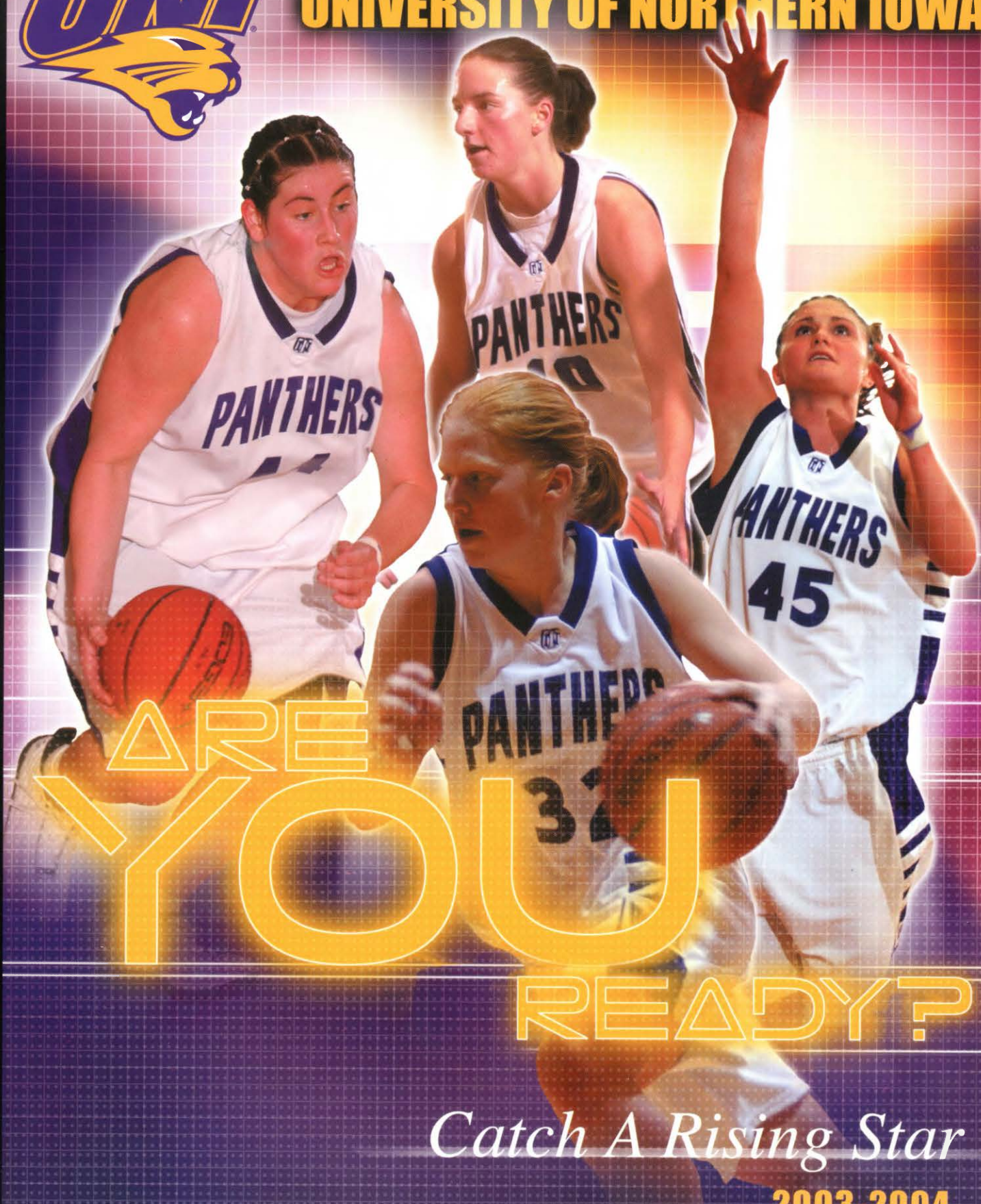

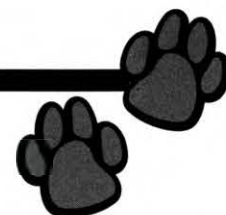

UNI will appear on MVC-TV Jan. 19 against Bradley. UNI's home opener against Iowa State is set for TV on Dec. 8. KFXA-KFXB (Fox 28&40) will carry the contest from the West Gym. The Tony DiCecco show will return this season, as well. It will air four occasions from Famous Dave's in Cedar Falls.

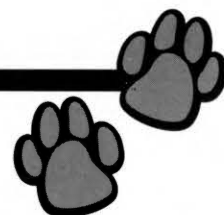

Credentials

All requests for credentials should be made at least three days in advance. Credentials are left at the ticket window. Complimentary passes will not be available to the media. Only working press will be assigned seats on Press Row. Those media representatives wishing to purchase tickets are urged to contact the UNI-Dome Ticket Office (319-273-6131).

Parking

There is no assigned media parking at the West Gym. Parking is on a first come first serve basis.

Radios

Photographers

Photo passes are limited to daily newspapers, wire services and television photographers, in addition to participating teams campus newspapers. Only accredited media are given permission for photo passes.

Practices

UNI basketball practices at home are open but it is requested you contact Director of Design and Information Management Jill Gansemer beforehand. When the team is on the road, persons wishing to watch practice the day before a game should contact Gansemer. Game-day shoot arounds are closed.

Player Interviews

Panther players will be available for interviews before practice. All interviews must be arranged through the Athletics Media Relations Office. Contact Director of Design and Information Management Jill Gansemer at 319-273-5455 to secure interviews. No interviews will be granted day of game, with the exception of post-game interviews.

Players' telephone numbers will be made available to the media. For out-of-town reporters, requests for collect-call telephone interviews may be made with Gansemer.

Head coach Tony DiCecco will be available for interviews at the weekly Press Luncheons or before practice. Requests should be made through the Athletics Media Relations Office and Jill Gansemer at 319-273-5455. Phone interviews will be granted on weekday mornings.

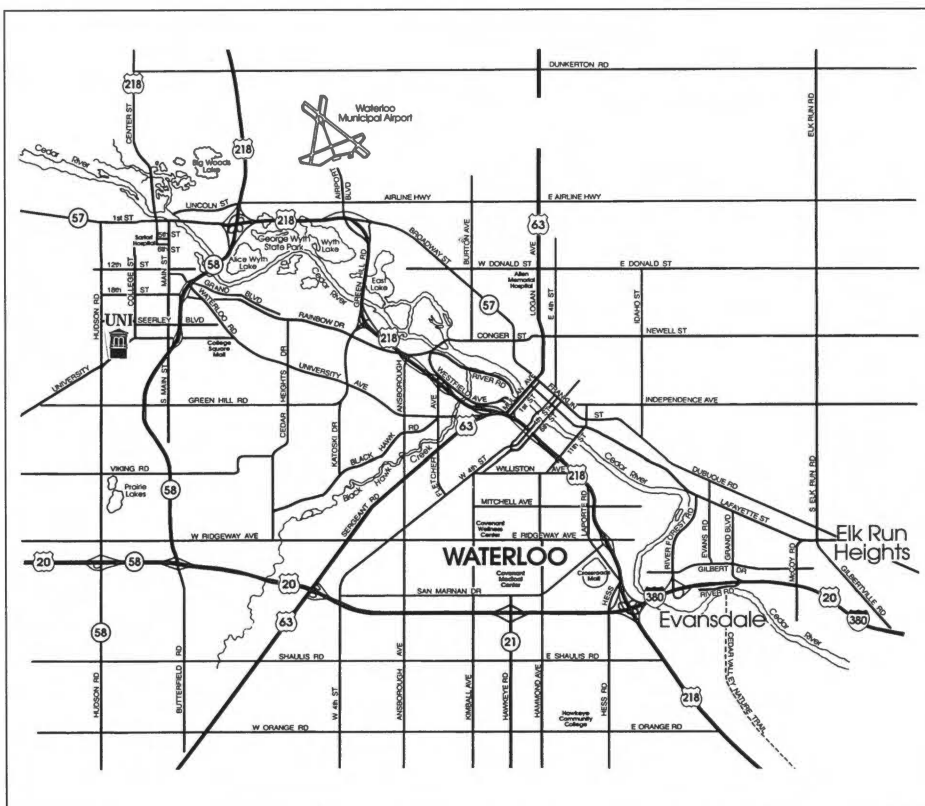

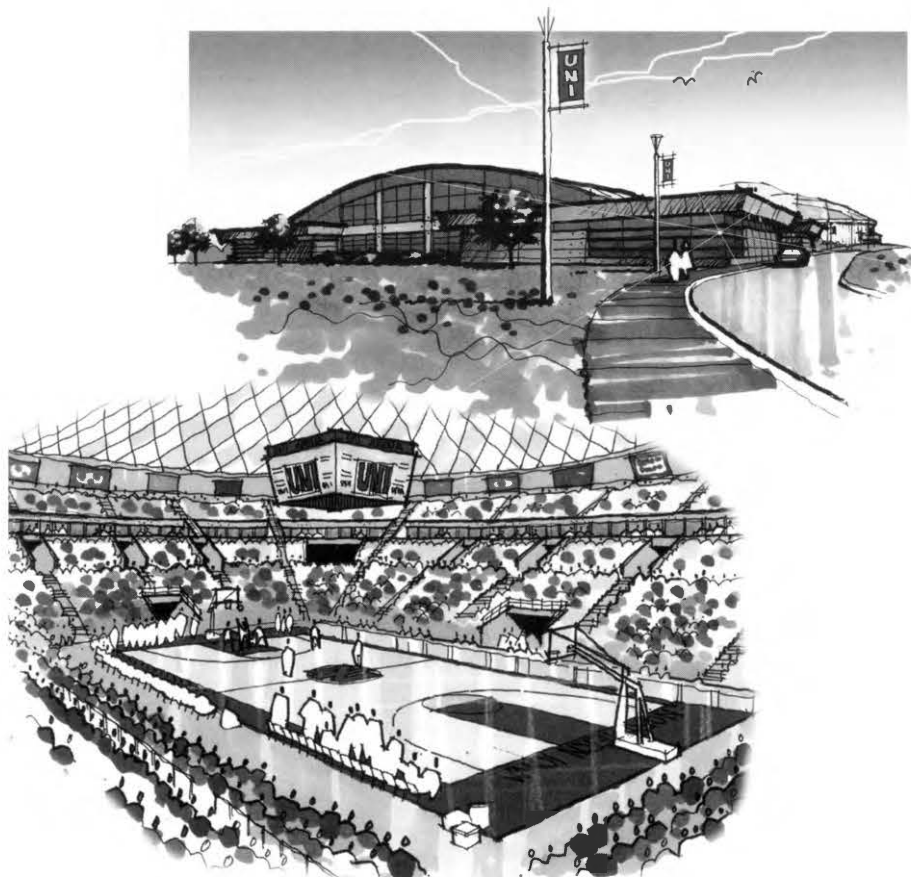

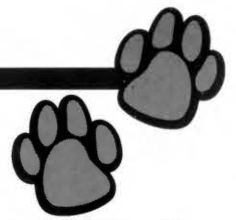

Commitment to Facilities

UNI-DOME

The facility has fixed seating for nearly 16,400 and is the current home to the Panther football, track and men's basketball teams, and is available for concerts and other major events. In 1998, the UNI-Dome became the first air-supported structure to be converted to a fixed roof.

THE OUTDOOR TRACK

UNI's outdoor track was completed in time for the Panthers to host the 1998 Missouri Valley Conference Outdoor Track and Field Championships.

WELLNESS/RECREATION CENTER

This \$18.3 million facility, attached to the north side of the UNI-Dome, opened in the fall of 1997. It features the highest climbing wall in the Midwest; two pools; a running track; weight and fitness rooms; and basketball, volleyball and racquetball courts.

THE WEST GYM

The West Gym is home to the Panthers' wrestling, women's volleyball and women's basketball teams until the McLeod Center is constructed. The facility was remodeled three years ago with a new floor, locker rooms and lower bleacher seating.

Michael Daugherty was named UNI's Strength and Conditioning Coach

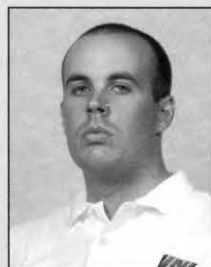
in August of 2002. At the time of his appointment, he had served as an assistant at Brigham Young University since 2000.

He's a NSCA Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist and is Collegiate Strength Coach Certified.

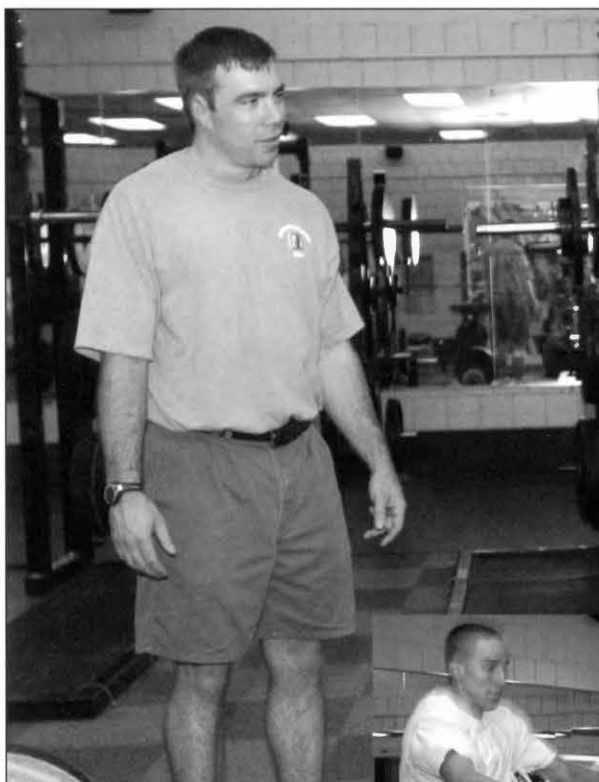


ANTHONY MOLINARI

The UNI Strength and Conditioning program is a blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete.

Throughout the year, UNI athletes can spend more time working on strength and conditioning than any other aspect of their game. During the off-season, athletes work on strength improvement, speed, power, agility and conditioning. The in-season program is devoted to continuation of strength gains and performance-related conditioning.

Throughout an athlete's first year on campus, baseline measures of strength, speed, power, agility, flexibility and endurance are collected. Measure of body composition and weight also are recorded. With this information, goals are set for development and maintenance.

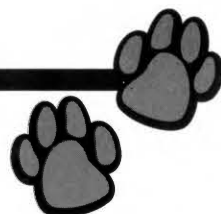

The Curris Business Building was completed in the fall of 1990. The \$10.2 million facility houses the College of Business Administration.



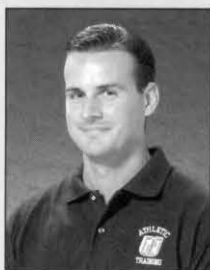
The Kamerick Art Building is home to the Department of Art and a 5,300-square-foot exhibition area in the Gallery of Art.

Sports Medicine



The UNI sports medicine program features top-rate facilities and the outstanding services of sports and health care professionals.

The sports medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Merac strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve an athlete's flexibility.

Athletic trainers and physicians work together to design rehabilitation programs for injured athletes. A wide variety of facilities and equipment, not only in the Sports Medicine Lab but in the Wellness and Recreation Center, including swimming pools, Merac equipment, Stairmasters and various exer-

cise bikes, help athletes rehabilitate injuries and minimize the loss of fitness during recuperative time.

In addition, the UNI Student-Athlete Assistance Program (SAAP) provides confidential, professional and voluntary assistance and support to student-athletes regarding personal problems that are adversely affecting their academic or athletic performance. The SAAP offers education and assistance regarding alcohol/drug problems, emotional problems, family difficulties, health/physical problems, financial and legal problems and eating disorders, among others.

Student-Athlete Assistance Program (SAAP)

The University of Northern Iowa SAAP provides confidential, professional, and voluntary assistance and support to student-athletes regarding personal problems that are adversely affecting their academic or athletic performance. Educational programs also are offered to prevent problems and promote the general well being of student-athletes. The SAAP offers education and assistance regarding alcohol/drug problems, emotional problems, family difficulties, health/physical problems, financial and legal problems and eating disorders, among others.

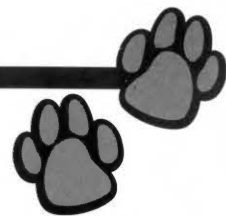
To ensure the SAAP's effectiveness and protect students' rights, the following guidelines govern the program:

*The program must protect the privacy of the student by employing strict confidentiality measures. Any details of communication between students and Core Committee members or Athletics Department personnel may not be disclosed to any source without the prior written consent of the student-athlete.

*The decision to use the program must be voluntary.

*Unless the student-athlete consents otherwise, the person making a referral to a source of assistance at a student-athlete's request may disclose only the following information: how the student was referred to SAAP, and the reason for the referral.

UNI prides itself on providing a student-centered educational experience. The University's medium size allows it to offer the faculty, facilities and academic choices of a major university, while retaining a friendly, small college atmosphere.

Employment

There are many employment opportunities off and on campus which student-athletes may take advantage of during both the academic year and in the summer. In order to retain eligibility for participation, the Athletics Department must monitor earnings.

Complimentary Admissions

The Athletics Department recognizes the efforts of student-athletes in contributing to the success of UNI's athletic teams. In accordance with NCAA policy, the student-athlete is given four complimentary admissions for each of his/her sporting events.

Panther Academic Award

A student-athlete whose name appears on the current Eligibility Report who has practiced and/or competed a majority of the season, as determined by the head coach, is eligible to receive the Panther Academic Award each semester. This award is determined by the student athletes grade-point average.





Building on a strong tradition of teacher education, the University of Northern Iowa has evolved into one of the finest comprehensive public universities in the country. UNI emphasizes excellence in undergraduate education and offers selected graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels.

UNI's heritage and philosophy place great value on providing a student-centered educational experience. The university offers a learning environment that is small enough to provide students individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources, including distinguished faculty.

Today, UNI offers more than 120 undergraduate majors. Outstanding academic programs, many of which are nationally-recognized for their excellence, have been established in the colleges of Business Administration, Education, Humanities and Fine Arts, Natural Sciences, and Social and Behavioral Sciences. In addition, UNI participates in the bachelor of liberal studies program offered by Iowa's Regent Universities and provides classes in centers around the state through the division of Continuing Education and Special Programs.

Recognized as the premier public undergraduate university in the state, UNI is experiencing an increasing demand for its high-quality programs. Enrollment at UNI was 13,926 students in the fall of 2002, only one percent away from becoming the fifth consecutive record enrollment. Students come from every county in Iowa; about 95 percent of UNI's undergraduate students are residents of Iowa.

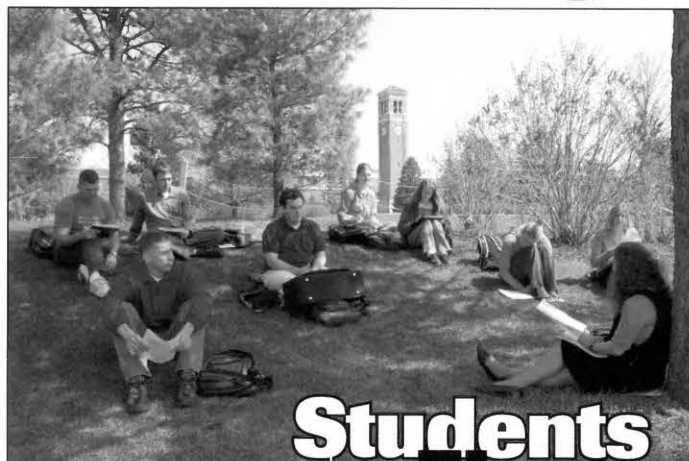

DR. ROBERT KOOB, PRESIDENT

Dr. Robert Koob is the eighth president of the University of Northern Iowa. He began his tenure in August 1995, and he is the first UNI graduate to return to his alma mater as President. He has been distinguished at UNI for his efforts to promote and strengthen relationships between the University and the citizens of Iowa, and to fully integrate the use of cutting-edge technology campus-wide. These initiatives build

on the University's strengths of providing a strong liberal arts curriculum, excellence in teaching, scholarship, and service.

As President, he has focused on implementing the University strategic plan, articulating core values and progress indicators, and setting goals for the University, which is continually cited as one of the nation's top public comprehensive universities. His efforts have also produced extraordinary campus and community growth, including the new Gallagher-Bluedorn Performing Arts Center, the Freeburg Early Childhood Program, and two new facilities, which will begin construction in 2003 --



RICK HARTZELL, DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Rick Hartzell was named Director of Athletics at UNI August 9, 1999.

In the four years since his appointment, the Panthers have celebrated outstanding performances in almost every sport. The volleyball team advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time in school history in 1999, and repeated the effort in 2001 and 2002; the wrestling team placed 11th in the NCAA

Tournament, its highest finish since 1994, and crowned its first Division I national champion in 2000 and again placed 11th this past season; while the men's track team has won both the conference indoor and outdoor titles. UNI's second-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference All-Sports Championship race in 2001-02 was its highest finish ever in this competition. Other successes can be claimed across the board. In addition, UNI's student-athletes are graduating at a rate higher than the general student body.

Hartzell has been heavily involved in several facility upgrades, including the development of the McCleod USA Center, a new arena which eventually will house the men's and women's basketball programs, and volleyball and wrestling teams. Plans also are moving forward for a Human Performance Center that will house an athletics weight room, training rooms, team rooms, locker rooms and offices. The scope of the fundraising for UNI athletics has been widened under Hartzell's direction.

He also has stressed closer departmental involvement with the student body, and a new ticket package for the University community is one result of that interaction. The Panther Pass ticket package for UNI students enhances student involvement in the athletic program. Further, Hartzell completed departmental reorganization and a renewed outreach effort to the University and Cedar Valley communities.

He is involved in numerous local organizations, including Cedar Valley's Promise, Cedar Valley United Way, Opportunity Works, Cedar Valley Economic Development Corporation, and the Waterloo Development Corporation. He also serves on numerous Trustee Boards, as he is known for his instrumental collaborating skills, strategic planning expertise, and creative ability to deal constructively with constant change. Most recently, he was honored as the Cedar Valley Business Hall of Fame recipient in recognition of his visionary skillfulness, economic development plans, volunteerism, and for his talent to build cohesive working relationships between private and public sectors.

Dr. Koob is involved in numerous state and national organizations, including the Iowa Empowerment Board, National Educational Advisory Committee, and the Commission on International Education.

He is a native of Hawarden, Iowa, received his B.A. in education from UNI in 1962, and a doctorate in chemistry from the University of Kansas in 1967. He has 16 years of classroom teaching experience ranging from high school science courses through Ph.D. level courses in physical chemistry. He and Yvonne have been married for 42 years, and they have seven grown children and 10 grandchildren.

At the press conference announcing his appointment, then UNI Vice President for Administration and Finance, John Conner, said, "Rick is a bright, articulate team-builder with a highly developed sense of the contribution intercollegiate athletics makes to the quality of the entire Northern Iowa community. He brings not only exceptional experience in athletic programming, but a strong personal relationship and loyalty to Panther athletics."

Prior to being named at UNI, Hartzell had been at Bucknell since 1988, directing a Division I program with 1-AA football consisting of 28 sports. Prior to his appointment at Bucknell, he was Director of Athletics and Chairman of Physical Education and Recreation at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County from 1985-88, directing a 19-sport program which moved from Division II to Division I during his tenure.

Prior to being named at Baltimore County, he was an Assistant Athletic Director for Football and Men's and Women's Basketball at Northwestern University from 1982-85; was an Administrative Assistant to the Director of Athletics and Assistant Baseball Coach from 1980-82 at the University of Iowa; and an instructor, assistant football coach and head baseball coach from 1977-80 at Coe College.

He recently received the All-American Football Foundation's General Robert Neyland Outstanding Athletic Director Award.

Hartzell is no stranger to UNI. He played football and baseball for the Panthers. He received his bachelor's degree in Physical Education and English from UNI in 1974, and his master's in Educational Administration in 1977.

He was a five-sport letterman at Klemme, IA, High School.

He has two children -- Nate, 22, and Amanda, 20. Hartzell's personal interests include reading, fitness, auto racing and spending time with family and friends.

"I'm very excited to be here," Hartzell said at his press conference. "It's great to be home...It's an honor and privilege for me to be back...I'm really excited about where I think we can go with this program...I think the potential of this program in both the (Missouri) Valley and the Gateway is outstanding."

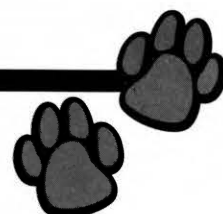

Missouri Valley Conference

The Missouri Valley Conference continues to lead by example as one of college athletics' most progressive conferences. Now in its 97th year of existence, the Missouri Valley Conference emphasizes the importance of the student-athlete and is aggressive in its approach to provide opportunities for its member institutions.

Since its inception in 1907, the Missouri Valley Conference has been regarded as a leader by its peers among today's collegiate athletic conferences.

Based in St. Louis since 1985, the league is assertive in its approach to playing host to NCAA basketball championship events, producing a revenue-producing in-house television network, bidding out the right to play host to sport championships and landing title sponsorships for those events.

During the tenure of Doug Elgin, the Valley's ninth commissioner, the league has hosted the 1993, 1998, and 1999 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Midwest Regionals, the 2001 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Final Four, and the 2002 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball First/Second Rounds. In 2004, the Missouri Valley Conference and the city of St. Louis will host an NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Regional. And in 2005 (April 2 and 4), the St. Louis Organizing Committee (SLOC), comprised of the Missouri Valley Conference, the St. Louis Sports Commission, the Convention & Visitor's Commission, and Saint Louis University, will host the jewel of the men's championship as the Men's Final Four -- the city's first since 1978 -- will be played at the Edward Jones Dome.

This past summer the SLOC was awarded two more NCAA events, giving St. Louis and the Missouri Valley Conference a total of four NCAA basketball events in the next six years -- more than any other city. In July, the NCAA announced that the city's second Women's Final Four will come to the Gateway city in 2009, while the NCAA also awarded St. Louis and The Valley a men's preliminary round event (first/second round or regional) for the years of 2007 or 2008. Counting the two recently awarded events, the Missouri Valley Conference will have hosted eight NCAA basketball events in a 12-year span, including three Final Fours, by April of 2009.

And while the Missouri Valley Conference has been progressive in pursuing NCAA events, it has continued to be a national leader in the athletic arena. The oldest conference west of the Mississippi River, the Valley has had numerous successes in its storied history, which includes a myriad of accomplishments since the turn of the century.

Last year alone, the league had a combined seven post-

season teams in men's and women's basketball, with Creighton's women's team reaching the semifinals of the WNIT. In volleyball, UNI earned its third Sweet 16 trip in the past four years; in men's soccer, Creighton secured a Final Four trip to the College Cup -- the Valley's third semifinal team in the past three years; Southwest Missouri State made its first trip to the College Baseball World Series; while Wichita State's men's golf team had the league's highest NCAA finish since 1995 and second-best since 1974.

Arguably the 2002-03 season might go down as one of the most successful in conference annals, as in addition to the aforementioned, the league had two softball teams qualify for the NCAA tournament for the first time in league history, and Southern Illinois' nationally ranked team finished one win away from the College World Series. In addition, the Valley had NCAA team qualifiers in women's golf, women's tennis, women's soccer, and men's tennis; plus countless individual qualifiers in cross country, track & field, and swimming & diving.

The 2000-01 basketball season was highlighted by a Women's Final Four appearance by Southwest Missouri State, while in 2001-02, the league produced four Sweet 16 teams, including Southern Illinois (men's basketball), UNI (volleyball), Southern Methodist (men's soccer), and Drake (women's basketball). To that end, SMS, which has won the league's All Sports Trophy in three of the past four years, joins Notre Dame, Texas, and Georgia as the only schools to play in an NCAA Men's Basketball Sweet 16, NCAA Women's Final Four and NCAA College Baseball World Series in the last five years (1999-03).

The Valley has also been cutting edge in the area of its television network. Beginning in 1993-94, the Valley took its television network in-house and began to produce, syndicate and sell a televised package of regular-season and tournament events for distribution on local broadcast and national cable networks.

Meanwhile, the league has been progressive in other areas, as it has taken its merchandise program in-house, while offering e-commerce solutions for league apparel and for tickets to the men's basketball championship.

Starting in 1995-96, the Conference broke new ground by allowing league members to bid for hosting rights to its volleyball, women's basketball, softball and baseball championships. By establishing uniform host criteria, the Conference is able to assist a host institution in a season-long promotional campaign and provide an avenue where hosts can acquire a title sponsor and achieve a profit for the event. When possible, the league supports neutral-site tournaments, as the men's basketball championship enters its 14th-straight year in St. Louis, while the women's and men's soccer championships are also in St. Louis, Mo., and the men's golf championship takes place in Silvis, Ill.

The seeds for this vision were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who met at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more schools -- Drake University and Iowa State College -- were admitted.

In the fall of 1907, basketball became the first competitive sport. Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

2003-04 Outlook

Sometimes, things don't turn out like you think. Take, for example, last year's UNI women's basketball team. Start by losing a player you had counted on to play the style you had planned — before the first game. Revamping your offense brings some success early, but also some failure.

Until suddenly, it all clicks. And for last year's Panther women's basketball squad, that clicking occurred in January, when the team won 11 of 13 games down the stretch. The Panthers finished 18-12 overall and 12-6 in the MVC and earn its second WNIT bid in three years. After adversity early, it turned into arguably the best season the team has had in the Tony DiCecco era.

So looking forward to 2003-04, what can we expect from this year's team?

"We're very excited about this year," said DiCecco, now in his ninth year as the Panthers' head coach. "Coming off what we did last year, and with what we have coming back, as well as combining with our new players, we could have a very good year. We're certainly optimistic.

With a pair of first team all-MVC players returning, a third starter from a year ago, and another player who would have started had she not been hurt, one can understand DiCecco's optimism.

"Our challenge is to develop depth to our Core Four," he said, referring to the four key veterans returning for what on the whole is a very young squad. "Depth is always the key to championship-caliber teams, and that's where we want to be, competing for a championship in March. We think we can get there."

The Core Four

Leading the way for UNI is what DiCecco proudly refers to as his "Core Four", the four linchpins in the Panthers' basketball fortunes for this season. Those four — seniors Amy Swisher and Kara Opp, as well as juniors Alex Cook and Emily Berry.

"Those four players are at the heart and soul of what we are trying to get done," DiCecco said. "They are the leaders of our team and they know what needs to be done to be successful. They've been around our program long enough to know what is expected of them and they need to be excellent leaders for our younger players."

Swisher, a first team All-Missouri Valley Conference selection a year ago, was one of only two Panthers to start all 30 games. She led the team with 518 points and enters her senior year ranked fourth in UNI history with 1,374 points. With a repeat of her junior season, Swisher could become UNI's leading career scorer by year's end, with that mark currently held by Diane Roberts (1,701 points — 1985-88).

"Amy is one of the top players in the league," said DiCecco. "She was probably the runner-up for league Player of the Year honors a year ago and was duly recognized as a first team all-MVC player. She literally carried us at times last year."

Swisher averaged 17.3 points and 6.2 rebounds a year ago, with four double-doubles. She came into her own last year as a player, literally scoring at will at times, which was never more evident than the 36-point effort she recorded against Bradley in the MVC tournament. Swisher had off-season arthroscopic knee surgery, but is expected to be back at full strength by the time the season starts.

"Amy can get her own shot when things break down, and that's a huge skill to have," said DiCecco. "She is an unbelievable competitor and great leader, and I can't underestimate the value she brings to our team."

Kara Opp is the Panthers' other senior, back healthy after missing the entire 2002-03 season with a foot injury. Opp has started 65 games in her career, and DiCecco looks forward to having her back in the rotation.

"I can describe Kara in one word: relentless," he said. "She is one of the premier defensive players in the league and takes pride in that aspect of her game. She is always assigned to the opposition's top perimeter offensive player and she looks at it as a personal challenge to shut them down."

Opp also has taken the opportunity during the off-season to work on her offensive skills, which will give the team an added dimension on the other end of the floor. But it is her ability on the defensive end that will bring excitement to the fans.

"No one will work harder than Kara on defense," said DiCecco. "When we recruited her, she was one of the best defensive players in the state as a senior, and she's continued to get better at that. You won't see anyone out-hustle her."

Perhaps the biggest jump by any player in DiCecco's time at UNI was made by junior Alex Cook. Quite simply, Cook turned in the best rebounding season by a UNI women's basketball

player ever, and "double-double" became synonymous with her name in the box score — to the tune of 17 times in 30 games last season. She averaged a double-double for the year with 11.5 points and 12.0 rebounds, setting a school record with 360 rebounds for the season, and earned first team all-MVC honors.

"Alex became one of the premier rebounders in the league last year," DiCecco explained. "She became comfortable in her role, and it was great to see it all come together for her — offense, defense and rebounding."

Cook also was an MVC All-Defensive Team pick a year ago, blocking 21 shots and recording 42 steals. But what Cook really excels at for a bigger player, and what DiCecco likes most about how she fits into the Panthers' up-tempo game, is her ability to get out and run.

"There aren't many forwards who can keep up with Alex," he said. "She is so difficult to defend, because she can get out and go, post you up, but also go out and hit the 15 foot jumper. That's a tough matchup and gives us options."

Scoring and defense are important, of course, to any team. But without flow and organization, trouble eventually comes — usually in the way of losses. That's where junior Emily Berry, the Panthers' other returning starter, comes into play. She's the coach on the floor, the one who turns the coaching staff's plan into action.

"Emily is our quarterback," DiCecco said. "She is as good as there is at getting the team where they need to be, and getting the ball to where it needs to be."

But Berry also has the ability to stretch the defense, as evidenced by her team-leading 59 three-pointers a year ago. Back off, and she'll make you pay, just as she did with six treys against Iowa State. DiCecco looks for the offensive capabilities of Berry to shine even brighter in 2003-04.



"She can really shoot the ball," DiCecco said. "She isn't afraid to put the ball up when people double down on the post, and that's what we need from her. She is such a mentally tough kid, and I really appreciate her hunger for the game of basketball."

Here is a breakdown of the rest of the Panthers' roster, position by position:

Guards

Berry is looking for a backcourt mate at shooting guard, and there is no shortage of options DiCecco has available to him. In fact, the Panthers enter fall practice with nine backcourt players that could see court time.

Chelsey Matthias, a redshirt freshman from Fairbank, Iowa, has outstanding shooting range, and spent the past year getting stronger to adjust to college basketball.

"Chelsey has big-time range on the three-pointer, 22 to 23 feet or more, and that's a dimension no one else gives us," DiCecco said. "In many ways, she reminds us of Nadine Brandt (1998-02), with her ability to stretch the defense."

Another redshirt freshman at guard competing for playing time is Alicia Irons from Boone. DiCecco likes what he's seen in her development during the off-season.

"She has made the biggest jump of any of our players between the end of last season and now," he said. "She may end up being our backup point guard, and I feel confident that she can do the job."

Sarah Larsen also returns after serving as the backup point guard to Berry a year ago. Larsen, a sophomore, averaged 2.9 points and 2.6 rebounds, and stepped in when Berry was hurt in the WNIT against Baylor with her best game of the season. A very heady ballplayer, she understands what the team is trying to get accomplished and is one of those players coaches refer to as a "gamer." However, she is suffering from a foot injury so her

status for the upcoming season is in question.

"Sarah is rehabbing right now, and that will continue into fall practice. If she is not able to return to her level of play from a year ago, we will be forced with a difficult decision on whether or not to redshirt her," DiCecco said.

Also returning for the Panthers are Amanda Faas and Rachel Kautzky. Faas saw action in 27 games ago as a reserve, averaging 1.4 points and 0.6 rebounds. Kautzky saw limited time off the bench, seeing the floor in 10 contests.

"Amanda is one of the quickest players we have," said DiCecco. "She can really defend in the open court and pressure the ball. Rachel is a very athletic player who continues to develop and get comfortable with Division I basketball."

Newcomers to the Panthers' backcourt are Jesse Biggs and Tracy Ollendieck. DiCecco likes the ability of both players, and sees both as contributors as they get accustomed to the college game.

Forwards

Although Cook and King will see the majority of minutes up front, there are several talented players backing them up. Tara King returns for her redshirt freshman season after suffering a stress fracture after four games a year ago that forced her to sit out the rest of the year. King made an impact in those four games, however, averaging 6.8 points and 4.0 rebounds in nearly 17 minutes per contest.

"Tara is a relentless player, particularly as a rebounder," DiCecco said. "She is a true complement to Alex Cook. We're also looking for ways to try and get both her and Alex on the floor at the same time. That would be a pretty tough matchup for anyone."

A new face to the Panthers front line is freshman Megan Keefe from Clear Lake, who was selected Des Moines Register State of Iowa Female Athlete of the Year. A versatile player with a good shooting touch, DiCecco sees great things in her future as a Panther.

Centers

In the post, the Panthers have three options -- all sophomores -- two of which are returning and one who transferred in.

Amy Helle saw action in 27 games off the bench a year ago as a reserve front-line player. A very strong and physical presence in the low block, she has outstanding mobility and is a very good low post defender.

Cassie Hager, at 6-7 the tallest player, saw action in 24 games with four starts a year ago. Despite averaging just 10.2 minutes, she finished second on the squad with 23 blocked shots, and is a tremendous defensive presence.

New to UNI's roster is transfer Kim Hansen, who played locally at Cedar Falls High School and her freshman year (2001-02) at UMKC, where she

was the Mid-Continent Conference Newcomer of the Year after averaging 11.0 points and 4.8 rebounds.

"We've got three very different types of players, and all three can be very effective for us," said DiCecco. "I like the options that we have at the '5', with the ability to give teams different looks."

Schedule

The Panthers will face several teams that could be ranked among the nation's top 25 in non-conference play, including Houston, Iowa and Iowa State. UNI also has a Christmas trip to Hawai'i scheduled.

"We always try to schedule the best teams we can so that we can prepare for our league," DiCecco said.

As always, the Missouri Valley Conference will be a tough league to compete in, but maybe never more so than this year, says DiCecco.

"I have never seen the league as strong as it is, in my nine years at UNI," he said. "There is strength from top to bottom, and there isn't one team in our league where you can say 'there's a victory'. Anyone can beat anyone."

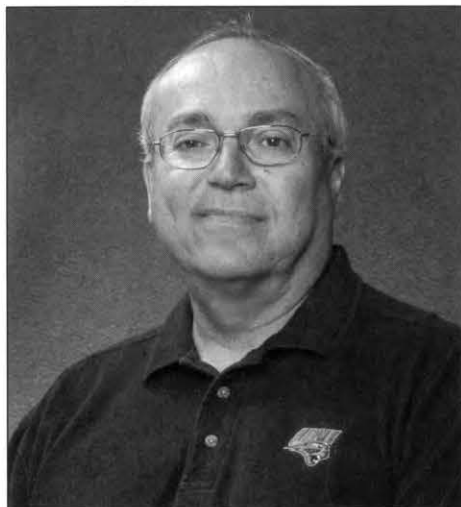
"Another huge plus for our conference is that the coaches in this league are simply outstanding. This year we've added three new quality coaches in Jane Albright (Wichita State), Amy Stephens (Drake) and Robin Pingeton (Illinois State). We are primed as a league to get multiple NCAA bids."

"Obviously, SMS is going to be one of the teams to beat, after having won the tournament championship a year ago and having all five starters back. Creighton has the two-time MVC Player of the Year. And Indiana State will have very strong guard play again."

"That said, I think we can compete with those teams. We feel good about where we are and where we can be at the end of this season."

It wasn't always this way with UNI women's basketball, having high expectations. Winning seasons. Victories over Top 25 teams. Postseason play.

Dreams of conference championships and the program's first NCAA tournament appearance are now not just pipedreams but realistic goals. Now that Tony DiCecco has firmly entrenched himself as the leader of the Panther women's basketball squad, it's hard to imagine anything but the positive attitude and winning ways that he has ingrained in his teams.

DiCecco, entering his ninth season as UNI's coach, has made his mark as the most successful women's basketball coach in University of Northern Iowa history. He has brought stability and a winning attitude to a program that had seen little of both prior to his arrival in the 1995-96 season.

The revival of the program under DiCecco in the eight previous seasons has been nothing short of remarkable. Consider that he has transformed a conference doormat that hadn't enjoyed a winning season in 14 years into a perennial conference contender. In fact, the Panthers had posted just one winning season since joining the Division I ranks in 1982-83 prior to DiCecco taking over the reins, and since then, UNI has posted five winning seasons in eight years, and the school's only two postseason tournament appearances in the WNIT.

Last year, DiCecco guided the Panthers to their second postseason appearance in two years and a third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference. Despite injuries to several key members of the squad, UNI posted an 18-12 overall mark and was 12-6 in the league, while advancing to the semifinals of the State Farm MVC Tournament. The Panthers also were one of the hottest teams in the nation down the stretch, winning 11 of 13 games from late January to early March to earn the WNIT bid.

Already the winningest women's basketball coach in

UNI history, DiCecco also posted a landmark personal victory during the 2002-03 campaign, winning his 100th game as head coach of the Panthers on Dec. 28, 2002, as UNI upset 24th-ranked Iowa State. He ended the season with a career record of 115-109, and his 115 victories in eight years are nearly as many as the three previous Panther women's basketball coaches combined over the previous 15 years of UNI's program.

UNI had put together four straight winning seasons prior to a 14-16 campaign in 2001-02. UNI tied for fourth in the Missouri Valley Conference and posted victories over traditional powers Drake, Arkansas (on the road) and Southwest Missouri State.

The 2000-01 campaign saw the Panthers defeat a pair of ranked teams (#24 Illinois and #13 SMS) and shatter single-season and single-game attendance marks, in addition to a fourth consecutive winning season.

In his first four years, DiCecco rejuvenated a struggling program that went 4-22 the season prior to his arrival to a 19-8 mark in 1998-99. Along the way, he improved the Panther victory total by at least three each season.

Perhaps his best coaching job was with a 1999-2000 squad that was besieged by injuries, yet still went 15-13 and upset Wichita State for the first MVC Tournament victory in program history.

Three years ago, UNI opened league play with six straight victories while finishing in third place, matching its best effort ever. The Panthers also reached a milestone when they qualified for the WNIT for the first time.

In addition to his success on the court, DiCecco has become a beloved figure respected and admired by his coaching peers, the UNI campus, and the entire state of Iowa. A popular and entertaining speaker, he spends countless hours travelling the state promoting women's basketball and Panther athletics while speaking to boosters, schools and businesses.

The non-stop promotion of women's basketball in the Cedar Valley by DiCecco, his assistant coaches, and players has helped shatter school attendance records three of the past five seasons. In 1998-99, the Panthers broke every attendance record possible, as they topped the 15,000 mark in total attendance. The Panthers recorded their first home sellout when they packed in 2,225 fans in the West Gym for a showdown against Iowa State. Tremendous ticket demand for the December 2000 battle vs. Iowa State forced the game to be moved across the street to the UNI-Dome, where 4,048 fans attended.

During DiCecco's tenure the team has added live radio and Internet broadcasts of all games on 1650 KCNZ-AM and the weekly Tony DiCecco Radio Show, hosted each Monday night during the season at Famous Dave's Bar-B-Que in Cedar Falls. Home crowd support has grown from an average of 267 fans per game before his arrival to a high of 1,549 in 2000-01 and has averaged more than 1,000 fans per game during the past four seasons.

DiCecco, the sixth coach in UNI's 34 completed seasons of women's basketball, also surpassed Wanda Green three seasons ago to become UNI's all-time win-

ningest coach. He has compiled a 115-109 mark in his eight seasons directing the Panther program.

At UNI, DiCecco has had 24 players named to the Missouri Valley Conference Academic All-Conference teams.

"Our number one objective is to make sure that our girls graduate. We do everything in our power to make all UNI's resources available to our student-athletes," DiCecco said.

The program's assistant coaches work closely with the academic advising staff to monitor the academic progress of all players in the program. All incoming freshmen, any player with a grade point deemed too low, and any player who wants organized study time are able to work at organized study tables to seek help.

"We feel the adjustment from high school to college academics is something kids probably need help with," he explained. "We feel it's very beneficial for all our freshmen to come in and gain an understanding about study habits. We also feel that if you prove yourself in the classroom, study table is not mandatory. However, if the grade point falls below what we feel is acceptable, then we have study table to fall back on."

DiCecco is a 1971 graduate of Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa, where he played collegiate baseball. He arrived at UNI from Creighton University, where he served as an assistant coach for six seasons. During his tenure at Creighton, the Lady Jays compiled a 122-52 record, including two regular-season Western Athletic Conference (WAC) championships, one WAC Tournament Championship and two NCAA tournament appearances. Nine players were named first-team all-conference during his time with the Lady Jays.

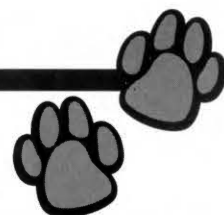
Prior to his arrival at Creighton, DiCecco was the head girls' basketball coach at Montezuma High School in Montezuma, Iowa. He compiled a 306-69 record, including eight conference, 10 sectional and two regional championships. His teams made two Iowa State Tournament appearances.

In addition, he served as the head girls softball coach from 1974-86 at Montezuma and coached at West Central High in Maynard, Iowa from 1971-73. His 1973 team finished third in the Iowa State Softball Tournament. He taught physical education and social studies at a variety of levels at both Montezuma and West Central.

DiCecco, a native of Niagara, N.Y., resides in Cedar Falls with his wife of 34 years, Kristi.

Tony DiCecco's Year-By-Year Summary at UNI

1995-96 (7-20, 6-12 MVC, 8th place)

DiCecco inherits a 4-22, last-place team and closes the season with a school-record six MVC wins. It's a difficult beginning, as UNI opens 1-12 and 2-16 before winning five of the final nine contests. UNI lands four players on the MVC All-Academic team.

1996-97 (10-16, 5-13 MVC, 9th place)

After opening 2-3, UNI picks up a 74-73 victory over in-state rival Iowa State to start a three-game winning streak and finish with a 5-3 non-conference record. UNI wins just two of its final eight games and misses the MVC Tournament by two games, but the 10 wins tie for the most in a season since 1982-83, UNI's first in Division I. Kelley Westhoff is named all-MVC honorable mention after leading the league in assists, and she also is one of six Panthers named to the league's All-Academic team. Allison Starr is named to the MVC's All-Freshman Team.

1997-98 (14-13, 8-10 MVC, 7th place)

UNI gets its first winning season since 1982-83 while winning a school-record eight conference contests. UNI opens the season 6-1 and makes the conference tournament for the second time in three years. Four players are named to the MVC's All-Academic team, and sophomore Allison Starr is named first team all-MVC and all-Defensive. Freshman Nadine Brandt is named to the league's All-Freshman Team. UNI breaks attendance records with 6,793 fans overall and an average of 618 per game.

1998-99 (19-8, 12-6 MVC, 3rd place)

The Panthers improve their victory total under DiCecco by at least three for the third time in as many years, finishing 19-8 overall and 12-6 in the Missouri Valley Conference. Junior Allison Starr repeats as first team all-MVC and all-Defensive, while sophomore Barb Bennett becomes the first player in MVC history to be named all-MVC honorable mention despite not starting a game. DiCecco finishes second in the league's Coach of the Year voting, while Nikki Spettel is named all-Academic honorable mention. In a year that six teams from the MVC make the postseason, UNI's third-place finish is inexplicably overlooked by the committee. The Panthers break every attendance record possible, including a sellout crowd of 2,225 that packed the West Gym for Iowa State. UNI's season average of 1,155 fans is nearly double the previous record of 618 fans per game set the previous year. KCNZ Radio broadcasts all 27 games live, while also adding the weekly Tony DiCecco Radio Show.

1999-2000 (15-13, 10-8 MVC, 5th place)

UNI picks up its first-ever MVC Tournament victory in a season that will be remembered for the play of Allison Starr and numerous injuries that plagued the Panthers. Starr closes her stellar career with her third consecutive all-MVC and all-Defensive selection and also is named MVC Defensive Player of the Year while setting new Panther records for points and rebounds in a season. Starr also was named to the league's All-Academic squad. Nikki Spettel joins Starr on the league's All-Defensive Team, while Katie Miller used a MVC-record 53 consecutive free throws late in the season to get named MVC Newcomer of the Year. Injuries sideline Nadine Brandt, Ky Petersen, Katie Sorrell and Abbi Schutte for the season, while starters Kary Dawson, Kara Opp and Spettel all missed portions of time, as well. Late season wins with just eight players in uniform over conference leaders Wichita State and SMS are among the year's highlights.

2000-01 (18-11, 12-6 MVC, 3rd place)

Wins over #24 Illinois and #13 Southwest Missouri State highlight a season that includes UNI's first postseason bid since joining the Division I ranks. UNI opens 5-3 against a schedule featuring six postseason teams from the previous year, including #24 Illinois on regional television that was the Panthers' first over a ranked team since 1976 and helped the Panthers garner votes in the Top 25 poll for the first time ever. With demand for UNI women's basketball tickets at an all-time high, the UNI-Iowa State game was moved across the street to the UNI-Dome, where a record 4,048 fans turned out. UNI won its league opener for the first time since 1986 en route to a 6-0 start in MVC play. A triangle-and-two defense helped limit national scoring champ Jackie Stiles to 39 points as UNI beat #13 SMS 99-80 in the West Gym, handing the Lady Bears their most lopsided loss of the year in a Final Four season. For the second straight year, UNI eliminated Wichita State in the first round of the MVC Tournament before falling in a rematch vs. SMS. The WNIT then invited UNI to its first postseason bid ever, where UNI fell at DePaul, 76-73 in overtime. Kary Dawson and Abbi Schutte were both named first team all-MVC, while Amy Swisher was picked to the All-Freshman Team. Nikki Spettel repeated her All-Defensive Team honor after amassing an amazing 47 charges during her final year. In addition, DiCecco becomes UNI's winningest coach ever and ends the year with 83 wins.

2001-02 (14-16, 9-9 MVC, 4th place)

The Panthers opened the 2001-02 campaign with an unheard of 13 consecutive games on the road. The Panthers knew they would be put to the test right from the start. The Panthers finished a week in San Juan, Puerto Rico, with a 1-2 record, defeating Central Florida and falling to Hampton and Nebraska. Heading into December, UNI posted its biggest wins of the season, 70-64 at Arkansas State and 66-63 at Arkansas. The Arkansas win marked just the 12th time in 127 games that a non-conference opponent defeated the Lady Razorbacks on their home floor. The Panthers jumped out to a good start in conference play, with a 4-1 mark. UNI posted its first ever win at Drake in an impressive 81-66 victory before an announced audience of over 4,000 fans at the Knapp Center and a regional TV audience on the Valley Game of the Week. UNI finished the first half of the conference season with a 6-3 mark. UNI would endure a six-game tailspin midway through the second half of the season, dropping it from a contender to battling for a good seed in the conference tournament. Sophomore Amy Swisher established herself as one of the top players in the Valley, earning first team all-league status after averaging 16.1 points and 7.5 rebounds.

2002-03 (18-12, 12-6 MVC, 3rd place)

Despite injuries prior to the start of the season to key players, the Panthers completed one of their most successful seasons in history. The Panthers posted a huge win in December, defeating #24 Iowa State, 65-58, for Tony DiCecco's 100th win as UNI's head coach. The Panthers also saw a pair of players, Katie Miller and Amy Swisher, top the 1,000 point barrier for their careers. Roughly halfway through the season, UNI found itself 7-7, and that's when the Panthers took off. UNI posted 11 wins over its next 13 games, including seven in a row at one point, including a 63-55 win over MVC regular-season co-champion Creighton. UNI also advanced to the semifinals of the MVC tournament for the second time, and earned its second WNIT bid in three years. Miller (17.6 ppg), Swisher (17.3 ppg) and Alex Cook (11.5 ppg, 12.0 rpg) each were named first team All-MVC for the season.

Brad Nelson is in his fourth season as an assistant coach with the UNI women's basketball program. He was promoted to recruiting coordinator in 2001-02. He serves as the team's scheduling coordinator and works with the Panther post players.

Nelson served as assistant head coach at Cedar Falls High School from 1997-99, helping the team to back-to-back Iowa State Tournament semifinal appearances. His 1998-99 team set an Iowa state record by averaging 85.9 points and finished 23-3. That squad, which contained current Panther players Amy Swisher, Emily Berry and Kim Hansen, was nationally ranked by USA Today for its first time in school history, as well. Nelson also coached another Panther freshman, Alex Cook, when she was at Cedar Falls High.

Prior to working at Cedar Falls High, Nelson served as an assistant coach at St. Ambrose University in 1995-96, where his team won regular-season and conference tournament championships while advancing to the NAIA Division II national quarterfinals.

While earning his Business Management degree from the University of Oregon, Nelson was head manager for the Ducks' men's basketball team from 1990-94. While in Eugene, he spent two years working under former Tennessee coach Jerry Green, and two years under 1981 National Coach of the Year Don Monson.

Nelson's wife, the former Jenny Sandvold, was a member of the UNI women's basketball coaching staff as a graduate assistant from 1995-97. The couple has one daughter, Bailey, and identical twin boys, Jacob and Brandon.

After a year away from basketball, Kelley Westhoff returned to the UNI bench in 2001-02 as an assistant coach. Westhoff previously was a member of DiCecco's staff as a graduate assistant coach in 1997-98 and 1998-99 before her promotion to full-time assistant in the 1999-00 campaign.

She works with all facets of team travel, budget and financial issues, NCAA compliance, UNI's summer employment program and coaches UNI's point guards. She also aids in off-campus recruiting, scouting, fund-raising and public relations events in the community.

Westhoff remains one of the great players in UNI's history. A 1997 graduate of UNI, Westhoff was a four-year letterwinner and co-captained the team her junior and senior seasons. She set five school records in her time, including assists in a game (13), season (180) and career (475). She also owns the standard for assists per game in a season (7.20) and career (4.57).

A two-time all-Academic selection in the Missouri Valley Conference, the Dubuque, Iowa, native earned All-Missouri Valley Conference Honorable Mention honors in 1996-97.

As a prep at Dubuque Wahlert High, Westhoff set school records for assists and steals and was selected to both the Iowa All-Star Team and the Iowa Select Team her senior season. She ranked second in the state in assists her senior year at Wahlert and was named to all-conference and all-Area teams.

Westhoff resides in Cedar Falls.

Allison Pohlman (Starr) is in her fourth season as a member of the Panthers' coaching staff. She is in charge of UNI's academic monitoring, summer camp operations, serves as facility liaison, coaching of UNI's 2's and 3's and coordinating film exchange. She also aids in scouting, fund-raising and public relations events in the community.

One of the best all-around players in MVC history, Pohlman competed from 1997-2000 as the centerpiece in the rejuvenation of UNI basketball under Tony DiCecco.

In 1997 as a freshman, she was named to the Missouri Valley Conference's all-Freshman team. Her final three years, she was named all-MVC first team and to the Valley's all-Defensive Team.

Pohlman arguably had the greatest single season in UNI history in 1999-00, leading the Panthers in steals and assists while setting school records for points and rebounds in a season. A runner-up to Jackie Stiles for the league's Player of the Year award, she was named the Valley's Defensive Player of the Year, as well. A mark of consistency, Pohlman reached double figures in the scoring column all but one game her senior year.

Pohlman capped her career with a school-record 96 consecutive starts, and also finished second in UNI history with 1,463 points, third with 711 rebounds, second with 274 steals, fifth with 278 assists and as the school record holder for free throws made, free throws attempted, offensive rebounds, defensive rebounds, double-doubles and steals per game.

Perhaps her most memorable game was a 25-point, 22-rebound and seven-assist effort in a win vs. Wichita State, including the game-tying lay-up at the buzzer that sent it into overtime during her senior season.

Pohlman is a native of Wellsburg, Iowa, where she was a state champion long jumper and three-time conference MVP in basketball.

She resides in Cedar Falls and is married to Kirk Pohlman.

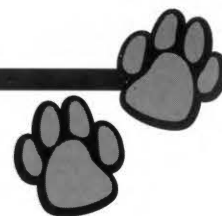

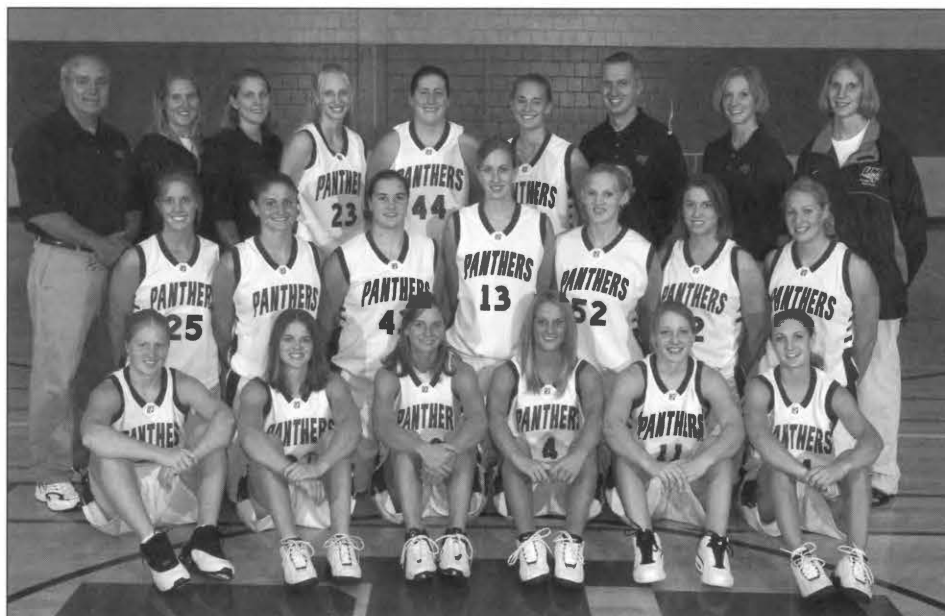

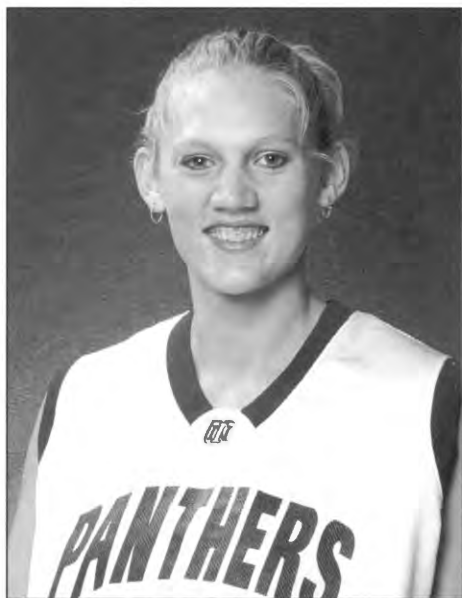

2002-03 Year-In-Review

Having to revamp your entire offense due to key injuries prior to the first tip off of the basketball season probably wouldn't bode well for most teams. Don't tell that to University of Northern Iowa women's basketball coach Tony DiCecco. Despite such obstacles, his team managed to complete one of its most successful seasons in school history, culminating in its second ever post-season tournament birth, an invitation to the 2003 Women's National Invitational Tournament.

With a well-fought 58-56 loss to Baylor in the WNIT, the Panthers finished the season at 18-12 and a third-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference with a 12-6 record. The 18 wins represented a tie for the third most in school history, while the 12 conference wins tied for the most ever by a Panther women's basketball team. UNI's third-place conference finish, which tied the 2000-01 finish, was the fifth consecutive upper division finish for DiCecco's troops.

The Panthers opened the season on the road with a thrilling come-from-behind 74-66 win at UMKC. Down by as many as 12 points midway through the second half, junior Amy Swisher set the Panther comeback in motion as she scored 18 points in the final 12 minutes of play. Continuing on the road, the Panthers met the Iowa Hawkeyes for the first time since 1983. After a loss to Iowa, UNI headed to Houston, Texas, for the Houston Cougar Invitational over Thanksgiving. Although the Panthers lost to the host Cougars, they rebounded to crush Sam Houston State 88-49. With 64 rebounds in the game, UNI came close to tying the school record (65 vs. Concordia 1/9/81).

The Panthers met #24 Iowa State in their home opener on Dec. 8 at the West Gym. In a thrilling contest that saw Panther sophomore Emily Berry light up the Cyclones from beyond the three-point line, going six-of-13, UNI scored a 65-58 win in DiCecco's 100th coaching victory. UNI continued at home with a loss to Missouri, but responded with a win against Arkansas State.

UNI concluded its first home stand of the season with a back-and-forth 69-62 loss to #12 Minnesota two days before Christmas. Although the Panthers had a three-point lead midway through the second half, and senior Katie Miller scored her 1,000th career point, the upset victory eluded UNI. After Christmas, the Panthers began a three-game road trip, winning their final non-conference tilt at Northern Illinois on Dec. 30, 67-52. The team stood at 5-4 heading into 2003 and Missouri Valley Conference play.

On the opening weekend of MVC play, the Panthers traveled to Drake and Creighton, losing both games before returning to Cedar Falls for a home stand against Illinois State, Indiana State and Bradley. In the Drake game, Swisher scored her 1,000th career point and became just the 12th player in UNI history to do so. After dealing Illinois State a 69-55 defeat, the Panthers faced Indiana State in what turned out to be one of the most important games of the season. Coming into the game red hot, the Sycamores ended

up taking a 90-88 win over the Panthers, foiling UNI's shot at a three-way tie for first place in the conference at the end of the year. A determined Panther team concluded the home stand with an 80-64 win over Bradley as part of the MVC Game of the Week, racing out to a 16-4 lead and never looking back.

After a road loss at SMS, the Panthers regrouped and defeated a very athletic Wichita State squad on the road, 78-64, improving their record to 8-8 and 3-4 in the conference. The game saw the first of two great rebounding duels as the conference's leading rebounders squared off. WSU's Angela Buckner and UNI's Alex Cook each had double-doubles as the Panthers handed the Shockers their first home loss of the season. UNI concluded the first half of the conference season with a pair of home wins over Evansville and Southern Illinois, standing at 5-4 after the first round and 10-8 overall.

The second half of the conference season opened as the Panthers headed to Illinois State and conference leader Indiana State. The Panthers posted a 71-59 win over Illinois State before running into a buzz saw at Indiana State. Against the Redbirds, Swisher tallied a career-high 15-of-19 from the field for an impressive career-high 34 points. Swisher's 15 made field goals was the most in the Valley in 2002-03. At Indiana State, the Panthers fell to the red hot-shooting Sycamores as they made 61 percent from the floor in the second half and 56 percent for the game before dropping the final game of the road trip to Bradley.

Reversing the 2001-02 trend of losing games down the stretch, the Panthers built momentum with a winning streak to end the regular season. By rattling off six straight wins, they jumped from sixth in the conference to third. Beginning the streak with an emotional 91-81 win over SMS, the Panther drive continued with a home win over Wichita State, coupled by road wins at Evansville and Southern Illinois, giving UNI a 15-10 record and 10-6 in conference play heading into the final week of the season. With the victory over Evansville, the Panthers posted their fifth consecutive non-losing conference season.

UNI returned home for games against Drake and Creighton to conclude the regular season. Six minutes into the Drake contest, UNI was dealt a serious blow as Miller went down with an ankle injury and did not return. Freshman Sarah Larsen stepped into the mix and posted a career-high 33 minutes at the point guard position. Swisher scored 26 points and the Panthers pulled out an emotional 53-50 win. Two days later, with Miller still out, the Panthers faced an even tougher challenge against co-conference leader Creighton on Senior Day.

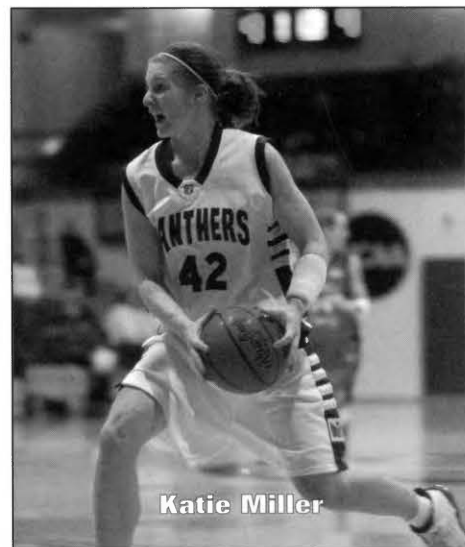
Riding on positive emotion from the Drake game, four Panthers scored in double figures as UNI overcame all odds to defeat the Bluejays in a stunning 63-55 upset. Swisher again led the way with 21 points, Cook followed with 15 and senior Katie Sorrell tallied her first career double-double in her final game at the West Gym with 13 points and a career-high 10 rebounds. With the win, the Panthers finished third in the conference alone and concluded the regular sea-

son 17-10 and 12-6 in the Valley.

The Panthers traveled to Des Moines for the 2003 State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament where they were the #3 seed and drew #6 seed Bradley. Although they started out quick, building an early six-point lead, turnovers and missed opportunities throughout the rest of the first half put UNI in a 10-point hole at halftime. That was when Swisher stepped up once again, scoring an amazing 27 points in the second half alone to lead the Panthers to a 72-62 win. Swisher was 14-of-23 from the field and a season-best five-of-nine from beyond the arc. Her 36 points marked a career high and tied for the fourth most in MVC Tournament history.

The following day, UNI faced #2 seed Indiana State and was eliminated from the tournament 83-54, finishing the season at 18-11. The Panthers were then honored with a WNIT bid and they traveled to Waco, Texas, to play Baylor. With Berry out of commission with a foot injury and unavailable for the WNIT, the Panthers again looked to Swisher to lead the way. True to form, Swisher came through with 21 points in what was a nail-biter of a game. Neither UNI nor Baylor had more than a nine-point lead the entire game, but Baylor was able to connect on a last second shot that made the difference in a 58-56 victory for the Lady Bears.

Overall, the Panther performance in 2002-03 was remarkable. With an 18-12 record for the season and 12-6 in the conference, the UNI women's basketball team continued its pattern of accomplishment both on and off the court. For the first time in school history, two different players earned MVC Player of the Week honors (Swisher and Cook) and three players earned first team all-conference honors (Swisher, Miller and Cook). In addition, Miller earned first team Verizon Academic All-District and third team Academic all-America honors. With a strong recruiting class and all but two veteran players returning, the UNI Panthers seem poised for continued success in 2003-04.
