time at the Texas Relays and one-fourth of the 4 x 200 relay team that set a school record at the Drake Relays.

The other three runners on that relay -- Josh Wilson, Dirk Homewood and Branimir Peitel -- are also back. Ready to join them is Patrick Hunter, a nationally-ranked sprinter during his high school days at Racine, Wis.

"Our sprints are well-represented with national-caliber kids," said

Bucknam also likes his corps of hurdlers. Burke Bockman, a former MVC champ in the 400 IM hurdles, is back after an injury cost him the 2001 outdoor season. Kenny Edwards, another injury-plagued athlete a year ago, is ready to go in the 110 highs, as are Cyrus Nichols (an all-conference performer) and Steve Blocker. Among the newcomers to watch are Chris McCullough of West Des Moines Valley in the highs and 400 hurdler Pete Avery from Waverly-Shell Rock.

In the middle distance, Dave Paulsen is back after provisionally qualifying for the NCAA 800 and claiming all-Valley honors in that same event plus the 4×400 . Joel Sullivan will be available after redshirting a year

ago. Cody Neuendorf returns and the newcomer here is Waverly-Shell Rock's Adam Hinders. "I think he'll be a national-caliber 800 runner someday," said Bucknam.

At 1500 meters, Rob Brock is back from a torn anterior cruciate ligament that sidelined him a year ago, but he's also one of the veterans that helped UNI upset Stanford in the 2000 Drake Relays 4 x 1,600 relay. So is Balazs Csillag, who claimed the MVC indoor mile championship last winter but did not compete outdoors. Iowa City freshman Roberto Moreno joins them after a redshirt year.

Any discussion of the long distance races has to begin with Oliver Bodor. As a freshman, Bodor earned the Valley Athlete of the Year award indoors and claimed the 5,000 and 10,000 at the outdoor conference meet. "He won every race he ran," said Bucknam. With Nemeth absent, Csillag may see duty in the long distance events along with Trent Graham, Josh Crain and Miles Bern.

Shifting to the field events, Bucknam said that UNI is "overall a little bit thinner here, but we still have some outstanding athletes."

With Jennings gone, veteran Robert Hamre leads the weight crew and he's expected to contribute in both the shot put and discus. Derrick Benner, a redshirt last year outdoors, also will compete here along with Brad Travis, an all-Valley 35-pound weight thrower indoors. Grant Wesson is a hammer and discus man, while North Fayette freshman Justin Heins and Milan Seremet from Croatia are the rookies.

Pauli's absence in the pole vault will be deeply felt by UNI, but Bucknam has hopes for a pair of younger jumpers. James Ready, a true freshman from Wyoming, was nationally-ranked in high school. He'll join sophomore Kyle Herman.

In the high jump, Rory Howell has all-conference credentials. He's gone 6-10 1/2 in the past and Bucknam thinks he can take a shot at seven feet. Sophomore Jeff Olorundami also will concentrate on this event after trying the hurdles earlier in his career.

The long jump and triple jump duties may fall to Davis, who qualified for the NCAAs as a freshman long jumper. Edwards and Travis Geopfert could be called to duty here as well.

Those two men also give UNI strength in the decathlon after redshirting last year. They are both former Missouri Valley Champions in this event. Also returning is Kyle Herman, second in the decathlon last spring.

So there they are - the men who can compete for Valley titles, according to Bucknam. Just in case the excitement wanes a little during those long hours of workouts, the UNI coach has one more piece of incentive for his Panthers.

"We're hosting both the MVC indoor and outdoor championships this year," said Bucknam. "That's added incentive to do well."

While spectators often focus on the great runner sprinting to the

tape or the jumper sailing into the record books, track and field remains a team sport.

Looking from that perspective, it's easy to understand why head coach Chris Bucknam wants a little more from the women who compete for Northern Iowa this year.

During the outdoor season, the Panthers had eight all-conference performers, among them two champions, at the Missouri Valley Outdoor meet. That's fine, but UNI finished fifth in the team race, and for a man who's guided the women up the MVC staircase since taking over the program, it wasn't quite good enough.

"In general, I was fairly pleased with our indoor performance last year," said Bucknam. "Outside, we had some outstanding individual performances, but it was not the team finish I was looking for. We look to correct that this year with some key women off redshirts and some freshmen we think will be able to help us right away.

"We're trying so hard to contend for a conference title with the women's team. We won't be satisfied until we can do that on a consistent basis."

Only a handful of athletes from the 2000-2001 team are missing, most notably sprinters Jill Bakewell and Teresa Grothus plus Kari Thilges in the distances. Missouri Valley Conference hurdles champion Dee Wear has just an indoor season of eligibility remaining. So that mixture of veteran talent and promising youth athletes can be found in several spots on the UNI roster.

In the sprints, for example, Deb Cordner returns from a redshirt season. Just two years ago, Cordner won an MVC title at 400 meters, and she'll join talented Mellisa Campbell, who earned all-conference honors in the 100 and 200 outdoors plus two relays last spring.

Another all-Valley performer with experience is Inga Hope, who helped UNI score at the outdoor meet in the 4 x 100 relay. Amanda Mueller, a promising freshman from Forest Lake, Minn. could also help in the 400. The same could be said for West Delaware's Angie German and Jill Schweibert of Aplington-Parkersburg, a pair of frosh who may run the 400 indoors and the 400 hurdles outside.

Then there's Nikki Nelson, the 2000 MVC outdoor champion in the 400 hurdles. Like Cordner, she returns from redshirt status, and she'll help the Panther in her specialty plus the 400 dash.

"It's gonna be a big help having those two back in the fold," said Bucknam as he discussed the return of Cordner and Nelson. "We're thinking that in the long and short sprints, we're on solid ground."

In the middle distances, Bucknam may also turn to Nelson for help indoors, given that UNI is "a little bit thin" at 800 meters. Wendy Shaw, a sophomore, may get a chance here.

Moving up the distance ladder, Bucknam is looking forward to the Division I debut of Ages Kroneraff, a freshman from Hungary. "She looks to make a huge impact," said the Panther head coach, who thinks Kroneraff can compete anywhere from 3,000 to 10,000 meters.

Injuries have cast shadows over a couple of distance crew members. Rita Fiala suffered an injury in cross country last spring, and she's expected to redshirt for the indoor season. Elly Glass, a key member of the MVC cross country championship team in 2000, is also dealing with an injury.

Freshman Emily Shoopman may be able to help the Panthers,

along with Kris Hand, in the steeplechase.

Wear, who's won Missouri Valley Conference titles in the hurdles both indoors and outdoors, will finish her UNI career with her final indoor season. "She looks like the person to beat," said Bucknam, as he looked ahead to the Valley 100 hurdles in the UNI-Dome. Helping Wear at the shorter distance will be Jillian Sinnwell.

Outdoors, Nelson, German and Schwiebert form what Bucknam labels a "tough group" for the 400 hurdles.

In the field events, the throws "remain a big concern" for Bucknam. However, Jess Boline is back after she set a school record in the discus, breaking an 11-year-old mark by five feet with her 155-1 effort.

One of the strongest areas on the women's track team at UNI may be the jumps, especially in the pole vault. Crystal Seamans won the Missouri Valley Conference outdoor vault in her first season with the Panthers and she shares the school record (10-6 1/2) with fellow veteran Liz Robertson. Added to the roster are two state vault champions from Kansas - Erin Wessely (12'0) and Kayleen Popp (11'0). Wessely is the daughter of Keith Wesseley, an All-American in the high jump at UNI in 1974.

Bucknam also likes his trio of high jumpers - Katie Johnson, Melissa Nelson and Amanda Koester.

"We feel like we're in good shape in the vertical jumps," said Bucknam.

In the long jump and triple jump, it'll be up to Campbell and Kara Hulse to score points in an area that's thin.

In the heptathlon, Seamans leads the way. Aside from her victory in the MVC outdoor pole vault, she also received an all-conference spot in the multi-events. Jill George also returns here.

Summing it up, Bucknam said, "Our success depends on our talented kids staying healthy and doing what they're capable of doing."

Now in his 19th season as head coach of the Panther track and field program, Chris Bucknam has molded Northern Iowa into one of the top all-around programs, not only in the Midwest, but in the nation.

Bucknam has carried on the proud Panther tradition passed on from previous coaches, and taken the program to new heights in the powerful Missouri Valley Conference and on the national landscape.

During Bucknam's tenure, UNI has won 20 conference titles -- eight in indoor track, seven in cross country and four outdoor crowns.

"I have been approaching coaching the same way as I did in the in the very beginning and that is to try to put a championship caliber team on the track each year," said Bucknam. "Championship caliber means our number one goal is the MVC Championship and placing at the NCAAs, everything we do revolves around that."

Now in his fifth year directing both the men and women's programs, Bucknam and his staff are charting the same course for success for the women that the men's team has travelled so successfully.

Since his arrival at UNI in 1979 as an assistant to longtime head coach Lynn King, the Panthers have won or shared 25 conference titles in track and field and cross country, and produced 31 all-Americans.

"Not only are we proud of our all-Americans, but when you look at the different events that those all-Americans occur in we have one in almost every track event," commented Bucknam. "I think that has something to say about our coaching staff and the expertise that we have in place. It also says something about our commitment, we are not just a one-dimensional team. We try to be the total package."

Bucknam oversaw Northern lowa's 1991 move to the Missouri Valley, where the Panthers have left an indelible mark on the league.

Although the Valley historically has been one of the best conferences in the nation, boasting numerous all-Americans, national champions and Olympians, UNI stepped in and became one of the top competitors in the league instantly.

"Our ultimate goal with our athletes is to get them to reach their potential individually and that is how we measure ourselves as a coaching staff," said Bucknam. "When we are able to do that and get everyone to do that at the right time that's when the championships come together."

In fact, in the 10 years since joining the conference, the Panthers have the best average finish in the league on the men's side, having claimed eight titles, 10 runner-up finishes, four thirds and two fourths.

In his tenure as UNI's head coach, Bucknam has produced two national champions and 23 all-Americans in the 61 qualifiers he has sent to the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships.

"There is a commitment to the track and field program, and any athlete that comes to Northern lowa has the opportunity to be a great athlete in any event, said Bucknam. "We have great facilities, coaching staff and equipment, and that enables our program to succeed."

Bucknam picked up his eighth Missouri

Valley Coach of the Year honor after UNI captured the men's cross country title in October, 2001. Additionally, Bucknam received the United States Track Association's Regional Coach of the Year award in May, 2001 after a successful men's outdoor season.

After the Panthers won the MVC outdoor championship in 1995, he was named District V Coach of the Year and was a finalist

for National Coach of the Year. Prior to joining the Valley, Bucknam was named the top coach in the Mid-Continent Conference seven times.

Bucknam and his staff took the men's program to an even higher level in 1997 when the Panthers placed 17th at the NCAA Outdoor Championships.

"The reason we've had success is because of the outstanding talent we've had from lowa and the fact that we are not afraid to look beyond the Mississippi and Missouri to find additional talent." said Bucknam.

Bucknam coached his first NCAA champion in 1997 when current assistant coach Joey Woody won the 400-meter hurdles at the national outdoor meet. Bucknam also saw his second national champion crowned last season when Jake Pauli won the indoor pole vault title.

A native of Beverly, Mass., Bucknam attended Norwich University in Northfield, Vt., where he was a four-time letterwinner in track, specializing in the middle distances. He was elected co-captain his senior year and graduated in 1978 with a bachelor's degree in physical education. He earned his master's in physical education from Northern Iowa in 1982.

Bucknam and his wife, Cindy, reside in Cedar Falls with their son, Eric, and daughter, Kate.

ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH DOUG CASE

Former Panther standout Doug Case is in his third season as the assistant head coach. Case returned to his alma mater in 1999, replacing longtime assistant Bill Lawson.

Prior to his appointment at UNI, Case had spent the previous two seasons as the head men's coach at Drake University. Under Case's

guidance, Drake set three school records during the indoor season and its distance medley relay team placed ninth at the NCAA Championships.

Before taking over the Bulldog program, Case served seven years as an assistant track and cross country coach at Arkansas State, helping guide the men's and women's programs to nine Sun Belt Conference titles. He was the Indians' recruiting coordinator and primarily worked with the hurdlers, throwers and multi-event competitors.

The Marshalltown, lowa, native has developed a reputation as an outstanding recruiter. At ASU, he was responsible for recruiting 52 outdoor and 49 indoor individual conference champions. His recruiting classes included 39 NCAA Division I national qualifiers, four all-Americans and three Olympic Trials qualifiers.

As a Panther sprinter and hurdler, Case established eight school records from 1982-86 and was an all-conference performer in the Mid-Continent Conference. He was a member of the school record holding 4 x 100 and 4 x 200 outdoor relay teams and the 440 indoor relay. Individually, he twice placed second at the AMCU meet in the 100-meter dash and finished third indoors as a senior. He also was a Drake Relays finalist in the 100 meters.

"Doug is an outstanding, proven Division I coach whose record speaks for itself," says head coach Chris Bucknam. "To be able to attract someone of his caliber to our staff says a lot for our program. He has big meet experience with the Drake Relays and an outstanding record with Arkansas State. I really think he brings us up a notch."

Case received his bachelor's degree in physical education from UNI in 1987. His first coaching experience came at Wartburg College, where he served as an assistant in 1988-89.

He and his wife, Chris, reside in Cedar Falls with their children -- Kelsey, Lauren and Cameron.



ASSISTANT COACH MIKE GIESLER

Mike Giesler is in his second season as the assistant coach in charge of the field athletes. He fills the spot on the staff vacated when former UNI assistant Shantel Twiggs resigned in June, 2000, to accept the head women's track coaching position at Northern Illinois University.

Since August of 1996, Giesler has served

as the women's track and cross country coach at the University of Tennessee at Martin where he helped lead the growth of the Skyhawk's track program. Prior to UT-M, Giesler spent seven years as an assistant coach at Southern Illinois University, where his main responsibility was recruiting. He is recognized as one of the primary vertical jump coaches in the Midwest.

Giesler, a 1990 graduate of Eastern Illinois University, enjoyed a fantastic career, earning five conference titles, three in the javelin and two in the decathlon. Prior to EIU, he attended Parkland Junior College and was a finalist in the 600-yard dash in the National Indoor and Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

"We're extremely pleased to have someone of Mike's caliber join our program," head coach Chris Bucknam said. "He brings with him a strong national reputation and a great work ethic. We hired Mike to coordinate our field event development, a vital area to the future of our program."



ASSISTANT COACH KYLE KEPLER

Former Panther distance runner Kyle Kepler is in his fourth season as a Panther assistant coach after completing a stellar career at UNI.

A native of Webster City, Iowa, Kepler joined the UNI program in 1993 after earning all-state cross country honors in high school. It didn't take long to make an impression as he

placed 10th at the Missouri Valley Conference cross country meet and earned all-conference honors as a freshman. Kepler went on to become a four-time all-conference cross country runner, finishing in third place his senior year. He is a two-time member of the all-district team by finishing 20th at the NCAA Midwest Regional Championship Meet in 1995 and 15th in 1997.

On the track, Kepler was an all-conference performer five times in two different events -- in the 5,000 meters, 10,000 meters. In 1998, in his final collegiate competition, he claimed a runner-up finish at the Missouri Valley Conference Outdoor Championships in the 10,000 meters. He holds the indoor 5K school record with a time of 14:26.44.

In the classroom, Kepler was a three-time selection to the conference all-academic team in both track and cross country.

As a coach, he assists with the distance runners and is responsible for various administrative duties, including the track program's alumni newsletter.

"We are very fortunate to have Kyle on our staff," commented head coach Chris Bucknam. "As a nine-time all-conference runner he is the ipedamy of what we are all about as a program. He was an outstanding lowa athlete that contributed to major conference championships."

ASSISTANT COACH JOEY WOODY

Perhaps the greatest track athlete the University of Northern Iowa has ever produced, Joey Woody is in his fourth season as a Panther assistant after graduating from UNI in 1997.

During his career with the Panthers, Woody earned all-American honors in the 400-

meter hurdles three times and, in 1997, won UNI's first individual Division I track and field national championship.

He also earned all-America honors in 1996 in the indoor 800 meters and was named Missouri Valley Conference Track Athlete of the Year on three occasions, including his final collegiate season at the 1997 Outdoor Championships. Woody won the 400-meter hurdles at the Drake Relays two consecutive years and was named the top male athlete at the event in 1994.

A native of lowa City, Woody brings plenty of valuable experience to the Panther program. Since his graduation from UNI, he has continued to compete and has been a major force professionally, both on the national and international level.

He is a member of the world record holding 4 x 800-meter relay team that shattered a 29-year-old record by nearly four seconds with a time of 7:13.94.

Woody entered 2000 ranked second in the United States and sixth in the world in the 400-meter hurdles. In 1999, he captured a Gold Medal at the World Championships as a member of the U.S. 4 x 400-meter relay team, and finished sixth in the 400-meter hurdles. He also placed second at the U.S. Championships.

He enjoyed a productive 1998 as well, winning a Gold Medal at the World Cup as part of the U.S. 4 x 400 team and finishing fifth in the hurdles. He won the Bronze Medal at the 1998 U.S. Championships, placed fourth at the Goodwill Games and won the Drake Relays title.

Woody has competed frequently in Europe over the past three years as a member of the Reebok and New Balance Track Clubs and will again be competing overseas in 2001. He continues his training in Cedar Falls after finishing fourth in the 2000 Olympic Trials.

Woody's main focus as a coach is with the hurdlers, long sprinters and middle distance runners.

"Joey is an outstanding coach," Bucknam said. "He is a knowledgeable, elite athlete who has gained experience all over the world and can bring that information back to our program."

Joey and his wife, Heather, who competed as a sprinter at UNI, live in Cedar Falls.



ASSISTANT COACH BOB EDWARDS

Bob Edwards is in his ninth season as the assistant coach in charge of pole vaulters.

Edwards enjoyed an outstanding career at UNI as a vaulter, winning the Missouri Valley Conference outdoor title as a senior. He also won indoor and outdoor championships in the Mid-Continent Conference in 1990. His vault

of 17-4 1/2 in 1992 places him third on UNI's all-time outdoor list, and he ranks fourth on the indoor chart at 17-1 1/2.

"Bob's done a fabulous job with our vault crew over the years," said head coach Chris Bucknam. "He was the best pole vaulter at UNI before Juri (Rovan) got here and he is another one of our coaches who brings a lot of knowledge and experience to the program."

Edwards has played a key role in the development of recent Panther standouts Rovan and Jake Pauli. Rovan was a two-time all-American and is the school outdoor recordholder, while Pauli is the UNI indoor recordholder, 2001 indoor NCAA Champion and six-time all-American.

Sports Medicine


The Northern lowa sports medicine program features toprate facilities and the outstanding services of sports and health care professionals.

The sports medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Merac strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve an athlete's flexibility.

Athletic trainers and physicians work together to design rehabilitation programs for injured athletes. A wide variety of facilities and equipment, not only in the Sports Medicine Lab but in the Wellness and Recreation Center, including swimming pools, Merac equipment, Stairmasters and various exercise bicycles, help athletes rehabilitate injuries and minimize the loss of fitness during recuperative time.







Conditioning

The Northern lowa strength and conditioning program is a blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each student-athlete.

Throughout the year, UNI athletes can spend more time working on strength and conditioning than any other aspect of their sport. During the off-season, athletes work on strength improvement, speed, power, agility and conditioning. The in-season program is devoted to continuation of strength gains and performance-related conditioning.

During an athlete's first year on campus, baseline measures of strength, speed, power, flexibility and endurance are collected. Measures of body composition and weight also are recorded. With this information, goals are set for development and maintenance. Programs are established for each athlete by Strength and Conditioning coach Jim Kramer, who was recognized by his peers as the best in his profession in 1999.

Maritaintles

Winning in the classroom and achieving an academic degree is the primary goal for each student-athlete at the University of Northern lowa. It is the University's chief objective to allow each individual to have the maximum opportunity to participate in a positive educational experience and ultimately earn a college degree.


As a medium-sized public university with a faculty committed to quality undergraduate education, Northern lowa is proud of its student-athletes' performance in the classroom. In information taken from the 1998 NCAA Division I Graduation Rates Report, UNI athletes graduated at a rate higher than the general student body and at a higher rate than any of their Missouri Valley Conference counterparts. In fact, 35 to 40 percent of UNI student-athletes perennially post grade-point averages of 3.0 or better.

The key to Northern lowa's academic program is the individual -the student-athlete gets out of the system what he or she puts into it.
UNI has geared its academic program to make its student-athletes
better individuals. It is important that the student-athletes develop a
sense of pride in themselves as students, as athletes, as citizens, and
as representatives of the University of Northern lowa.

Athletes can take advantage of the Athletics Academic Advisor, who has responsibilities specifically to Panther student-athletes. The Advisor will assist athletes in scheduling, choice of major, tutorial services and other services to assure satisfactory progress toward a degree.

The Athletics Academic Advisor's Office also has established the Panther Athletic Academic Center, or PAAC for short. PAAC is a service which provides student-athletes with study services during day-time and evening hours that better accommodate their active schedules.

Building on a strong tradition of teacher education, the University of Northern lowa has evolved into one of the finest comprehensive public universities in the country. UNI emphasizes excellence in undergraduate education and offers selected graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels.


UNI's heritage and philosophy place great value on providing a student-centered educational experience. The university offers a learning environment that is small enough to provide students individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources, including distinguished faculty.



Today, UNI offers more than 120 undergraduate majors. Outstanding academic programs, many of which are nationally-recognized for their excellence, have been established in the colleges of Business Administration, Education, Humanities and Fine Arts, Natural Sciences, and Social and Behavioral Sciences. In addition, UNI participates in the bachelor of liberal studies program offered by lowa's Regent Universities and provides classes in centers around the state through the division of Continuing Education and Special Programs.

Recognized as the premier public undergraduate university in the state, UNI is experiencing an increasing demand for its high-quality programs. UNI enrollments have increased by nearly eight percent in the past five years. Enrollment at UNI was 13,774 students in the fall of 2000, the third consecutive year of record enrollments. Students come from every county in lowa, 47 states and 76 countries.

The University of Northern Iowa was founded in 1876 as the Iowa State



Normal School. It became lowa State Teachers College in 1909. In 1961, the name was changed to State College of lowa, and in 1967, the lowa Legislature changed the status of the institution to that of a university under its present title.

UNIADIOTE

The UNI-Dome is a unique, multi-purpose athletic facility built in 1976 which has earned a reputation as one of the finest collegiate athletic facilities in America.

It has been the site of numerous nationally prominent track and field meets such as the Central Collegiate Conference Championships, the Mid-Continent Conference Championships, the AIAW National Championships and is annually the site of the premier indoor high school track meet in lowa, the A.D. Dickinson Relays. In February of 2000, the Dome hosted its fourth Missouri Valley Conference Championship, having previously played host to the event in 1993, '96 and '99.

A glance at the UNI-Dome records list shows some of America's finest athletes, both past and present, have competed in the facility in its 23-year history.

The Dome combines the features of a fieldhouse, football stadium and large auditorium. In addition to top track and field events, it also has hosted NCAA

football playoffs and was the home of the 1997 NCAA Division I Wrestling Championships, which shattered all previous attendance marks.

Approximately 16,400 spectators can be seated for football games and track meets and 10,000 for courtside activities.

The facility provides an ideal training atmosphere for the Northern Iowa track and field program. The Panthers are able to train in the Dome from November to March, utilizing all the field event stations simultaneously due to the spacious arrangement on the arena floor.

With one of the fastest 200-meter indoor tracks in America to call home.



the Panthers annually attract some of the finest teams in the Midwest to their home meets.

With its recent conversion to a hybrid roof system and the installation of a new polyurethane, two-tone track completed in 1999, the UNI-Dome is unsurpassed as one of the premier indoor track and field facilities in the United States.

To date, over eight million people are estimated to have attended events in the Dome.



The complex, which combined with the UNI-Dome gives Northern lowa one of the finest combination of indoor and outdoor facilities in America, opened in Spring, 1998. In its inaugural season, the complex hosted the first annual Northern Iowa Open and the Missouri Valley Conference Championships, won by the Panther men.

The University's investment in this new surface gives the Panthers

the advantage of training and competing under ideal conditions any time of the year.

The 400-meter, eight-lane track is made of the latest state-of-theart polyurethane surface. The track surrounds a field event area that features a steeplechase water jump, two pits each for the long and triple jump, dual throw rings for the weights, a discus/hammer cage and full pour takeoffs for the pole vault, long jump and triple jump.

Wissouri Valley Cont National Parkings

Since its beginning in 1907, the Missouri Valley Conference has been progressive in its thinking and aggressive in capitalizing on its opportunities.

Now in its 94th year of existence, the Valley has become a leader among today's collegiate athletic conferences.

Based in St. Louis since 1985, the conference has been aggressive in the approach to playing host to NCAA basketball championship events, producing a revenue-generating in-house television network, bidding out the right to play host to several sport championships and landing title sponsorships for those events.

Athletic accomplishments on the men's side include four national basketball championships, 17 trips to the NCAA Men's Basketball Final Four and a 1989 national baseball championship. During the 1992-93 academic year, though, women's athletics were added under the MVC umbrella, and the relationship has been mutually beneficial for both.

Valley teams boast a proud, rich tradition in track and field and cross country, and have produced numerous all-Americans over the years. In terms of individual performances, a number of MVC student-athletes annually represent the league at the NCAA Championships.

National champions and all-Americans are nothing new for Missouri Valley student-athletes. In the decade of the '90s, 85 MVC athletes earned all-America honors with 13 of those winning a national championship. Included in the national champions are Northern Iowa's Joey Woody, who captured the 400-meter hurdles title at the 1997 NCAA Outdoor Championships in Bloomington, Ind.

Additionally, Valley athletes have gone on to compete in the Olympic Games or World Championships on 55 occasions. Woody also is included among that group, having competed at the World Championships.

Since joining the MVC in 1991, Northern lowa's men's program has been one of the most consistent forces in the league. In fact, in the first ten years since UNI's membership began, the Panther men have the second-best composite record in the conference.

Seeds for the creation of the Missouri Valley Conference were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions who gathered at the Midland

Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on January 12, 1907. Basketball became the first competitive sport and served as the initial step in establishing the MVC as one of the most respected leagues in the nation.

In addition to track and field and cross country, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's golf, men's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis and women's volleyball.

Members of the Missouri Valley Conference include: Bradley University, Creighton University, Drake University, the University of Evansville, Illinois State University, Indiana State University, the University of Northern Iowa, Southern Illinois University, Southwest Missouri State University and Wichita State University.

Panthers Win MVC Championship - Csillag Wins Individual Title

After coming in second to Illinois State in the 2000 MVC Championships, the Panthers blew the field away at the 2001 MVC Championships with a score of 38 points. This was the culminating achievement for a season that had its ups-and-downs due to injuries.

The 2001 men's Missouri Valley Coach of the Year, Chris Bucknam, was proud of the way his team battled through the tough stretches in the season.

"It was a hard fought victory at the MVC Championship and since the beginning of the season," Bucknam said. "I was really pleased with how we brought it all together when it counted. We had to have a great meet to win and we ran our best race of the season."

Sophomore Oliver Bodor (25:05) and junior Rob Brock (25:13) finished fourth and sixth to help the Panthers to a lopsided win over the rest of the field. Sophomores Trent Graham (12th, 25:25), Josh Crain (15th, 25:35) and Bob Moreno (19th, 25:42) rounded out the Panther finishers.

The Panthers sent five members of the men's team to the Midwest Regional in Carbondale, IL, but the men didn't figure into the team competition after Bodor could not finish the race due to an achilles injury. Brock and Mate Nemeth also were sidelined with injuries, but Csillag shed some light on an otherwise tough weekend when he ran the 10K race in 30:44.9, earning third place and a spot in the NCAA Championships.

Crain and Graham completed successful sophomore campaigns, finishing 103rd and 112th, respectively. Crain finished with a time of 33:17.1, while Graham crossed the finish line at the 33:40.4 mark. Freshman Tad Stolley competed in his first race as a Panther, finishing in 154th place with a time of 35:20.6.

Csillag capped off an outstanding senior season, winning the MVC Championship and finishing third in the Midwest Regional race. He never finished below seventh place in any of his five races before bowing out of the NCAA Championship race after twisting his ankle in the third mile. Csillag also was

named the Prairie Farms/Missouri Valley Conference Scholar Athlete of the Week four times in the short fall season and was named Valley Athlete of the Year for cross country.

Csillag's berth in the NCAA Championships marked the third year in a row that a Panther earned a spot in the final event of the year, following Bodor in 2000 and Levi Timar in 1999. All three qualifiers are part of the UNI/Hungarian distance running connection. Bodor (Siofok, Hungary) and Timar (Szejestefegervar, Hungary) finished 33rd and 50th at the national meet.

"You don't replace a kid like Balazs. We've had great athletes in the past with Joey Woody and Jacob Pauli and Balazs is starting to rank up there with them," said Bucknam. "He has had a great start to his senior year. He isn't really a cross country type guy but he was able to get through it and compete at a high level."

Bodor qualified for the NCAA Championships a year ago as a freshman and was able to piece together a solid sophomore campaign. He set the University Farm Course record in Bloomington, IL on Oct. 13th with a time of 25:11.59 while taking home first place in the Illinois State Invitational. Bodor was named to the Valley Cross Country Scholar-Athlete team after finishing fourth at the MVC Championships.

Women Fight Through Injuries, Adversity

The women began the season as the conference favorites, but injuries turned their season into a frustrating one. Three of the Panthers' top performers from the 2000 season -- Wendy Shaw, Elly Glass and Rita Fiala -- all were hit with the injury bug throughout the entire season.

With those three runners ailing, Coach Chris Bucknam was forced to rely on some young talent to try and salvage a solid season. Emily Shoopman, a freshman from Waterloo (IA), was able to avoid injuries throughout her rookie campaign and ran to consistent times.

"When you lose a couple of girls in cross country, just like on the men's side with Mate Nemeth being out, then it is really tough to stay in the hunt," said Bucknam. "We had high

Championship, the women could only muster up seventh place, just nine points out of fourth place. Shoopman led the way with her 20th place finish in a time of 18:54, a season best. Fiala ran to a 26th place finish with a time of 19:12, and Shaw finished with a time of 19:22, good enough for 29th. Freshmen Kris Hand and Emily Schrobilgen rounded out the Panthers' top five, running to 32nd and 64th place, respectively.

"We had four girls run pretty good, and our fifth girl (Schrobilgen) ran her first collegiate race ever," Bucknam said. "We have some work to do, we are not guitters, and I can be positive that the indoor and outdoor seasons are going to be good this year."

In probably its best performance of the year, the women's team tied for first place with Illinois State at the Illinois State Invitational. Both teams finished with 39 points, while Bradley finished in third with 44. Glass competed in her final event of the fall and ran to a time of 19:59.21.

Fiala had her best finish of the season at the Illinois State Invitational when she finished in fourth place with a time of 19:40.95. Her season started with injuries, but she was able to compete towards the end of the season. An all-MVC runner during the 2000 season, she also finished 26th at the MVC Championships with a time of 19:12.29.

Shoopman was the only member that competed for the women's team in the Midwest Regional due to a multitude of injuries. Shoopman finished the 5K event with a time of 24:37.2, earning her 137th place.

"Emily did good this year and we feel she is a Division I runner," said Bucknam. "She needs to get stronger and more confident, then her talent will come out more and she'll be able to show us some more."

Her consistency was evident throughout the entire fall. Her times of 19:06 at Illinois, 19:09 at Notre Dame, 19:44 at Illinois State and 18:54 at the MVC Championship let the coaches know what to expect out of her.

Shaw had a great beginning to the season, placing 31st at the Illini Invitational with a time of 18:25, her best of the season. She finished in the top 15 at the MVC Championships in 2000, but stress fractures kept her from performing her best and kept her out of the Midwest Regional this season.

Hand, a redshirt freshman, finished fourth on the team in every meet and ran her best time of the fall at the Illini Invitational, 19:15.

Even with the trying year that the women faced, some battles were won. They showed that they could compete with pain, and still put together solid performances.

It is likely that the Panthers will be looked at as a solid team going into next season if everyone is healthy. With all seven members of this year's team gaining experience and returning next fall, there should be big things on the horizon.






