Dr. Williams maintains a hiah frequency of performing in classical, jazz, and new music settings and has performed with artists and ensembles such as the Memphis Symphony, Arkansas Symphony, Waterloo-Cedar Falls Symphony, Orchestra Iowa, Dubuque Symphony, Memphis Jazz Orchestra, Jazz Orchestra of the Delta, Ray Charles Orchestra, Dirty Dozen Brass Band, Natalie Cole, Jimmy Dorsey Tribute Orchestra, Benny Goodman Orchestra, Slide Hampton, Peter Erskine, Natalie Cole, Rufus Reid, Jeff Coffin, and Clark Terry. Williams recently performed for the second time as lead trombonist on the Mike Waldrop Big Band's 2017 release; "Origins."
