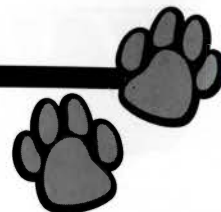

2004 Panther Outlook

If there is one word to describe the 2004 University of Northern Iowa baseball team, it would be depth. For the first time since Rick Heller arrived as the Panthers head coach in 2000, he can look up and down the lineup and smile when he sees the depth of his team.

In order to achieve the team's goal of winning the regular season Missouri Valley Conference title, Heller knew that he needed to have a deep and reliable pitching staff. The pitching, combined with a team that the coaches believe will be strong offensively with a good mix of speed and power, could make this year's squad one of UNI's best.

"We feel like all of the young pitchers that threw for us last year went out and worked hard to improve over the summer," commented Heller. "This year we could definitely go 8-to-10 deep in the bullpen. We also feel that our top four guys, whoever they may be, will give us a chance to win each night."

With 17 players returning from the 2003 squad that went 27-28 overall and 16-15 in the Valley, it is easy to say that the Panthers had a successful season. But in the eyes of the coaching staff, being able to achieve that success with the adversity they overcame was the biggest accomplishment.

"We lost so many pitchers before the season began last year, but we had a lot of young pitchers that stepped up their play at the end of the season," said Heller. "They gave us a good chance to win and a chance to have a good year. Finishing 15-6 in the league down the stretch gave us the momentum we needed."

This year is completely different from seasons past. The last few years, the Panthers had some bad luck with injuries and the draft, which in Heller's opinion held them back from having 35-to-40 wins in a season. So far this year, things are

looking bright and the team is healthy. The players who were hurt in 2003 worked really hard in the off season in the weight room and are returning.

Like many teams up north, the Panthers have to spend the first six weeks on the road, which includes 22 games. A tough schedule for most, Heller honestly believes that it helps the team in the long run.

"Historically, we have been one of the better road teams in the Valley," said Heller. "We learn how to deal with hostile environments and by the time the conference tournament comes around, our players are used to playing on the road. If we are going to have a winning season with our schedule, you have to play well on the road."

UNI's non-conference schedule is excellent with two games against Big Ten champ Minnesota, two games at Big 12 champ Nebraska and three games with Iowa. It doesn't get any easier entering into the conference schedule. The Panthers open up at Wichita State, then travel to Illinois State, which Heller believes is going to be one of the top teams in the league. They finally host Southwest Missouri State in their first home conference series Easter weekend. With all of this travel early, UNI is able to close out the regular season with two home series.

"I think it is important to have a lot of home games in April and May, because we do travel a lot early," commented Heller. "This year, it works out nicely with Evansville and Southern Illinois the last two conference series. Hopefully, we will have warm weather and have some big crowds."

Competing in one of the best leagues in the country, the Panthers are going to need to rely on their 10 seniors for leadership both on and off the field. The coaches look to Sean LaCoste to step up as one of the team's leaders. A native of Waterloo, IA, he has been a part of the UNI team since Heller's arrival in 2000.

"Sean is one of the hardest working players on our team," commented Heller. "He might not be a guy that says a lot, but he is someone the players look up to."

Bill Zenk, Spencer Black and Micah Christensen will be senior leaders on the pitching staff, while Armando Lara, Dan Grant, Joe Burgett and Nate Heath also return to help the position players.

Infield

Defensively, the Panthers' infield will be very strong this season with many options. Starting at shortstop opening day will be newcomer Jose Guzman (El Monte, CA). A junior transfer from East Los Angeles Community College, he is a very strong defender who can run the bases really well.

"A very athletic individual, Jose will bring a lot to the table," commented Heller. "Besides his

defensive skills, he can swing the bat well from the left side."

Pat Moran returns for his sophomore season after having a solid first year as a true freshman. He finished the season starting 28 games for the Panthers while hitting .273, including five doubles and two triples. The native of Rapid City, SD, spent most of 2003 playing shortstop, but is an outstanding defender at short, second and third base.

"Pat could be our starting third baseman come opening day, but it all depends on Dan Grant's injury and where he ends up in the line-up," said Heller. "His hitting has really improved over the year and we think that Pat could have a big year for us -- offensively, defensively and on the bases."

Senior Nate Heath (Temecula, CA) came to UNI last year as an outfielder, but the coaches soon moved him to second base where he made some great plays and was named honorable mention all-conference. Besides some great defensive gems, the senior also caused some problems on the bases with his speed.

"Nate injured his knee over the summer, but after rehab this fall he looks to be 100 percent after Christmas," commented Heller. "Not only is he a great defender at second, but if the situation would arise, he is also a strong outfielder."

Rounding out the infield is Sean LaCoste (Waterloo, IA). Like Heath, this senior moved from his traditional outfield position to become a second team all-conference selection at first. He finished the year with the team's third highest batting average at .316 including six home runs. The senior also broke the school record for putouts with a season-high 484.

LaCoste most likely will be starting at first but the coaching staff had him play some third base

during the fall in case he is needed.

"Wherever Sean plays he will be one of the better defensive players at his position in the league," said Heller. "I felt he was the best defensive first baseman in the Valley last year. I look for Sean to have a big year at the plate. He is swinging it as well as he ever has in the off season and we need him to be a run producer for us this season."

Coming off of the bench the Panthers also have experience to make an impact in the infield. Sophomore Andrew Farmer (Ankeny, IA) continues to improve and will be used as a utility guy, playing second, short or third.

"His offense continues to improve," says Heller. "He is a solid player who knows how to play the short game well and is a good team leader."

Senior Dan Grant (Thunder Bay, Ontario) is recovering from a torn hamstring that he re-injured this summer. As UNI's swing man, if he is healthy, Heller believes he can take the team to another level. "His rehab is going well and we are hoping he will be back to full strength by Christmas."

"If he is healthy, he brings a solid defensive player at either third or first," said Heller. "He is one of the better hitters on the team and we need him in the lineup."

Junior transfer Neal Currell (Cedar Rapids, IA) from Southeastern Community College is a big, strong hitting first baseman. The coaching staff looks for him to give some offensive pop when he is in the game. Finally, Kory Kelchen could see more playing time this year at first and in the designated hitter spot. He continues to improve and has made big strides over the summer. The coaches are very happy with the way he swung the bat in the fall.

Also seeing time in the infield will be redshirt freshman, John Winter. He had an outstanding fall in the utility role playing third, second and the

outfield before hurting his wrist in the latter part of the fall.

Coach Heller says, "By the way he played when he was healthy, he will definitely have a role on this team as a utility player. He runs well, has a strong arm and plays very hard."

David Westergaard (Sloan, IA), a transfer from Wayne State, is a solid player with a bright future at second or third while having a quick bat. Curt Bradley (Columbia, MO) had shoulder surgery after football and will redshirt.

Outfield

Despite the loss of Adam Boeve in the outfield, UNI has a great deal of depth and talent. Senior Armando Lara (San Diego, CA) put up good numbers last year with a .293 batting average with 10 doubles and four triples. He had an excellent summer and came back to UNI this fall a better player. Besides his improvement on the field, he also has worked hard in the weight room. Heller believes he will be one of the team's major run producers this year as the starting right fielder.

"I look for Armando to have an excellent year for us both offensively and defensively," said Heller. "In my opinion, if he puts up the numbers he is capable, with his speed, I think he will have the chance to continue his baseball career."

There is a battle for the starting centerfield spot. Senior Joe Burgett (Des Moines, IA) had a good year for the Panthers hitting .291 with four home runs while making some great defensive plays in center. He has some competition this year from senior Seth Moulton (Ankeny, IA). A transfer from Southeast Missouri State, Moulton is very fast and has a strong arm. In addition to his hitting, he will be a great addition to the team and will be in the mix of things. Freshman Chris Olsen (Cedar Falls, IA) looks to redshirt this year but is progressing nicely over the winter.

Redshirt freshman Ryan Norman comes into the season as the most improved player and will fit in the mix at any of the outfield spots. He has power from the left side of the plate and is a plus runner.

"Ryan has worked as hard as any player I've seen coming back from shoulder surgery," commented Heller. "The commitment that it took to get back into shape and recover from his injury is very impressive. He will definitely have a role on this year's team."

Ryan Fulton transfers to UNI from Waldorf and will see some playing time in left field as well as designated hitter. He gives the Panthers another hitter with power to mix in with all of their speed this season.

The Panthers suffered a major loss right before Christmas when Indian Hills transfer Clayton Daniels was diagnosed with Thoracic Outlet Syndrome and had to have surgery. He likely will

miss the entire season.

"Clayton was doing extremely well and would have been our clean up hitter," said Heller. "We felt he could ease the loss of Adam Boeve to the pro's and provide some much needed power. Thankfully, we have some quality depth and someone will step up and fill the spot."

Catchers

Back for his second year behind the plate is sophomore Nate Trumm (Worthington, IA). He finished his first year as a Panther with a .252 batting average. He had an outstanding fall after gaining over 15 pounds.

"He has worked extremely hard to improve his strength and is now hitting the ball with a lot more authority," said Heller. "He threw well this fall and better than any time last season."

Tyler Jefferson, a transfer from Skagit Valley, will be backing up Trumm. A hard worker and a solid catcher, he has power on the right side of the plate with a quality arm.

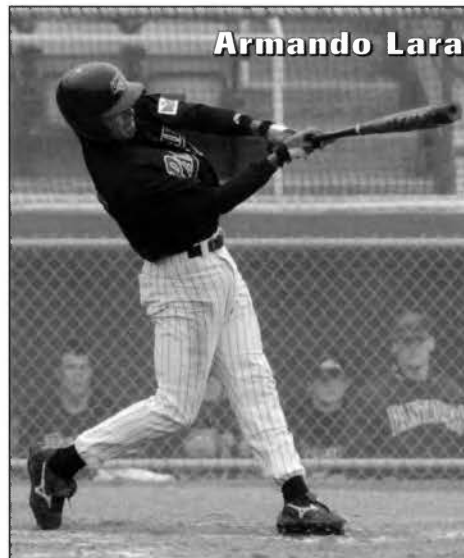
Pitching

The UNI coaches are extremely excited about this year's pitching staff and what it will be able to accomplish. Not only do they have quality pitchers but also a great deal of depth. The Panthers have a battle going on for the top four spots. If the season began in January, it looks like either senior Bill Zenk or sophomore Jake Hansen could earn the number one job.

Zenk had an outstanding fall with his velocity consistently up and had better control than at any time last year. Last year, he earned his way into the starting lineup, starting in four games. He finished the year with a 5.63 ERA and a record of 3-3 in 46.1 innings.

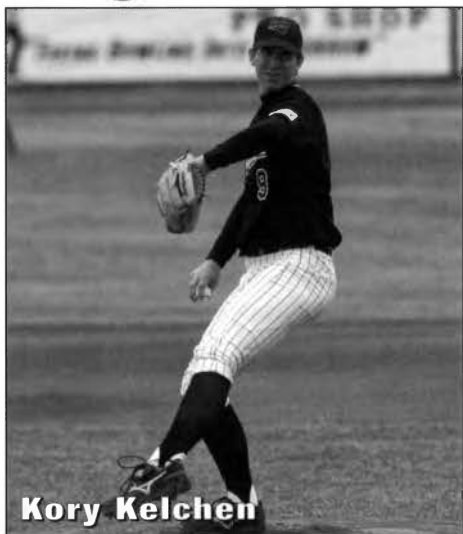
"We feel that Bill has put in the work and the time to have a good season for us," commented

Heller. "He is definitely capable of being our number one."

After pitching well as a true freshman, with 26 strikeouts in 40 innings, Hansen went out last summer and led the Northwoods League in ERA at 1.23, the second best ERA in league history. After his success, he returned to UNI with a lot of confidence and had a great fall.

"He will definitely be one of our top two pitchers with the ability to be the Friday night guy," said Heller. "We expect Jake to have a great year for us."

Junior Kory Kelchen gives the coaches a third person who has the talent and the ability to be a Friday night starter. He came back much improved and threw very well in the fall. Last year, he recorded a mark of 6-2 in 15 appearances with a 6.27 ERA.

"We look for him to be back to the way he was as a freshman," commented Heller. "He has a lot more confidence and is in better shape. He has been healthy all winter, has done a great job in the weight room and is in the best shape of his life."

The Panthers have a lot of options at the number four spot. Zach Jevne is a redshirt sophomore who had an outstanding summer. He worked hard in the weight room and his fastball was consistently 88-91 this fall with as good a change up as anyone on UNI's staff.

The UNI coaches are excited about having Spencer Black back for his senior season, knowing they have the option to use him as a starter if needed. But look for the Urbandale, IA, native to return to the bullpen as he has a quick turn around and could see a lot of innings for the Panthers. Last year, the right-handed pitcher had a 2.93 ERA in 30.2 innings and a record of 2-2 along with two saves.

"If he has the year that he is capable, he could

take us over the top," said Heller. "He has a fastball as good as anyone on the team. He has a lot of movement and can throw three pitches for strikes. We look for him to have an awesome year."

Sophomore Drew Wold continues to improve as he threw exceptionally well in the fall. He has an outstanding change up and is locating his fastball better than he ever has.

"He has matured both mentally and physically and gives us another quality left-hander out of the bullpen," said Heller.

Brett Iverson, a junior transfer from Iowa Central, will be in the mix and definitely will play a big role on this year's team. He has a low 90s fastball and a good breaking ball. Eric DeJong, a transfer from Indian Hills, has a mid-80s fastball that sinks. He also has a good breaking ball and can locate especially well. He is a knowledgeable pitcher and a strong competitor.

Southpaw Brandon Rinnan had an outstanding sophomore season at Yavapia Junior College. He has a fantastic change up and has command with three pitches. He is fighting for a weekend starter spot, otherwise, the coaches believe he will be a quality left-handed pitcher out of the pen.

Freshman Aaron Jenkins had a great senior season at Champlin Park where he threw 31.2 innings for a 0.68 ERA, including 60 strikeouts and two no-hitters. He was the Metro Player of the Year in Minneapolis.

"We are really excited about Aaron as he has a devastating curveball, better than anyone I've seen," commented Heller. "The big question will be if he will be able to locate his fastball. If he does, he will play a major role on our team."

In his second year as a closer for the Panthers, senior Micah Christensen looks to have a better season, despite knee surgery this fall.

"He had an excellent fall and his fastball was around 90 everyday and threw his curveball well," said Heller. "If he is 100 percent and healthy, he gives us a big time closer."

Josh Potthoff gives the Panthers another quality southpaw out of the bullpen. He needs to locate a little better to have a major role but has the ability to do that. He has been working hard and should be able to give us a lot of innings.

It has been a long time since Drew Kelly has been on a baseball field as he has concentrated his last three years on wrestling. He worked really hard to regain what he had and by the end of the fall, he was throwing 86-87, which is where he was as a freshman.

"A fierce competitor and whatever role he has, we know he will be the best at it he can. Just having Drew on our team makes us better because of his work ethic and toughness. I know he will help

us win games in some way," Heller said.

Joe Ryan has a lot of talent but has spent the last two years with the football team and broke his ankle before baseball started last year. He has tremendous potential and has decided to concentrate solely on baseball.

UNI has a number of true freshmen who have the ability to step into the lineup if needed. Bryan Westphal pitched well in the fall. He needs to locate his fastball a little better but has an excellent slider. Kyle Kelchen also had a good fall. He can throw a lot of strikes but needs to locate in the zone better. He has a good curveball and is working on his change up. Robert Rodriguez has a big frame and has worked hard in the weight room. His fastball is in the low to mid 80s but has an outstanding curveball. He will make a big jump in velocity over the next season and has a great concept on how to pitch. These three athletes could pitch but most likely will be saved for next season.

Cedar Falls native Justin Bolger had a great fall and is one of the hardest workers on the team and like the other freshmen, has made the adjustment to college. He will redshirt this season but the coaches are excited about his future.

Last, but definitely not least, is freshman Jeff Hille. He has tremendous upside at 6-9 and 195 pounds. He had Tommy John's surgery in April but is way ahead of schedule and in November already was throwing 83-84. Right now, the way he is working, the coaches think he could be ready sometime during the season.

"With his ability and potential, if he is ready, we plan on using him this season," commented Heller. "He has an outstanding work ethic and is another guy who has tremendous drive to be the best. We feel like he can be one of the top pitchers in the Missouri Valley someday."

Head Coach Rick Heller



Rick Heller has recorded 115 victories, in four seasons as the head coach of the UNI baseball team. During that time he has developed the program into a conference contender year in and year out.

Heller has led the Panthers to the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament the past three seasons and

during that time, three players have been honored as conference Player of the Year, including Adam Boeve in 2003.

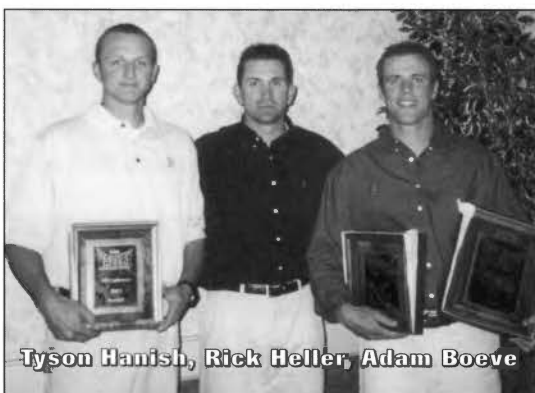
Last year, the young Panther team recorded its best conference regular season, a fourth place finish, since the 1997 season, in when it took second. It also was the school's second best season since joining the league. UNI not only finished in the top half of the MVC, but with an overall record of 27-28 and a 16-15 league mark.

In the past four years, hitting has been a big part of the Panthers' success. At the plate, UNI hit .299 with Boeve leading the way with a .368 average, second in the league and. As a team, it finished the season tied with Wichita State for the best batting average in the MVC. Once on the base path, the Panthers were among the best in stolen base, finishing with 130 which was sixth in the nation. In 2002, UNI was among the best in the nation in hitting with a .313 average, and the best in the conference. In 2001, it hit .333, best in the MVC by nearly 20 points, and 10th best average in the nation. The previous year, UNI was tied for first in the league in hitting with a .300 average.

UNI's pitching continues improved as the Panthers had a 4.62 ERA in the MVC during 2003. In 2002, pitching staff improved by over one point, finishing the season with a 5.16 ERA in 469.1 innings of work.

During Heller's time at UNI, he has seen seven players drafted by Major League Baseball, with Boeve drafted in the 12th round by the Pittsburgh Pirates last year. Heller has had 10 players playing professional ball.

In 2001, his team used a four-game sweep at Southwest Missouri State to clinch a Missouri Valley Conference Tournament bid. From there, his squad rolled off four straight wins to take the MVC Tournament title en route to the school's first ever NCAA Division I Regional bid.

In addition to the team's success, Heller helped develop Ryan Brunner and Nic Ungs into 2002 MVC Player and Pitcher of the Year, respectively. Both were drafted in the 12th round and earned all-American status.

Since taking over as head coach, Heller's teams have broken numerous school records. In 2002, four individual records were broken; in 2000, nine individual records and five team records were set; while in 2001, 16 records were set both individually and as a team.

In his first season with the Panthers, Heller led UNI to a 23-33 overall mark that included a pair of wins over nationally-ranked Creighton. In the process, he became the first UNI baseball coach since Rosco Minton in 1925 to win his first game as head coach.

Heller became just the sixth UNI baseball coach since 1926 when he was hired in September 1999. He had spent the previous 12 seasons building a nationally-ranked program as head coach at Upper Iowa University in Fayette, Iowa.

While at Upper Iowa, Heller recorded a 291-194-3 record and was named Iowa Conference Coach of the Year four times. The Peacocks won three regular-season and three Iowa Conference Tournament titles in his tenure.

"I think that Rick Heller is the best young baseball coach in the country and we want him to be a part of the Panther coaching family for a long time," commented Hartzell. "He does a great job of teaching and helping young men to grow and develop both as players and as people and his work ethic and enthusiasm for both baseball and our department are outstanding."

Heller arrived in Fayette in the fall of 1987 and quickly turned things around, earning his first Iowa Conference Coach of the Year honor in 1989. One year later, he led Upper Iowa to its first winning season in 17 years. In 1993, Heller won his first conference championship, also the first for any UIU program in 20 years, while advancing to the NCAA Division III Regionals.

Heller's team won the Iowa Conference and advanced to the NCAA Regionals again in 1995. His team finished 19th in the national rankings and he won his third Coach

of the Year honor. He repeated Coach of the Year honors again in 1996 when the Peacocks won the Iowa Conference and Central Regional to advance to the NCAA Division III College World Series. His team finished the year ranked sixth nationally and he was named NCAA Division III Central Region Coach of the Year. In the process, that 39-12 team set a school record for wins.

In 1997, his team was ranked seventh nationally in the pre-season poll and won the Iowa Conference Tournament. In 1998, his team reached as high as 10th nationally while finishing with a 38-8 record to set a school record for winning percentage. His final UIU team finished 30-15-1 and finished third in the Iowa Conference while setting five school records.

As a player at Upper Iowa from 1982-86, he was a four-year starter at shortstop and he also lettered in football and basketball.

Heller and his wife, Donna, have two daughters - Tara (23) and Alyssa (15).

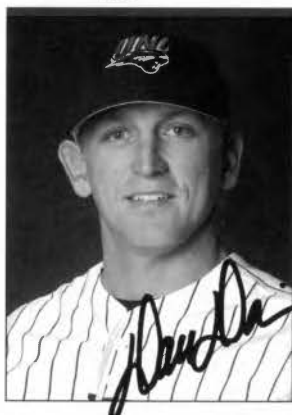

Dan Davis **ASSISTANT COACH** **PITCHING & RECRUITING**

Dan Davis returns to UNI for his fourth season as pitching coach and his third year as the recruiting coordinator.

Last year under the guidance of Davis, the Panthers had an outstanding conference season, finishing with a 4.62 ERA in the Valley. UNI also had its best regular season ERA at 5.09, the lowest since 1981 when it turned Division I. In 2002, the pitching staff lowered its ERA by nearly a point to 5.16. Before his arrival, the Panthers had a 7.96 ERA.

In 2001, Davis coached MVC Pitcher of the Year Nic Ungs and all-MVC honorable mention selection Micah Green, in addition to academic all-district pick Scott Miller.

Perhaps his most impressive work was converting Ungs, a 3-6 pitcher as a sophomore with a 7.43 ERA, into an 11-2 pitcher with a 2.48 ERA who earned second team all-America honors from Collegiate Baseball.

Davis has coached six Panther pitchers into the professional level, including two in the MLB Draft. In 2001, Ungs was drafted in the 12th round by the Florida Marlins, while last year, Josh Habel was selected by San Francisco in the 14th round.

Prior to his arrival at UNI, Davis was no stranger to the competitive Missouri

Valley Conference after coaching at Southern Illinois University for three years. At SIU, Davis earned his Master's degree while working as pitching coach, equipment supervisor and helping with fund-raising, camps and off-campus recruiting.

Davis spent four summers coaching the El Dorado Broncos in the Jayhawk League. After serving as pitching coach and first-base coach in the summers of 1997 and 1998, he served as manager and pitching coach in 1999 and 2000. His 1998 team won the National Baseball Congress World Series. Davis first joined the coaching profession at Independence Community College in 1997.

As a player, Davis spent one season at Cowley County Community College and two years at Southern Illinois, where he graduated in 1995 with a degree in Exercise Science.

Known for his ferocity and durability on the mound, he set a SIU record that still stands by throwing 118 innings in 1995, breaking a 23-year old school single-season record. He also topped the Saluki staff in strikeouts and ERA that year.

Following his collegiate experience, he continued his career in the Frontier League, playing with the Newark Bison and Kalamazoo Kodiaks.

Davis and his wife, Heather, reside in Cedar Falls.



Ryan Jacobs **ASSISTANT COACH** **CATCHERS**

Former Panther player Ryan Jacobs is in his third year on the UNI bench as a full-time assistant coach. He spent a year as a volunteer.

Jacobs' primary responsibility is to work with the Panther catchers and pitchers and help coordinate UNI's camps and winter hitting clinics. Jacobs also serves as UNI's first-base coach.

In 2002, Jacobs coached Alex Dvorsky, who was drafted in the 26th round of the Major League Baseball draft by the Anaheim Angles and was named Rookie Short Season A Topps 12-

man All-Star catcher. At UNI, he hit .330 with seven home runs and 49 RBIs. His 22 doubles led the Panthers and places him second on UNI's all-time list.

He also coached the likes of Brady Weber. In 2001, Weber hit .293 with a double, a triple and two home runs. He was clutch throughout the season, as his ninth-inning single vs. Indiana State drove in the winning runs to put UNI in the championship game of the MVC Tournament.

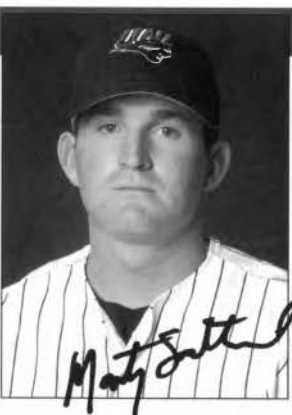
Jacobs spent one season playing at Iowa Wesleyan where his team broke school records for wins in a season. He also played one year at Kirkwood Community College in his hometown of Cedar Rapids, IA, where he was fifth in the nation in RBIs as a sophomore. Jacobs then transferred to UNI and spent two seasons as UNI's top catcher.

Jacobs hit .296 in 94 games at UNI, including 11 homers and 73 RBI. He was an all-MVC honorable mention choice as a junior when he hit .306 while helping UNI to a then school-record 32 wins and best-ever second place finish in the MVC.

In the summer of 1998, he played professionally for the Richmond (IN) Roosters in the Frontier League. Jacobs' professional career ended with a shoulder injury.

After graduation, he spent the 1999 season as the assistant coach at Cornell College in Mt. Vernon, IA. He also served as the assistant coach at Cedar Rapids Regis/Xavier High School for five seasons, which qualified for the Iowa state tournament in 1999.

He resides in Cedar Falls.



Marty Sutherland **GRADUATE ASSISTANT COACH** **OUTFIELDERS**

Marty Sutherland returns to UNI and the baseball program, but this time as an assistant coach. A 2002 graduate, he was an all-conference second baseman in 2002.

During his two seasons with the Panthers, he had a .318 batting average with 25 doubles and 29 stolen bases. He also finished his career with 64 RBIs.

As a senior, he batted .282 with seven doubles and a home run. He led the team in stolen bases with 19 while having a .942 field percentage at second.

Sutherland was a part of the 2001 team that won the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and played in the NCAA Regionals. During that season, he was named second team all-conference while hitting .349. Before coming to UNI, he spent two seasons at Kirkwood Community College.

After graduation, he spent the 2003 season as an assistant coach at Wartburg College in Waverly, IA.

Currently, he is pursuing a graduate degree in Physical Education. He is a native of Cascade, IA.

2003 Year-In-Review

When the University of Northern Iowa baseball team stepped on the field for the first time in 2003, no one, including the coaches, knew exactly what this team would bring. After losing 13 seniors from the previous season and six pitchers before the first ball was thrown, the young Panther team recorded its best conference regular season, a fourth place finish, since the 1997 season, when it took second. It also was the school's second best season since joining the league. UNI not only finished in the top half of the Missouri Valley Conference, but with an overall record of 27-28 and a 16-15 league mark.

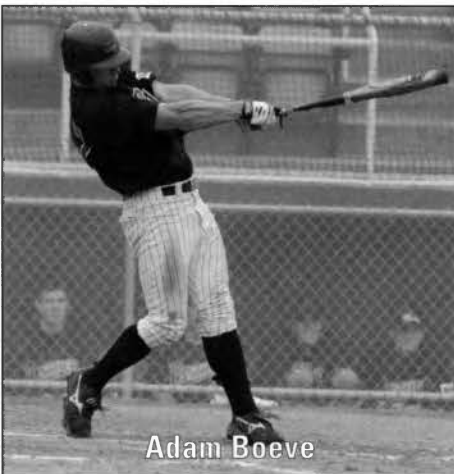
"This is a special year, because we lost so many players from the year before -- so many starters and so many pitchers getting hurt," said head coach Rick Heller. "We had a lot of guys with no experience and to finish fourth in the league and to finish with a winning record in the regular season, all of the positive things we did. I thought we played great defense all year and were one of the top hitting teams in the league."

Heller and his staff did not give up hope after beginning the season with six straight losses and dropping nine of their first 10 games in the Valley. Perseverance and dedication by the whole team is what turned things around for the Panthers.

"A lot of people had written us off after starting 0-6 and 1-9 in the conference, but it is a great lesson that if you stay positive and work hard, good things will happen," commented Heller. "This is exactly what this team did. They never quit or gave up and I am really proud of the way that they played."

With winter in strong force in Iowa at the beginning of the year, the Panthers had to hit the road in order to play in February. Before taking the field at Waterloo Riverfront Stadium, they traveled nearly 4,700 miles, either by plane, bus or vans. It wasn't easy and it wasn't always fun, but the coaches and the players knew it had to be done in order to be ready for the always tough MVC. They traveled down to #22 Texas Tech and gave the Red Raiders a run for their money. UNI took the final game of the series 10-9 after dropping two games by just one run.

It opened up the league with Southern Illinois, Wichita State and Southwest Missouri State. In its third Valley series of the year, UNI was on the road in Springfield, MO, and that is where its fate seemed to

be changing directions. It took the last two games from #1 SMS and swept Creighton in Omaha, NE. The Panthers concluded their season by going 15-6 in the next 21 league games.

The UNI bats and a strong defense were big assets in the team's transformation. The Panthers finished the year with a .299 batting average and led the MVC in conference only games with a .301 average. Adam Boeve and Tyson Hanish both stepped up their play at the plate, and were among the league's best hitters all season long. Boeve hit an unbelievable .411 in conference games with 13 of his 18 home runs against Valley foes, both leading the league. He finished the year leading the team with an overall average of .368, which also was second best in the Valley. Hanish's .359 average was fourth best in the conference.

Besides the hot bats, the Panthers also were known for their foot speed. They finished the season with 130 stolen bases in 159 attempts, only the third time in school history that a team swiped over 100 bases. The school record was set in 1987 with 151. Boeve and Hanish led UNI in this category with 29 and 26 steals, respectively. As a team, UNI not only led the Valley in stolen bases, but also had 18 more than its closest competitor, Wichita State. Every Panther that attempted to run was able to steal a base, with five players stealing more than 15.

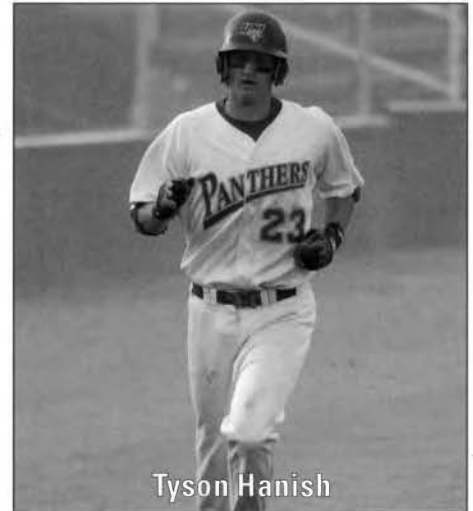
When looking at the entire season, the area that improved the most was the pitching. With the loss of so many pitchers due to injuries and only two returning from the 2002 season, this year's staff did an incredible job. Despite struggling early, the Panthers finished the season with a 5.29 ERA in 467.2 innings of work and their 4.62 ERA in conference play was the best since joining the Valley.

Chris Rosselot led the team throughout the season as UNI's number one pitcher. In only his second year at the Division I level, he threw a personal-best four complete games, including the 8-3 victory over Wichita State. Some newcomers also made a big impact on the pitching staff. True freshman Jake Hansen started out a little slow, but after some great outings, he was in the starting rotation. He ended up striking out 26 batters in just 40.1 innings. Spencer Black also did a great job in the late innings, ending with a team-low 2.93 ERA in 30.2 innings, including two saves.

"I felt that Coach Dan Davis did a great job with the young pitchers," said Heller. "They improved each time out and in the last six weeks of the season, they gave us the chance to run."

Along with UNI's best league finish in six years, Panther fans had more to cheer about. Heller earned his 400th career victory and his 100th as a Panther. Boeve and Hanish both were named first team all-MVC, with Boeve being honored as the Valley's Player of the Year. Other awards coming his way as the season concluded were being selected to the Louisville Slugger all-American second team, honorable mention all-American by Collegelnsider.com and he also earned National Player of the Week honors by Collegiate Baseball after a great weekend at Evansville.

For his accomplishments on the field, Boeve was drafted in the 12th round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the Pittsburgh Pirates. Along with Boeve, Hanish will have the opportunity to play baseball at

the next level as he signed a free agent contract with the New York Yankees.

"It was a big year for our program and we are excited that Adam Boeve and Tyson Hanish will have the chance to play professional baseball," commented Heller. "We have a lot of guys returning for this year and it is very positive going into the summer."

Sean LaCoste, Nate Heath and Brian Kobliska all were recognized by the league for their play. In his first year at first base, LaCoste was named second team all-MVC, while Heath and Kobliska were honorable mention selections at second base and designated hitter, respectively.

The Panthers continue to move in the right direction and under the helm of Heller, things look bright for the UNI baseball team. With just five players lost to graduation, UNI brings back a wealth of experience and with the addition of some of the recruits, it will set its goals high again this year.

Missouri Valley Conference

The Missouri Valley Conference continues to lead by example as one of college athletics' most progressive conferences. Now in its 97th year of existence, the Missouri Valley Conference emphasizes the importance of the student-athlete and is aggressive in its approach to provide opportunities for its member institutions.

Since its inception in 1907, the Missouri Valley Conference has been regarded as a leader by its peers among today's collegiate athletic conferences.

Based in St. Louis since 1985, the league is assertive in its approach to playing host to NCAA basketball championship events, producing a revenue-producing in-house television network, bidding out the right to play host to sport championships and landing title sponsorships for those events.

During the tenure of Doug Elgin, the Valley's ninth commissioner, the league has hosted the 1993, 1998, and 1999 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Midwest Regionals, the 2001 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Final Four, and the 2002 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball First/Second Rounds. In 2004, the Missouri Valley Conference and the city of St. Louis will host an NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Regional. And in 2005 (April 2 and 4), the St.

Louis Organizing Committee (SLOC), comprised of the Missouri Valley Conference, the St. Louis Sports Commission, the Convention & Visitor's Commission, and Saint Louis University, will host the jewel of the men's championship as the Men's Final Four -- the city's first since 1978 -- will be played at the Edward Jones Dome.

This past summer the SLOC was awarded two more NCAA events, giving St. Louis and the Missouri Valley Conference a total of four NCAA basketball events in the next six years -- more than any other city. In July, the NCAA announced that the city's second Women's Final Four will come to the Gateway city in 2009, while the NCAA also awarded St. Louis and The Valley a men's preliminary round event (first/second round or regional) for the years of 2007 or 2008. Counting the two recently awarded events, the Missouri Valley Conference will have hosted eight NCAA basketball events in a 12-year span, including three Final Fours, by April of 2009.

And while the Missouri Valley Conference has been progressive in pursuing NCAA events, it has continued to be a national leader in the athletic arena. The oldest conference west of the Mississippi River, the Valley has had numerous successes in its storied history, which includes a myriad of

accomplishments since the turn of the century.

Last year alone, the league had a combined seven post-season teams in men's and women's basketball, with Creighton's women's team reaching the semifinals of the WNIT. In volleyball, UNI earned its third Sweet 16 trip in the past four years; in men's soccer, Creighton secured a Final Four trip to the College Cup -- the Valley's third semifinal team in the past three years; Southwest Missouri State made its first trip to the College Baseball World Series; while Wichita State's men's golf team had the league's highest NCAA finish since 1995 and second-best since 1974.

Arguably the 2002-03 season might go down as one of the most successful in conference annals, as in addition to the aforementioned, the league had two softball teams qualify for the NCAA tournament for the first time in league history, and Southern Illinois' nationally ranked

team finished one win away from the College World Series. In addition, the Valley had NCAA team qualifiers in women's golf, women's tennis, women's soccer, and men's tennis; plus countless individual qualifiers in cross country, track & field, and swimming & diving.

The 2000-01 basketball season was highlighted by a Women's Final Four appearance by Southwest Missouri State, while in 2001-02, the league produced four Sweet 16 teams, including Southern Illinois (men's basketball), UNI (volleyball), Southern Methodist (men's soccer), and Drake (women's basketball). To that end, SMS, which has won the league's All Sports Trophy in three of the past four years, joins Notre Dame, Texas, and Georgia as the only schools to play in an NCAA Men's Basketball Sweet 16, NCAA Women's Final Four and NCAA College Baseball World Series in the last five years (1999-03).

The Valley has also been cutting edge in the area of its television network. Beginning in 1993-94, the Valley took its television network in-house and began to produce, syndicate and sell a televised package of regular-season and tournament events for distribution on local broadcast and national cable networks.

Meanwhile, the league has been progressive in other areas, as it has taken its merchandise program in-house, while offering e-commerce solutions for league apparel and for tickets to the men's basketball championship.

Starting in 1995-96, the Conference broke new ground by allowing league members to bid for hosting rights to its volleyball, women's basketball, softball and baseball championships. By establishing uniform host criteria, the Conference is able to assist a host institution in a season-long promotional campaign and provide an avenue where hosts can acquire a title sponsor and achieve a profit for the event. When possible, the league supports neutral-site tournaments, as the men's basketball championship enters its 14th-straight year in St. Louis, while the women's and men's soccer championships are also in St. Louis, Mo., and the men's golf championship takes place in Silvis, Ill.

The seeds for this vision were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who met at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more schools -- Drake University and Iowa State College -- were admitted.

In the fall of 1907, basketball became the first competitive sport. Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

Lawrence W. 'Mon' Whitford coached the Panthers for 37 seasons and posted 302 wins on the diamond. Whitford took his teams to three NCAA regional playoffs and at one point his Panthers won 22 league games. He was named NCAA District Five Baseball Coach of the Year in 1963 and 65 and was also named to the Helm's Hall of Fame and the North Central Conference Hall of Fame. Whitford also assisted in football and basketball for three seasons and was the head football coach for three years.

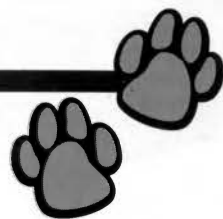

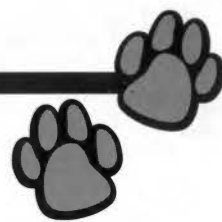

Building on a strong tradition of teacher education, the University of Northern Iowa has evolved into one of the finest comprehensive public universities in the country. UNI emphasizes excellence in undergraduate education and offers selected graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels.

UNI's heritage and philosophy place great value on providing a student-centered educational experience. The university offers a learning environment that is small enough to provide students individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources, including distinguished faculty.

Students First

Today, UNI offers more than 120 undergraduate majors. Outstanding academic programs, many of which are nationally-recognized for their excellence, have been established in the colleges of Business Administration, Education, Humanities and Fine Arts, Natural Sciences, and Social and Behavioral Sciences. In addition, UNI participates in the bachelor of liberal studies program offered by Iowa's Regent Universities and provides classes in centers around the state through the division of Continuing Education and Special Programs.

Recognized as the premier public undergraduate university in the state, UNI is experiencing an increasing demand for its high-quality programs. Enrollment at UNI was 14,070 students in the fall of 2001, the fourth consecutive year of record enrollments. Students come from every county in Iowa, 46 states and 57 countries.

The University of Northern Iowa was founded in 1876 as the Iowa State Normal School. It became Iowa State Teachers College in 1909. In 1961, the name was changed to State College of Iowa, and in 1967, the Iowa Legislature changed the status of the institution to that of a university under its present title.

FORMER PANTHER STARS SHINE IN THE PROS

The UNI baseball coaches could not be any happier for their eight former players who are playing professional baseball. Nic Ungs, Aaron McEachran, Josh Habel, Alex Dvorsky, Travis Welsch, Adam Boeve, and Tyson Hanish have extended their playing careers with hard work and dedication in hopes of taking their success to the big leagues.

"It is very exciting to be able to follow these guys in their professional careers," commented UNI head coach Rick Heller. "It is fun to be able to go onto their teams' websites and cheer them on. We are all hoping that in two to three years, we will see some of them in the big leagues."

Ungs, a native of Dyersville, IA, is one step closer to his dreams of playing with the big boys as he was moved up in the Florida Marlins' organization after tremendous success with the High-A Jupiter Hammerheads. In his 18 outings, the right-handed pitcher had the lowest ERA in the Florida State League at 1.99. In his 113.1 innings pitched, he was 8-3 with an 80/14 strikeout-to-walk ratio. He was honored as the Florida State League's Pitcher of the Week for the week of May 27-June 2 and also was selected to the East All-Star Team. He was also named the league's Pitcher of the Year for the first half of the season.

The Marlins had an eye on Ungs the entire time and on July 12 he was called up to play for the Carolina Mudcats, a Double-A team. In his first outing as a Mudcat, he started and pitched six strong innings with five strikeouts on the night. He ended up getting the loss after giving up two runs in the team's 6-1 loss. He finished the season with the Mudcats and in 58.2 innings, he had 37 strikeouts and a 3.53 ERA with a 3-4 record. Despite moving up halfway through the season, Ungs was named the Most Valuable Pitcher by the Florida State League for his play with the Hammerheads.

Another Panther pitcher who has accomplished a lot in his second season in the minor leagues is Habel. A native of Dubuque, IA, he is playing with the Hagerstown Suns, a Class A ball club of the San Francisco Giants. Part of a strong pitching staff, the southpaw earned a spot in the starting rotation on June 30. An All-Star, he finished the year with a 2.36 ERA and a 11-7 record. In 122.0 innings of work, Habel struck out 127 batters and walked just 35.



Aaron McEachran

McEachran, a native of St. Louis Park, MN, is in his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays, a High-A club for the Toronto Blue Jays. Things looked bright as the season began, but a wrist injury suffered early on kept him out of the lineup. After returning to the lineup, he spent most of his time behind the plate. He finished the year hitting .231 with nine doubles and two home runs in 61 games played.

A member of the 2002 Panther squad, Dvorsky is doing something that little kids only dream of — playing professional baseball in his hometown. A native of Marion, IA, he was drafted by the Anaheim Angels and in his second year with the club, he is playing for the Cedar Rapids Kernels. With family and friends in the stands almost every night, Dvorsky played in 96 games, but playing behind one of the Angels' top prospects, he has not been able to catch as much, starting in just 38. When given the opportunity to step up to bat, he has shown his power with 10 doubles, three triples, and seven home runs. He finished with a .252 batting average, including 36 runs batted in.

A 2002 draftee, Welsch was in his second year in the Chicago Cubs organization when he was traded to the Colorado Rockies on July 17. A native of Muscatine, IA, he struggled a little at-bat last season with the Lansing Lugnuts, not seeing much time at the plate. He broke his thumb at the beginning of the year and after sitting out for seven weeks, started to play with the Mesa Cubs. While playing with the Asheville Tourist, a Single-A team, he hit .233 with two doubles, a triple and eight RBIs in 20 games.

The Pittsburgh Pirates in the 12th round drafted the 2003 Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year, Boeve. After some tough decisions, the Doone, IA, native decided to surpass his senior season when signing in early July. From the

first day he stepped on the field in a Williamsport Crosscutters' uniform, he showed the fans that he was ready to play. In a Single-A short season league, Boeve was a part of the William Penn League championship team. In 39 games, he hit .250 with nine doubles, a triple, three home runs and 16 RBIs.



Tyson Hanish

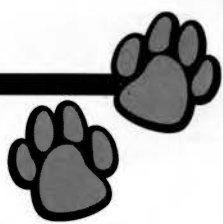
Hanish's road to the minor leagues was a little more challenging. With the Panthers' season over, he headed back home to McKinney, TX, waiting to hear his name called in the draft. When he was not selected, he was on a mission to find a team that would give him the opportunity to play. The New York Yankees were surprised that with his senior season numbers he was not drafted and in no time at all, he was down in Tampa, FL, training with the team. Impressing the scouts, he now is playing with the Staten Island Yankees (Single-A short season), in the same league as former teammate Boeve. With the Statue of Liberty out left-centerfield, Hanish is playing in one of the newest parks in the New York-Penn League. Struggling early, he was used primarily off the bench, but saw playing time after a teammates injury. He batted .136 before an injury of his own sidelined him for the rest of the season.

Nothing is impossible as these eight players and everyone who steps on the field in the Purple and Gold could follow in the footsteps of former Panthers Steve Dreyer, Duane Josephson, Scott Sobkowiak and Eddie Watt, and make it to the big show.

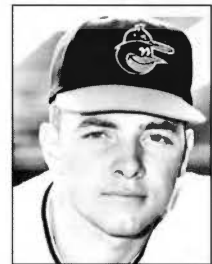

RICK HARTZELL **DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS**

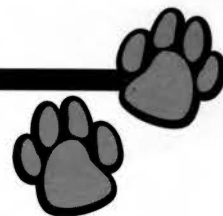
Rick Hartzell was named Director of Athletics at UNI August 9, 1999.

In the four years since his appointment, the Panthers have celebrated outstanding perform-

ances in almost every sport. The volleyball team advanced to the NCAA Sweet Sixteen for the first time in school history in 1999, and repeated the effort in 2001 and 2002; the wrestling team placed 11th in the NCAA Tournament, its highest finish since 1994, and crowned its first Division I national champion in 2000 and again placed 11th in 2003; while the men's track team has won both the conference indoor and outdoor titles. UNI's second-place finish in the Missouri Valley Conference All-Sports Championship race in 2001-02 was its highest finish ever in this competition. Other successes can be claimed across the board. In addition, UNI's student-athletes are graduating at a rate higher than the general student body.

Hartzell has been heavily involved in several facility upgrades, including the development of the McLeod Center, a new arena which eventually will house the men's and women's basketball programs, and volleyball and wrestling teams. Plans also are moving forward for a Human Performance Center that will house an athletics weight room, training rooms, team rooms, locker rooms and offices. The scope of the fundraising for UNI athletics has been widened under Hartzell's direction.

He also has stressed closer departmental involvement with the student body, and a new ticket package for the University community is one result of that interaction. The Panther Pass ticket package for UNI students enhances student involvement in the athletic program. Further, Hartzell completed departmental



reorganization and a renewed outreach effort to the University and Cedar Valley communities.

Prior to being named at UNI, Hartzell had been at Bucknell since 1988, directing a Division I program with 1-AA football consisting of 28 sports. Prior to his appointment at Bucknell, he was Director of Athletics and Chairman of Physical Education and Recreation at the University of Maryland-Baltimore County from 1985-88, directing a 19-sport program which moved from Division II to Division I during his tenure.

Prior to being named at Baltimore County, he was an Assistant Athletic Director for Football and Men's and Women's Basketball at Northwestern University from 1982-85; was an Administrative Assistant to the Director of Athletics and Assistant Baseball Coach from 1980-82 at the University of Iowa; and an instructor, assistant football coach and head baseball coach from 1977-80 at Coe College.

He recently received the All-American Football Foundation's General Robert Neyland Outstanding Athletic Director Award.

Hartzell is no stranger to UNI. He played football and baseball for the Panthers. He received his bachelor's degree in Physical Education and English from UNI in 1974, and his master's in Educational Administration in 1977.

He was a five-sport letterman at Klemme, IA, High School. He has two children -- Nate, 22, and Amanda, 20.



COLLEEN HEIMSTEAD **COMPLIANCE/ LIFE SKILLS COORDINATOR**

Colleen Heimstead is in her fourth year of her current position after serving as an assistant women's basketball coach for eight years prior to moving out of coaching. Koob was a senior vice president and vice president for academic affairs at California Poly-San Luis Obispo, Calif., from 1990-1995. Prior to his position at Cal Poly, he served as vice president of academic affairs at North Dakota State from 1985-90 and spent 1987-88 as interim president.

At Cal Poly, Koob was director and chair of the Cal Poly Foundation and served on a number of CSU system committees, including the CSU Commission on Telecommunications Infrastructure.

He began his teaching career at North Dakota State in 1967 as an assistant professor of chemistry. He served NDSU in several capacities before assuming the vice presidency, including chair of the chemistry department for six years and acting chair of the department of chemistry, as well as serving as dean of the College of Science and Mathematics from 1981-84.

Justin Sell was named Operations Manager/Athletic Facilities at the University of Northern Iowa on May 3, 1999.

He was promoted to Assistant Athletics Director/Operations in December of 2000 and further advanced to Associate Athletics Director/Internal Operations in August of 2002. In addition to overseeing facility scheduling, game management, ticket operations, summer camps, concessions/catering, strength and conditioning and the equipment room, Sell administers the Athletics Department Human Resources, manages 10 sport programs, and develops NCAA, Missouri Valley Conference and Gateway Football Conference Championship bids. Sell is a leading voice in encouraging the development of the UNI West Campus Master Plan which includes a 6,500-seat McLeod Basketball Arena, a Human Performance Center, a soccer field development and a softball field complex. Waterloo Riverfront Stadium

WATERLOO RIVERFRONT STADIUM

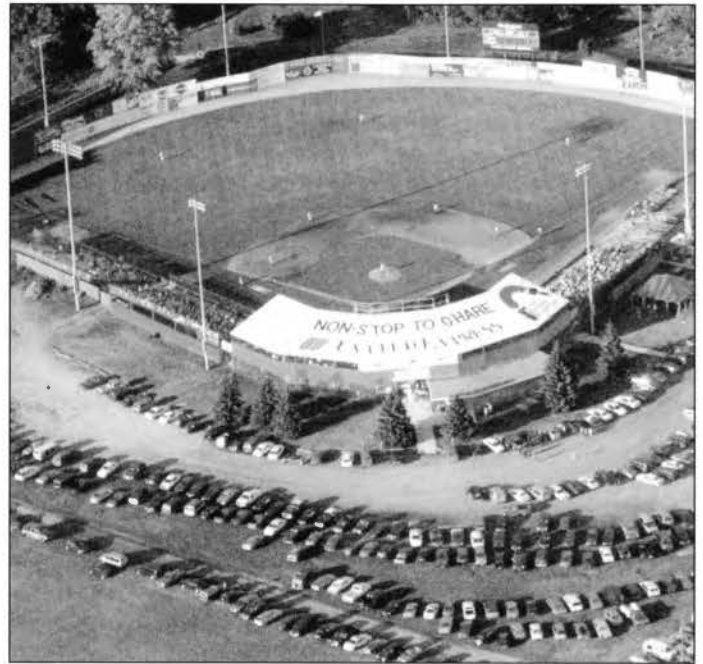
The Panthers have played all their home games at Waterloo Riverfront Stadium since 1993. A 10-minute drive from the UNI campus, Riverfront was built in 1948 for the Class A Chicago White Sox affiliate, the Waterloo White Hawks. The facility has also housed affiliates of the Cincinnati Reds, Boston Red Sox, Cleveland Indians and San Diego Padres.

Seating capacity is 4,277, with distances to the double-decked outfield fence measuring 335 down the left- and rightfield lines, 360 in the power alleys and 380 to centerfield.

Recent improvements include a new lighting system, major renovations to the field and press box and remodeling of the grandstands and clubhouses.

The press box provides ample seating for newspapers and radio stations, in addition to a deck to accommodate television.

The facility also serves as the home to the Waterloo Bucks, a member of the Northwoods League. The Bucks were 1999, 2000, 2001 and 2002 South Division champions and have featured current and past Panther players such as Scott Schirmer, Ben Fjelland, Luke Sabers, Scott Brickman, Ryan Jacobs, David Parra, Todd Rima, Kevin Sawatzky, Nic Unga, Ryan Brunner, Josh Habell and Gabe Wycoff. Current UNI player Adam Boeve and Sean LaCoste were a member of last season's Bucks squad.



The UNI-Dome is the Panthers home during the winter and early spring season.

DIRECTIONS TO WATERLOO RIVERFRONT STADIUM

From Cedar Falls: Follow Hudson Road, the street that runs north and south along the UNI-Dome, north to First Street.

At First Street, turn right, and take that street out of town. First Street turns into Highway 218. Exit 218 on Ansborough and turn left.

At the second stoplight, turn left on to Conger Street. Go to the stop sign, and turn right onto Burton Avenue.

The stadium will be on your left.

From Waterloo: Follow Highway 20 to 380/218 North. Take 218 North to the Downtown turnoff. At Fourth Street, turn right, and continue through downtown Waterloo to Franklin Street.

On Franklin, which turns into Broadway, turn left and continue until Park Road. There will be a Kentucky Fried Chicken on your right.

At the stoplight, turn left on Park Rd. Follow Park Rd. for about one-half to three-quarters of a mile, going past the cemetery. The stadium will be on your right.

UNI Players of the Year

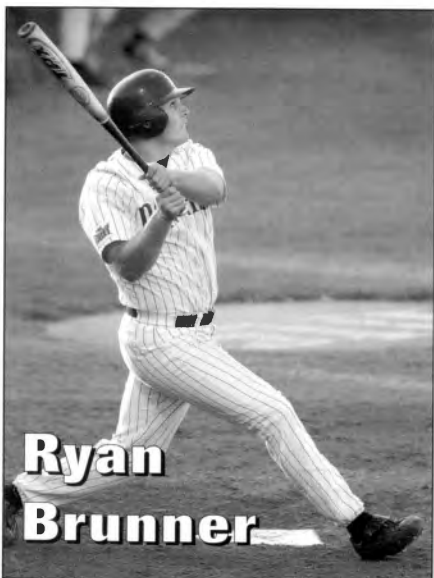


Since the Panthers joined the Missouri Valley in 1992, they have had 51 players selected to an all-conference team. Four have received the highest individual honor. Brian Jergenson, Ryan Brunner, and Adam Boeve all were named the Player of the Year, while Nic Ungs earned Pitcher of the Year honors.



Brian Jergenson was the first UNI player ever to win the league's player of the year award during his senior season in 1997. The LaCrescent, MN native enjoyed one of the finest seasons ever for a UNI baseball player as he racked up four single-season school records in addition to becoming the school's all-time hit leader with 208. On the season, Jergenson batted .374

with 14 home runs, 12 doubles and a school-record 66 runs batted in. He also set season records with 434 putouts, 473 total chances and 40 double plays. Jergenson was selected in the 25th round by the San Diego Padres.

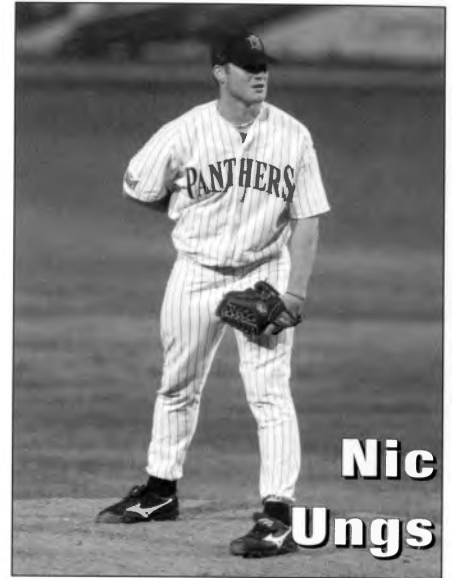


Ryan Brunner was a well-deserving recipient for conference Player of the Year in 2001. Brunner rewrote the UNI record books as he set new marks for games, at-bats, hits, runs, runs batted in, homers and total bases. He also was the first player in UNI history with 50 homers and 50 doubles in a career and was named all-America first team and all-regional.

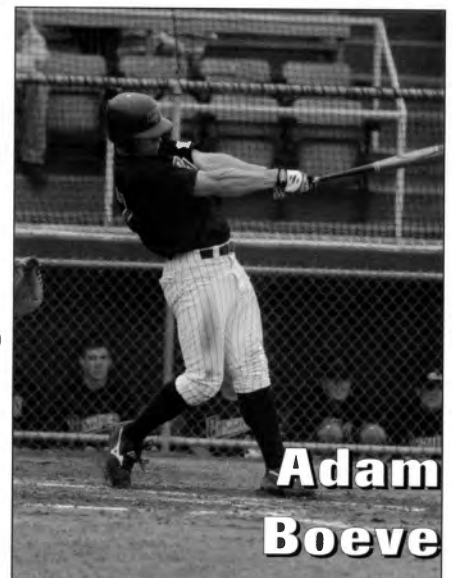
Brunner followed teammate Nic Ungs as he was drafted as the 363rd overall pick by the Florida Marlins.

Nic Ungs had a stellar junior year that earned him second team all-American status and UNI's first MVC Pitcher of the Year. Ungs used a 2.48 ERA en-route to an 11-2 record. He led the MVC in wins and innings pitched and ranked among the leaders in strikeouts and ERA. Ungs also smashed UNI single-season marks for wins, strikeouts and innings pitched. Ungs was

drafted one spot ahead of teammate Ryan Brunner as the 362nd overall pick in the draft by the Boston Red Sox.



Adam Boeve became the third Panther to earn conference Player of the Year honors during the 2003 season. In his junior campaign, Boeve led the league in runs scored (63), home runs (17) and total bases (154). Boeve also ranked among the MVC leaders for hits (third-77), runs batted in (second-68), batting average (second-.379) and stolen bases (second-28). He was picked up by the Pittsburgh Pirates as the 345th overall pick.

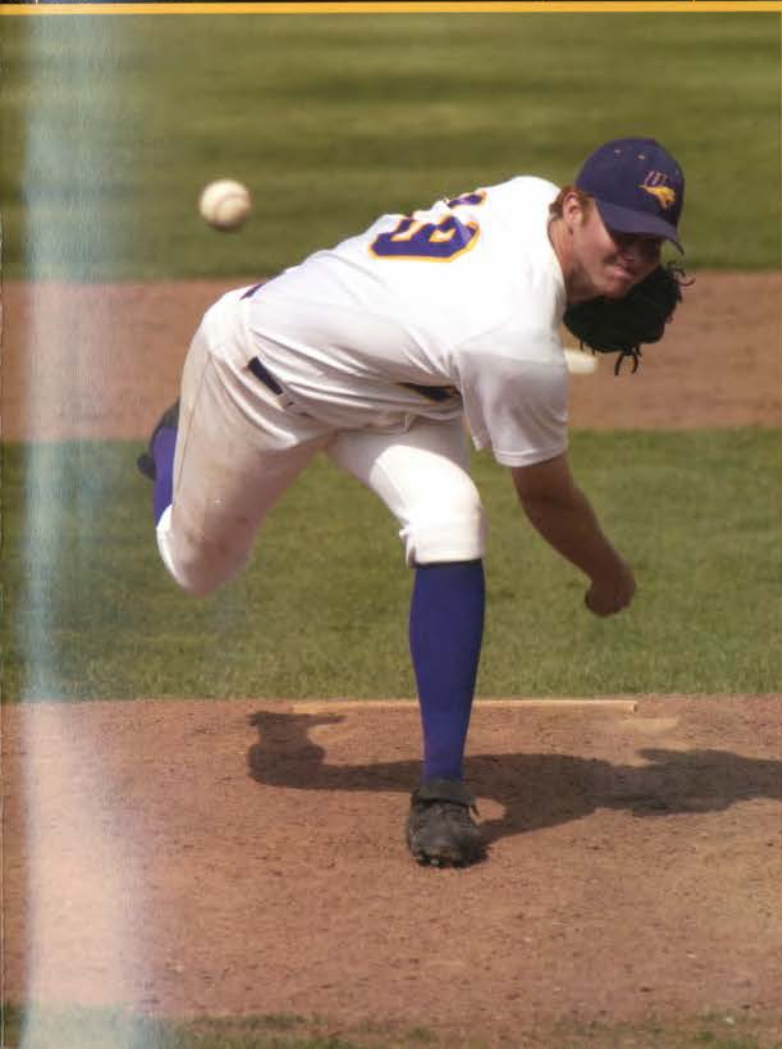
