Western Wrestling Conference

Western Wrestling Conference Enters Its Third Season Of Existence

The Western Wrestling Conference, an NCAA Division I wrestling-only alliance, will begin its third season of competition 2008-09.

The WWC sent 20 wrestlers to the 2008 NCAA Wrestling Championships in St. Louis and saw the league's first All-American crowned when the University of Northern Iowa's Moza Fay captured fifth-place honors in the 165-pound weight class.

The 2008 NCAA West Regional served as the conference tournament for the second straight season. The tournament was held at the Bison Sports Arena on the campus of North Dakota State. UNI was crowned the team champion, while Air Force head coach Joel Sharratt was named the league's Coach of the Year. The goal of the league is to replace the West Regional with the conference tournament, which would then serve as the NCAA qualifier.

The WWC enjoyed plenty of success in its inaugural year of competition, which included sending 19 wrestlers to the 2007 NCAA Wrestling Championships. The first WWC tournament took place under the title of NCAA West Regional on March 3 in the McLeod Center on UNI's campus.

The 2009 NCAA West Regional/Western

Wrestling Conference tournament will be hosted by the University of Northern Colorado and will take place in Butler-Hancock Hall.

The 2007 West Regional served as the first national qualifier for three schools making the move from Division II to Division I. North Dakota State, South Dakota State and Northern Colorado all sent wrestlers to the NCAA Championships for the first time since reclassifying to Division I. Utah Valley State is also a reclassifying institution but will not be eligible for the postseason until the 2009-2010 season.

With league members spread out over six states and two time zones, schools will only be required to compete against four league schools in dual action to be eligible for the regular season conference championship. Schools will be encouraged to schedule as many conference schools as possible.

The WWC recognizes student-athletes on both a weekly and full-season basis. Individual awards include Wrestler of the Week; All-Conference teams; an Academic All-Conference team; and Wrestler, Newcomer and Coach of the Year awards. The league also crowns a team champion following the conclusion of the regular season conference

competition and the postseason tournament.

The governance of the Western Wrestling Conference will remain primarily with the member institutions. Scheduling of contests, assignment of officials and certain media relations functions will remain with member institutions.

One of the major benefits of having a league spread out so far is the added exposure – both in terms of media and recruiting – in new destinations. The conference affiliation is also expected to generate much interest within the seven schools' substantial alumni base, which numbers nearly 800,000 combined.

Charter members of the Western Wrestling Conference include: the United States Air Force Academy, North Dakota State University, the University of Northern Colorado, the University of Northern Iowa, South Dakota State University, Utah Valley University and the University of Wyoming.

Benjamin Allen
University President

Benjamin J. Allen was named the ninth president of the University of Northern Iowa on April 28, 2006, and assumed his duties on June 5, 2006. He

received his doctorate and master's degree in economics from the University of Illinois and his bachelor's of science degree in business economics from Indiana University.

President Allen was the vice president for academic affairs and provost at Iowa State University and was responsible to the president for all aspects of the academic programs at Iowa State.

Before joining the faculty at Iowa State University in 1979, he taught at Washington State University and was a Brookings Economics Policy Fellow in the Office of Transportation Regulatory Policy, U.S. Department of Transportation. He served as chairman of the Department of

Transportation and Logistics at Iowa State from 1984 to 1988. In 1988 he was named the first University Distinguished Professor in Business at Iowa State University.

From 1988 to 1990 he served as director of the Midwest Transportation Center, a research consortium consisting of Iowa State University and The University of Iowa.

He was the Visiting McKinley Professor of Economics and Public Utilities at the University of Illinois during the 1986-87 academic year and also held the Oren Harris Chair in Transportation at the University of Arkansas during the 1990-91 academic year.

He served as dean of the Iowa State University College of Business from 1995 to 2000 and in 2001-2002 he served as interim vice president for external affairs, and in 2002 he served as Provost in the interim. From 2003 to 2006, President Allen served, in full appointment, as the vice president for external affairs and provost, until joining the University of Northern Iowa. President Allen also has been a consultant for various private corporations and public agencies.

In 2007, President Allen was appointed by

two state-college associations (the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and the National Association of State Universities and Land-Grant Colleges) to the Presidential Advisory Committee for the National Commission of University Accountability.

Troy Dannen
UNI Director of Athletics

Troy Dannen was named the University of Northern Iowa's Director of Athletics on May 29, 2008. He became the school's fifth director of athletics since UNI

turned Division I in 1980.

It's a homecoming for Dannen, who attended UNI as an undergraduate in the 1980s. Although he's been off campus in a professional capacity for nearly 20 years, he has maintained close ties to the school.

Because of his passion to see UNI athletics continue to achieve the success it has had in recent years – and his desire to take the program to even greater heights – Dannen chose to leave his previous position as Executive Director of the Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union to lead the Panther athletic program. As he said on the day of his hiring, it took this unique opportunity to take him away from a job he enjoyed so much.

"I've had an opportunity to have two dream jobs," Dannen said. "I've enjoyed a dream job at the Athletic Union. It's one of the best jobs in the country. When the Athletic Union hired me six years ago to be their Executive Director, I was asked if there was any place I'd rather be. I told them, 'Well, some day, I'd like to go back to Northern Iowa'. Because that is THE dream job for me ... every personal and professional success in my life has its roots at Northern Iowa.

"It was never my dream to be an athletic director," Dannen said. "It was my dream to be the athletic director at Northern Iowa. There's no place I'd rather be. I'm out of dream jobs. I'm here for a good long time."

Dannen believes that Panther athletic department

should value excellence in all endeavors, with its primary objective being personal development and growth of its student-athletes.

Dannen believes in achieving that objective by focusing on the core educational mission of the University and ensuring the department acts with integrity and in a fiscally responsible manner. Through this, Panther athletics can continue to thrive, and achieve greater levels of success both on and off the course.

For the past six years, Dannen has served as Executive Director of the Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union (IGHSAU). As the governing body for high school sports in the state of Iowa, the IGHSAU oversees nearly 400 schools and more than 70,000 students, in the 11 sports offered by the Union.

Dannen has served in various capacities at the IGHSAU over the past 18 years, including serving nine years (1993-2002) as associate executive director. After taking over as executive director in 2002, Dannen formulated the first strategic plan in the Union's 82-year history, and that has led to some remarkable achievements the past half dozen years.

Dannen oversaw a 40 percent growth in the Union's budget on his watch, all the while operating the IGHSAU in the black, which has allowed for the establishment of a significant reserve fund. Sponsorship agreements have soared to new heights over the past six years, as Dannen has spearheaded expanding the Union's existing deals and developing landmark new corporate sponsors.

He was responsible for developing a new statewide, multi-media rights agreement for the IGHSAU. This new agreement – which includes radio, television and online audio and video streaming of IGHSAU state championship events – not only increased the exposure of girls' high school sports around the state, but also more than doubled the annual rights fees the IGHSAU was receiving previously from its radio and TV agreement.

The increased media exposure had a direct impact on the turnstiles at girls' high school athletic

events, helping spur the interest in girls sports to its highest levels. Softball, volleyball, track and field and five-player basketball have each set all-time attendance records at various state championship events in recent years, including the basketball tournament drawing 80,000 spectators over the six-day event.

Dannen also has been a strong advocate of recognizing academic achievement, creating several new scholarship programs. He also developed an IGHSAU academic award program that recognizes as many as 3,000 Iowa high school students each year who achieve at higher levels in the classroom while participating in sports.

With all those accomplishments, it is not surprising that the Des Moines Register listed him fourth in their 2005 ranking of the most powerful Iowans in Sports. He has received numerous honors and awards over the years, including the Pursuing Victory with Honor Award from the Iowa Institute of Character Development in 2005, and the Award of Excellence from the Iowa Girls' and Women in Sport in 1999.

In addition, Dannen has been active in community service in both the greater Des Moines area and around the state. He has been a member of the Iowa Games Board of Directors, the Greater Des Moines Sports Commission, and served on the AAU Junior Olympics Local Organizing Committee. He also has served on the Iowa Athletic Council, Iowa Referee Committee and the Drake Relays Committee. Dannen has also been active internationally, having twice in the past five years been a presenter in Malaysia – at the request of the Olympic Council of Malaysia – on the topic of youth sports and sport program development.

Born and raised on a farm near Marshalltown, Iowa, Dannen, 42, received his bachelor's degree in public relations with a minor in journalism from UNI in 1989. He and his wife, Lori, have two daughters: Emily (13) and Holly (9).



Jean Berger
Senior Associate Athletic Director/Senior Woman Administrator

Jean Berger joined the University of Northern Iowa staff as senior associate athletic director and senior woman

administrator in October 2008. At UNI, Berger is the direct supervisor of seven UNI women's sports. She also will be responsible for implementing and monitoring gender equity plans; assisting with marketing and budgeting of assigned programs; and providing support to the athletic compliance office and athletic academic advising.

Before coming to UNI, Berger worked for more than 17 years at Drake. Berger began working with the Bulldogs in 1991 as an assistant sports information director. In 1994 she took over as the senior woman administrator and assistant athletic director for internal affairs, and in 2005 she was promoted to senior associate athletic director.

Berger's responsibilities at Drake included supervision of 11 athletic programs and overseeing the department's student services, including compliance, academic support, sports medicine and strength and conditioning. She also worked as a sponsor for the Drake Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. She serves as the Missouri Valley Conference representative to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Issues Committee, and she previously served a five-year term on the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee.

Berger also worked closely with Drake's Title IX Review and gender equity plan, the 1995 NCAA Midwest Women's Basketball Regional, two cycles of Drake's NCAA Certification self-study and the Drake Relays.

Before working at Drake, Berger spent one year as an assistant sports information director at Wichita State. From 1985-1990, Berger worked as the sports information director at Wayne State College.

Berger attended the University of Iowa, and she earned her bachelor's degree in journalism and her master's degree in physical education and sports studies. She is a native of Winterset, Iowa, and has two daughters, Jessica (22) and Jenna (14).

Building on a strong tradition of teacher education, the University of Northern Iowa has evolved into one of the finest comprehensive public universities in the country. UNI emphasizes excellence in undergraduate education and offers selected graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels.

UNI's heritage and philosophy place great value on providing a student-centered educational experience. The university offers a learning environment that is small enough to provide students with individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources, including distinguished faculty. UNI's special combination of challenge and support is indeed a key ingredient of a "Students First" education.

Today, UNI offers more than 120 undergraduate majors. Outstanding academic programs, many of which are nationally-recognized for their excellence, have been established in the colleges of Business Administration, Education, Humanities and Fine Arts, Natural Sciences, and Social and Behavioral Sciences. In addition, UNI participates in the bachelor of liberal studies program offered by Iowa's Regent Universities and provides classes in centers around the state through the division of Continuing Education and Special Programs.

Recognized as the premier public undergraduate university in the state, UNI is experiencing an increasing demand for its high-quality programs. Enrollment at UNI was 12,908 students in the fall of 2008. Students come from every county in Iowa, and about 94 percent of UNI's undergraduate students are residents of Iowa upon enrollment.

The University of Northern Iowa was founded in 1876 as the Iowa State Normal School. It became Iowa State Teachers College in 1909. In 1961, the name was changed to State College of Iowa, and in 1967, the Iowa Legislature changed the status of the institution to that of a university under its present title.

One of the most important aspects of a future productive life is your education. Fortunately, this education period comes early in life while you have the time and energies necessary to accomplish this very worthwhile goal. Obtaining a college education and ultimately a degree is the student-athlete's responsibility. The education process means managing your time wisely so that the educational, athletic and social aspects of your life have an appropriate share of time.

At given times, students may find it necessary to ask for help in accomplishing an educational task. At UNI, the following services are available to students for obtaining guidelines and/or specific help.

Educational Opportunity Program

The mission of the educational opportunity program is to provide supportive services which are essential for the identification, recruitment, retention and graduation of minority and educationally disadvantaged students who traditionally have not had equal access to higher educational institutions. Services provided to participants include:

- Academic and career counseling
- Tutorial services
- Financial aid counseling and advising
- Personal counseling
- Course selection and registration
- Educational planning

In order to be an EOP participant, the student must be a minority student or be educationally disadvantaged, as evidenced by having an ACT score of 15 or less and/or placing in the bottom half of his/her high school graduating class.

Academic Counseling

An advisor has been assigned responsibilities across the athletics department and will assist you in:

- Scheduling
- Choice of major
- Selection of a major advisor
- Tutorial services
- Maintain satisfactory progress toward a degree

Academic Success

To qualify, wrestlers must have at least a 3.2 cumulative GPA, been an NCAA qualifier or won 60 percent of his total schedule - and must have competed in at least 60 percent of said schedule. The other way to qualify for the All-Academic team is have a 3.0 cumulative and been an NCAA All-American.

Strength and Conditioning

Strength and Conditioning

The UNI strength and conditioning program is a blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each student-athlete.

Throughout the year, UNI athletes can spend more time working on strength and conditioning than any other aspect of their game. During the off season, athletes work on strength improvement, speed, power, agility and conditioning. The in-season program is devoted to continuation of strength gains and performance-related conditioning.

Throughout an athlete's first year on campus, baseline measurements of strength, speed, power, agility, flexibility and endurance are collected. Measure of body composition and weight are also recorded. With this information, goals are set for development and maintenance. Programs are established for each athlete.

Jed C. Smith joined UNI's staff as strength and conditioning coach in June of 2005.

Smith has a wide and varied background in strength and conditioning training. Prior to coming

to the Cedar Valley, he was the explosive strength training coach for the Minnesota Vikings of the National Football League. He has also assisted with the Minnesota Wild of the National Hockey League, the Minnesota Thunder of the United Soccer League and Penn State football in an effort to incorporate explosive strength training into their individual programs.

Beginning in June of 2002, he was an exercise and sports science instructor at Dakota County Technical College in Rosemount, Minn. He also served as the Minnesota USA Weightlifting Regional Training Center director during the same time frame.

He had several coaching assignments at Rosemount High School, including ninth-grade boy's basketball and wrestling, starting in 1996. He served as Rosemount's strength training and

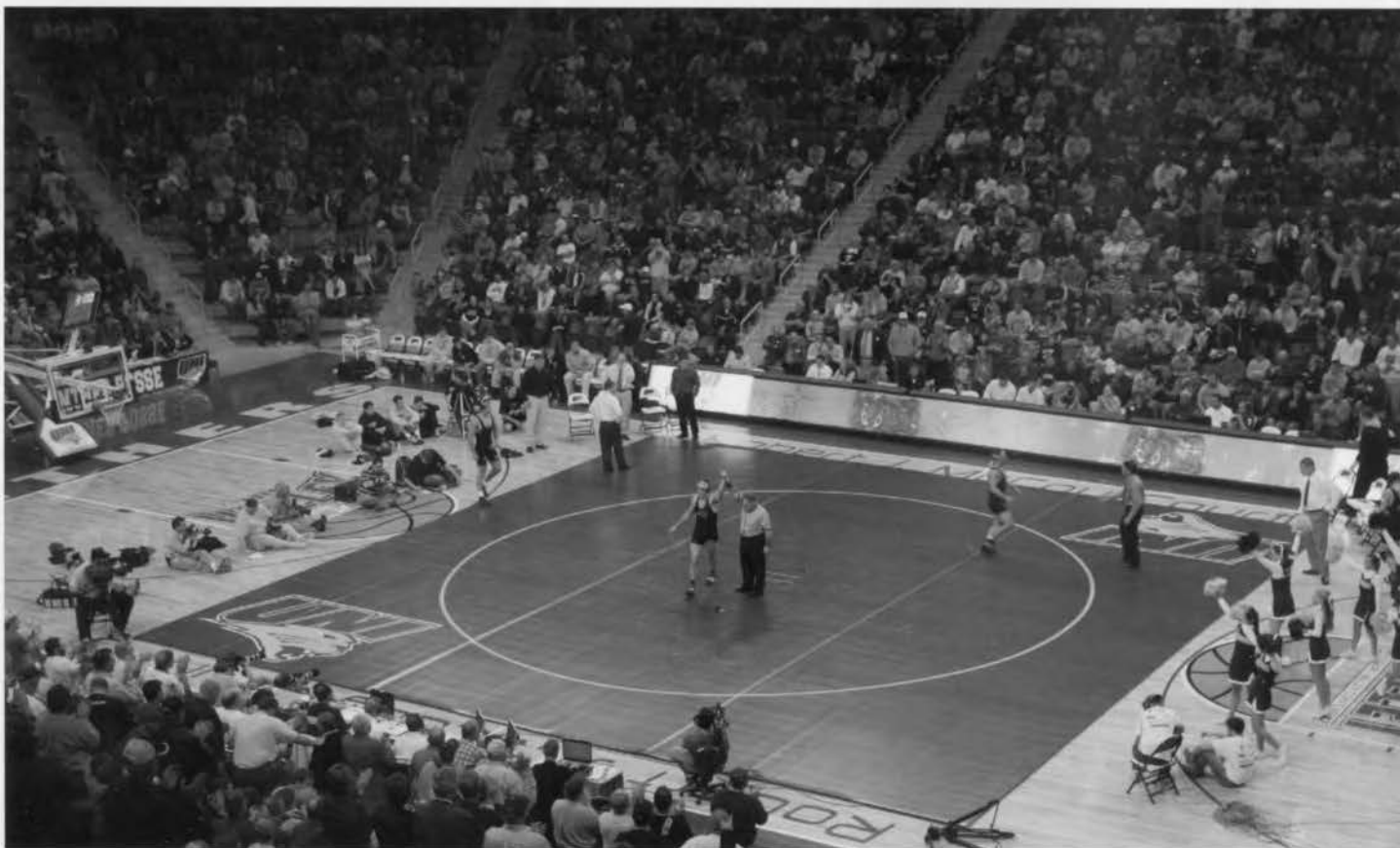
conditioning coach for all sports from 1997-2002, was head boy's tennis coach from 2000-02, and coached the school's Olympic weight lifting from 1999-2002.

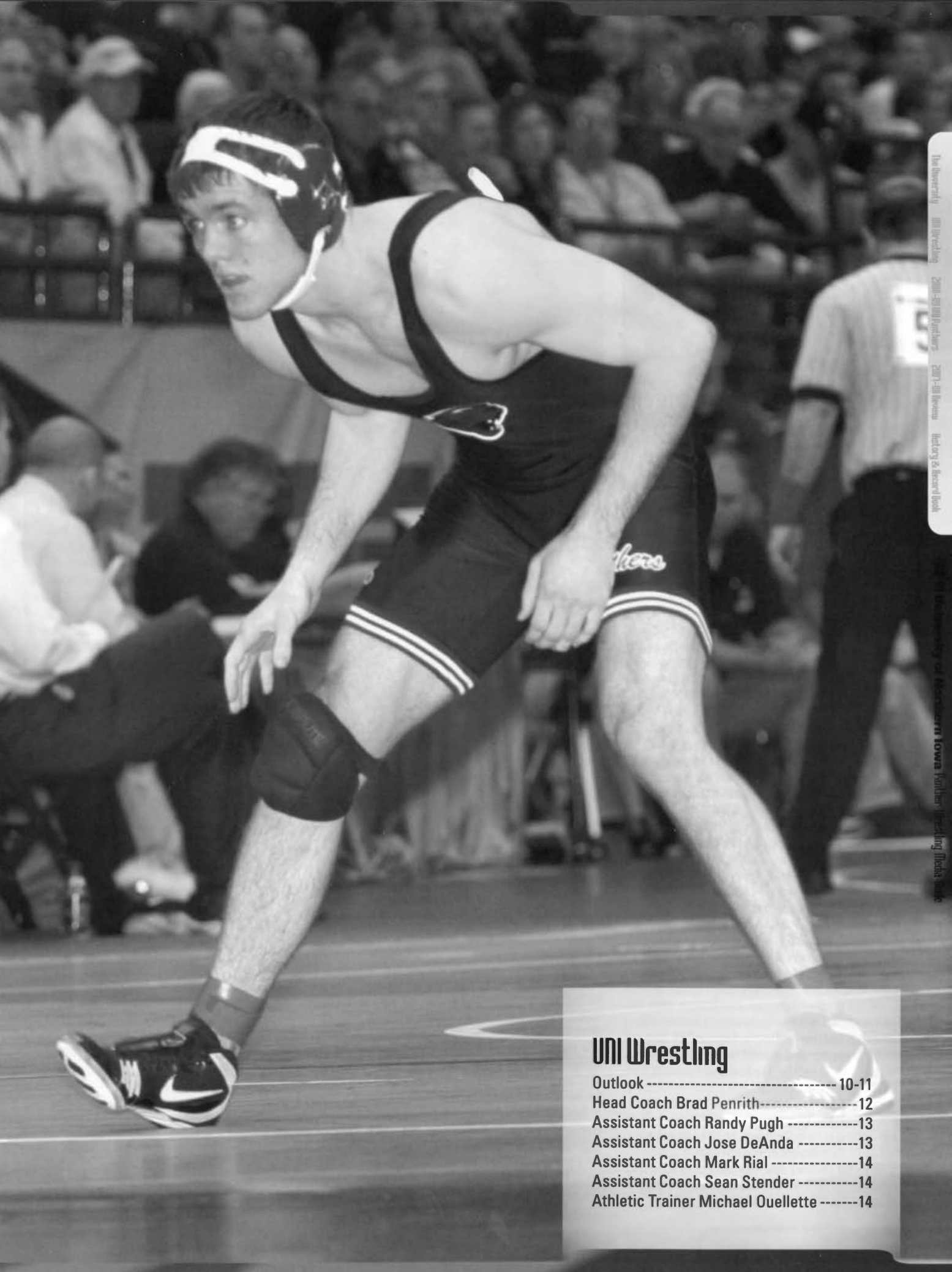

He was born in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, and his wife's name is Tammy.

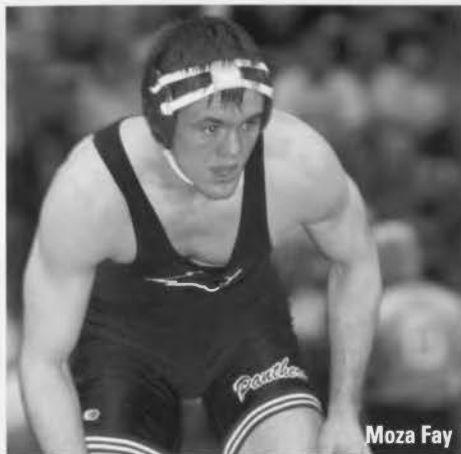

The University of Northern Iowa wrestling team will have an advantage this season it has not seen since the 2004-05 season – the Panthers will have a returning All-American.



Senior Moza Fay captured All-America honors after placing fifth in the 165-pound bracket at the 2008 NCAA Championships. Fay is the Panthers' first returning All-American since the 2004-05 season.

"It's so important to have a returning All-American because every one of wrestlers saw what he accomplished and the effort he went through to get to that honor," UNI head coach Brad Penrith said. "It can drive each individual to attain that status and we can continue to build this program."

The Panthers not only have Fay returning, but seven of its nine national qualifiers from the 2008 NCAA Championships are back for a run in 2008-09.

"We have a great nucleus to work with and we had a great national recruiting class to assist us as well," Penrith said. "When you bring back seven guys with national tournament experience it breeds success among the guys challenging to earn their own national tournament berths."

Penrith pointed to the Panthers' success at the national tournament as being a turning point for the UNI wrestling program.

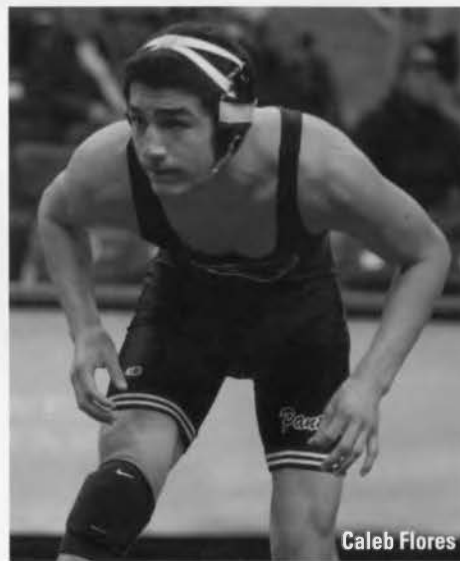
"Not only did we have nine guys compete at the national tournament last year, we had guys winning matches and advancing," Penrith said. "You can get 10 guys there and if you lose all 20 matches, you don't gain anything from that. But we had a lot of advancement last year and that allowed us to score points and move the program back into the top-20 teams in the nation."

UNI will continue its rugged scheduling in 2008-09. The tournament portion of the schedule includes the Kaufman-Brand Open in Omaha, Neb., on Nov. 22 and the always competitive UNI Open on Dec. 7. The Panthers will take part in The Midlands tournament on Dec. 29-30 in Evanston, Ill.

The Panthers' dual action includes national powers Iowa (Dec. 11), at Wisconsin (Dec. 13), Oklahoma State (Jan. 25) and at Iowa State (Feb. 6). UNI will look to capture its third straight Western Wrestling Conference crown as the Panthers dual with four league opponents on the road in 2008-09. UNI will wrestle at Northern Colorado (Jan. 16), at Air Force (Jan. 17), at South

Dakota State (Feb. 21) and at North Dakota State (Feb. 22).

UNI will look to extend its streak of 23 straight regional titles when it heads to Greeley, Colo., for the NCAA West Regional on March 7, 2009.

Redshirt sophomore Caleb Flores (Rosemead, Calif.) is the Panthers' top returner at 125 pounds. Flores qualified for the NCAA Championships last season after garnering a wild card entry at the West Regional. Flores posted nine victories on the season, including four in dual action.

Challenging Flores at 125 lbs. will be junior college transfer Terrance Young (Minneapolis, Minn.), redshirt freshman Cruse Aarhus (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) and true freshmen Steven Fitzgerald (Fresno, Calif.), Adam Hight (Greenfield, Iowa) and Grant Sutter (Barneveld, Wis.).

Young won a junior college national championship in 2008 and placed third at the NJCAA national meet in 2007, while he was a member of the Iowa Central Community College wrestling team.

Senior Josh Baldrige (Haysville, Kan.) returns for his final season in a Panther singlet and will look to make his second straight appearance at the NCAA Championships. Baldrige captured the West Regional title and was a first-team All-Western Wrestling Conference pick as a junior. Baldrige secured nine wins last season and secured a pin of Edinboro's Rick Deubel at the NCAA Championships.

A pair of true freshmen, Cody Delagardelle (Jesup, Iowa) and Ryan Jauch (Crystal Lake, Ill.), will provide depth at 133 pounds. Delagardelle was a two-time state placer at Gilbertville-Don Bosco High School, while Jauch was a four-time Illinois state qualifier at Crystal Lake High School.

The Panthers look forward to the return of redshirt freshman Trent Washington (Omaha, Neb.) at 141 pounds. Washington was the Panthers' starter at 133 lbs. last season before he suffered a season-ending neck injury. Washington was 8-3 at the time of the injury. He had won the Loras Open title and finished second at the Kaufman-Brand Open.

Sophomore Cole Zempel (LaPorte City, Iowa) and freshman Alec Hoffman (Davenport, Iowa) will challenge Washington for the starting spot. Zempel went 4-2 last season and placed fifth at the Loras Open, while wrestling at 149 pounds. Hoffman was a four-time state qualifier and a three-time state placer. Hoffman was a state runner-up in both 2007 and 2008.

149

The 149-pound weight class could be the most balanced weight the Panthers have this season. Prior to Nick Pickerell's (Albia, Iowa) season-ending shoulder surgery there appeared to be five wrestlers with a shot to be the starter. Pickerell was the WWC's Freshman of the Year last season after winning the NCAA West Regional and earning his first nod into the NCAA Championships.

With Pickerell out of the mix it will come down to a battle between junior Charlie Ettelson (Hudson, Iowa), junior Brett Robbins (Bloomington, Ill.), sophomore Trevor Kittleson (St. Ansgar, Iowa) and redshirt freshman Jamal Lawrence (Merrillville, Ind.).

Robbins appeared to the leader going into the month of November, but he suffered a torn lateral collateral ligament in his knee and will likely miss 4-to-6 weeks to begin the season.



Ettelson, who was an NWCA all-academic selection and a first-team academic All-WWC pick, saw plenty of action last season at 149 lbs. Ettelson went 4-4 in dual action and secured 13 total wins. He took home first-place honors at the Loras Open.

Kittleson's 21 victories last season ranked him tied for second on the squad. Kittleson had a busy open tournament season as he capped the year with a championship at the Duhawk Open. Kittleson also placed second at the Flash Flanagan Open and secured a fifth-place finish at the Jim Fox Open.

Lawrence spent his redshirt season as a busy

unattached wrestler. He secured 19 wins and had his best finish of the season at the Kaufman-Brand Open when he notched a second-place tally.

Junior Tyson Reiner (Mitchell, S.D.) is back after making his first NCAA Championships appearance in 2008. Reiner captured the 157-pound West Regional title and was a first-team All-WWC pick. Reiner missed the first part of the season with a broken bone in his hand, but came on strong at the end to earn the national bid. Reiner made the most of his national tournament appearance as he secured a 5-2 triumph over Michigan's Jeff Marsh in a wrestleback match.

True freshman Anthony Meza (Vista, Calif.) was a two-time California state champion and three-time state placer as a prep wrestler. Meza is a two-sport athlete at UNI as he will also play baseball for the Panthers. He will provide depth at 157 lbs.

When it comes to the face of the 2008-09 Panther wrestling team, look no further than 165-pound All-American Moza Fay. Fay will enter the season ranked No. 3 in his weight class by InterMat.

Fay (Anamosa, Iowa) became the first wrestler in the Western Wrestling Conference to earn All-America honors and he was also named the league's Wrestler of the Year in 2007-08. At the NCAA meet last season, Fay captured wins over ranked foes including No. 5 Stephen Dwyer (Nebraska), No. 9 Trevor Stewart (Central Michigan) and No. 10 Michael Cannon (American).

Fay led the Panthers with 25 wins last season and will enter his senior season with 90 wins, including a 29-8 mark in dual action. Fay has also notched 26 falls in his career, which ranks him tied for No. 10 on the Panthers' all-time falls list.

The Panthers will also have three other wrestlers suiting up at 165 pounds this season and that list includes freshman David Bonin (Broussard, La.), sophomore Seth Pugh (Columbus Junction, Iowa) and freshman John Simon (Parkersburg, Iowa).

The Panthers will enter the season awaiting word on the sixth year of eligibility for Alex Dolly (Mishawaka, Ind.). If Dolly is granted his sixth year, he will be looking for his fourth trip to the NCAA Championships. He has reached the Round of 12 on two occasions – as a freshman in 2004-05 and then last season as a senior. Dolly has notched 60 career wins and 13 pins as a Panther.

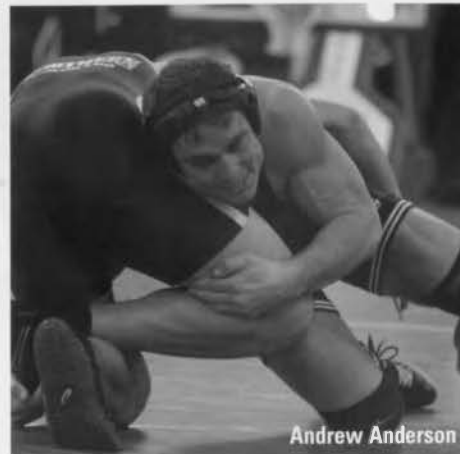

If Dolly is not granted a sixth year, then sophomore Jarion Beets (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) will move up to 174 lbs. after competing last season at both 157 and 165 pounds. Beets posted six victories last season, including a 3-2 dual win over South Dakota State's national qualifier Ryan Meyer. Beets captured the 165-pound title at the Duhawk Open.

Junior Scott Hazen (Underwood, Iowa) will be the Panther's starter at 184 pounds. Hazen has tallied 11 career wins in two seasons. He posted a season-best fourth-place finish at the Jim Fox Open.

Senior Andrew Anderson (Sioux City, Iowa) has excelled in the classroom and on the mat for the Panthers. Anderson is a two-time academic All-Western Wrestling Conference selection and was also named to the National Wrestling Coaches Association all-academic team in 2007-08. Anderson is a three-time national qualifier and took a major step forward last year when he earned his first national tournament victory – a 13-3 win over Cal State-Bakersfield's Riley Orozco.

Anderson will enter the 2008-09 season with a 62-53 mark, which includes 18 dual wins. He also was a first-team All-WWC pick in 2007-08.

285

Redshirt freshman Christian Brantley (Homewood, Ill.) will take over the starting duties at heavyweight for the Panthers. Brantley posted an impressive 17-6 record as an unattached wrestler in the open tournament portion of the schedule while redshirting.

Brantley won the heavyweight title at the Loras Open and then placed second at the Kaufman-Brand Open. He capped his season with a second-place finish at the Duhawk Open. Brantley also took part in the 2008 FILA Junior Nationals and where he reached the semifinals and eventually placed fifth in the nation. Brantley was given the team's Redshirt Award at the conclusion of the season.

Last year's starting heavyweight Dustin Bauman (Stratford, Wis.) underwent ACL surgery in the offseason and will miss this season as he recuperates. Bauman injured the knee last February but continued to wrestle and just missed qualifying for the NCAA Championships after he placed third at the NCAA West Regional. Bauman earned third-team All-WWC honors and was named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll with a 3.23 grade point average.

Freshman Blayne Beale (Davenport, Iowa) will likely redshirt this season. Beale secured a pair of top-eight finishes and 66 career wins as a prep wrestler at Davenport West High School.

Head Coach Brad Penrith

9th Season

Brad Penrith is entering his ninth season at the helm of the University of Northern Iowa wrestling program. Penrith's 2008-09 squad will boast of a returning All-American in the form of 165-pounder Moza Fay.

Penrith guided the Panthers to a 20th-place finish at the 2008 NCAA Wrestling Championships. UNI qualified nine wrestlers to the championship meet after winning its 23rd straight regional crown. UNI also won its second straight regular season Western Wrestling Conference title with a perfect 4-0 mark. UNI is 8-0 all-time in WWC duals.

He has coached both of the WWC Wrestlers of the Year (Nick Baima in 2006-07, Moza Fay in 2007-08) and both of the WWC Freshmen of the Year (Kyle Anson in 2006-07, Nick Pickerell in 2007-08). Penrith was named the inaugural WWC Coach of the Year in 2006-07.

A former University of Iowa All-American and national champion, Penrith was named head coach on June 21, 2000, becoming only the ninth wrestling coach in the program's history. In his first eight seasons at the helm, he has a record of 70-57-4 and has sent 62 wrestlers to the NCAA National Championships.

In 2005, Sean Stender became the first UNI wrestler since Justin Greenlee in 1995 to three-peat at the National Tournament, placing second at 197 pounds. Eric Hauan made his fourth and final trip to the NAAs, earning All-America honors for the second consecutive season at 174 pounds.

Having been affiliated with the Panther program since 1997, three of those years as an assistant coach, Penrith has been instrumental in securing six Top 25 recruiting classes. Penrith took the 2007 recruiting class back to national prominence as it was ranked No. 9 in the nation. Penrith has always had the UNI recruiting classes ranked among the best in the country – in fact his 2003 recruiting class was ranked No. 4 in the nation.

During his three seasons as an assistant coach, the Panthers posted their first winning dual record in six years in the 2000 season with a record of 10-5-2, and placed 11th at the NCAA Championships.

Penrith is the first to comment on his fellow coaches and their dedication to UNI wrestling.

"I have one of the best coaching staffs in the country," Penrith said. "A lot of head

coaches have to micro-manage their assistants and I don't have to do that; I am very fortunate. Each one of these guys has grown and matured and become a better coach since joining UNI's staff. You can't ask for anything more than that.

"Each one of these guys, individually, is a great person. I have guys with a ton of youth in them and they are hungry, and they want UNI to continue in the right direction. Everybody is on the same page and all my coaches get along as one big family and that's something that you always strive for as a head coach. My coaching staff is full of great role models who are able to train with the guys every day."

Prior to coming to UNI, he spent five seasons as an assistant at Nebraska, coaching the Huskers' lighter weights. He also served a one-year stint as an assistant at Boise State in 1991-92, spent two seasons at Arizona State from 1989-91, and was a graduate assistant at Iowa.

Athletically, Penrith's credentials are outstanding. He won the 126-pound national championship at Iowa in 1986 as a sophomore, then placed second at 126 in 1987 and 1988. He was a three-time Big Ten champ for the Hawkeyes and was named Outstanding Wrestler at the conference meet in 1986.

A 1988 Iowa graduate, Penrith also made his mark at the international level before retiring in 1996. He captured a Silver Medal at the 1991 World Championships, was the Gold Medalist at the Pan American Games in 1991 and won the title at the Pan American Games Championship in 1989.

Penrith has many accomplishments internationally, including placing third at the 1994 Goodwill Games, becoming a two-time Sunkist Open champion, taking the Roger Coulon title in France in 1992 and '96, being a member of the 1989 U.S. World Team, and taking third at the World Cup in 1990 and 1991.



Closer to home, he placed third at the 1996 Olympic Team Trials, won the U.S. Nationals three times--1989, '91 and '93 – and was second at the '92 final Olympic wrestle-off.

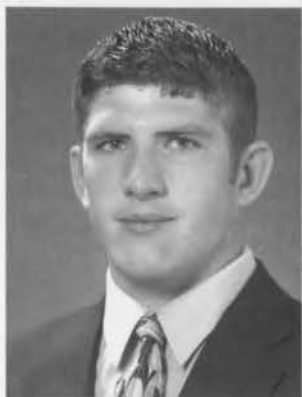
As a coach, Penrith is renowned as an excellent technician and recruiter. He has been involved with USA Wrestling at several levels of coaching and in the summer of 1999, he was the head coach of the United States team that competed at the Junior World Freestyle Championships in Sydney, Australia, which took the Bronze Medal in the team competition.

In Penrith's five seasons coaching the lighter weights at Nebraska, the Huskers crowned 12 All-Americans and two national champions. Nebraska also won the Big Eight Conference title twice. As a team, Nebraska posted top 10 finishes at the NAAs three times, including third in 1993, and had the top-rated recruiting class in the nation in 1996.

A native of Windsor, N.Y, Penrith was a four-time state placewinner in high school, including winning the state title as a sophomore in 1981. He was named the Outstanding Greco-Roman Wrestler at the 1983 Junior Nationals.

He and his wife, Laura, have two sons, Gabriel (10) and Jacob (8), and a daughter, Grace Marie (5).





Randy Pugh
Assistant Head Coach
9th Season

Assistant head coach Randy Pugh will enter his fifth season as UNI's top assistant. Pugh was promoted in the middle of the 2003-04 season. Pugh joined Penrith's staff following an outstanding athletic career at the University of Northern Iowa.

In his eight seasons as a coach, Pugh, a former Panther All-American, helped develop All-Americans Eric Hauan (174), Kyle Hansen (184), Jason Payne (197), Sean Stender (197) and Paul Hynek (285).

When head coach Brad Penrith took over eight years ago, the Columbus Junction, Iowa, native was a natural choice.

"Randy was a great student-athlete here at UNI," Penrith said. "When he was one of my wrestlers, we had a bond for a student-coach relationship. Now as a coach, he relates to all the guys on the team. He has a great head on his shoulders and does a great job in the wrestling room.

"I've said a thousand times, Randy came into this program working his tail off when he was a senior, becoming one of the leaders," Penrith said. "It has carried over to him being a leader as a coach. I'm not scared to go on a recruiting trip or an appointment, because I know everything will be taken care of. I'm confident that the practices will be run well and he is going to get the most out of the wrestlers when I'm not around."

While coaching for the Panthers, he has been training for international competition as an 85 kg. freestyle wrestler. Pugh finished in fourth place at the USA World Trials in June 2002 and competed in the Trials again in 2003. In 2002, he won the Sunkist International Open and garnered a third-place finish at the U.S. Open. In 2003, Pugh again achieved All-American status as he placed 8th at the U.S. Open. He also placed third at the Dave Schultz Open in 2003.

As an athlete at UNI, Pugh finished fourth at the 2000 NCAA Tournament at 174 pounds, capping a senior season in which he compiled a 26-4 record. He was ranked as high as third nationally after upending top-rated Otto Olson at the Virginia Duals.

Pugh was a state high school champion his senior year at Columbus Junction before enrolling at the U.S. Naval Academy, where he compiled a 16-8 record his first year. After transferring to UNI in 1998, he went 54-9 in two seasons for the Panthers, giving him a 70-17 career mark.

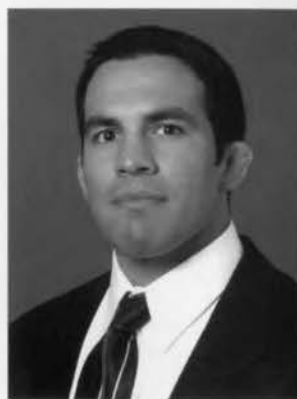
For Pugh, the biggest change from competing on the mat to coaching his former teammates is motivating others.

"When I was on the mat, I was doing what it took to make myself a better athlete," Pugh said. "But as a coach, I am more concerned with what others are doing and helping them improve."

Pugh not only was a leader in the wrestling arena but also in the classroom. He graduated with a degree in Industrial Technology.

Pugh's goal for the Panthers is for the athletes to improve every match out and continue to be good student-athletes.

Former Nebraska All-American Jose DeAnda is entering his ninth year as a Panther assistant coach. DeAnda was promoted to second assistant on Penrith's staff in 2003. His main responsibilities include training the lighter weights and recruiting.

DeAnda took great pride in coaching Moza Fay to his first All-America honor in the 2007-08 season. Fay placed fifth at 165 pounds at the 2008 NCAA Championships.

DeAnda went 28-9 at 141 pounds his senior year for the Huskers in 1998-99 and spent the 1999-00 season as a coach with the Husker Wrestling Club.

He finished his collegiate career second in the Big 12 Championships and placing eighth at the NCAA Tournament. As the 10th seed at the national championships, DeAnda posted a 3-3 record in his first NCAA appearance. He also was named the team's most dedicated wrestler.

"I always say that Jose is my utility man but he has become more than that. He gets involved with the guys personally and they feel able to talk to him about personal matters," Penrith said. "He's always working with them in the room and making sure they are doing the right things with their weight. The guys have great respect for Jose and that makes my job so much easier."

A South Sioux City, Neb. native, DeAnda was ranked as high as sixth nationally. Penrith recruited DeAnda to Nebraska and coached him for three seasons in Lincoln while he was a Husker assistant coach.

1st Season

Mark Rial is returning to his alma mater and will serve as the Panthers' conditioning specialist in the 2008-09 season. Rial wrestled for the Panthers from 1999 to 2001 and was a national qualifier in 2001.

Following his graduation from UNI in 2001 with a bachelor of arts in general studies, he served as the Panther Wrestling Club coach in the 2001-2002 season. As the club coach he ran a variety of wrestling practices for the program, while reporting to UNI head coach Brad Penrith.

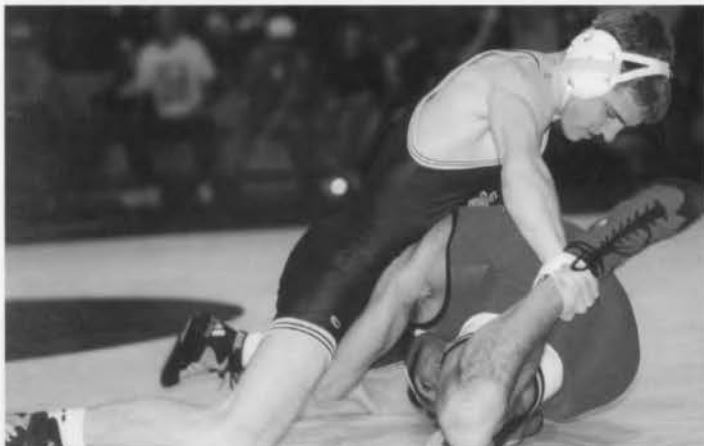
Rial captured the 2008 United State Greco-Roman national championship at 66 kg in 2008. He was ranked as high as No. 11 in the world at his weight class in 2008.

In 2007, Rial placed third at the U.S. World Team Trials and was the Northern Plains Senior regional champion. Rial placed fourth at U.S. Nationals in 2005 and fifth in 2006. In 2004, Rial placed seventh at the U.S. Olympic Team Trials.

Rial earned a third-place effort at the 2002 University Nationals. Previously, Rial has been the runner-up at the 1993 Junior Nationals and placed fourth at the 1994 Cadet World Championships.

He was a two-time state champion at Fort Dodge High School in 1994 and 1996. He was a state runner-up in 1995. Rial was a four-time state qualifier.

Sean Stender is beginning his fourth season as an assistant coach for the Panthers, and his first as a volunteer assistant. Stender served three seasons as the Panthers' conditioning specialist.

"It is great having Sean committed to the UNI wrestling program with his goals of competing and furthering Panther wrestling," Penrith said. "He has had many opportunities to move on but he knows staying at UNI and working in this environment and atmosphere provides him the best chance to reach his goals of becoming a world and Olympic champion."

Stender was a three-time All-American for the Panthers as he placed fourth in 2003, sixth in 2004 and second in 2005. He became the first UNI wrestler to three-peat as an All-American since Justin Greenlee in 1995. During his career as a Panther, he compiled a 94-33 record, 37-14 in duals.

Following his collegiate career, Stender joined the UNI coaching staff as a conditioning specialist – a position he has held for the past three seasons. While serving as the Panthers' conditioning specialist he has proven to be a competitive wrestler at the national level as he captured top honors in the 96 kg/215.5 pound Freestyle Division of the Dave Schultz Memorial International tournament held in Colorado Springs, Co., on Feb. 8-10, 2008. Stender added a bronze medal at the 2008 Dmitri Korkin International Championships in Yakutsk, Russia.

Stender is currently ranked No. 3 on the Olympic ladder at his weight class.

The Donahue, Iowa, native placed at the state tournament three years, including claiming first in his senior campaign. Stender compiled a 149-12 in his career at North Scott High School with an untouchable 45-0 record his senior year.



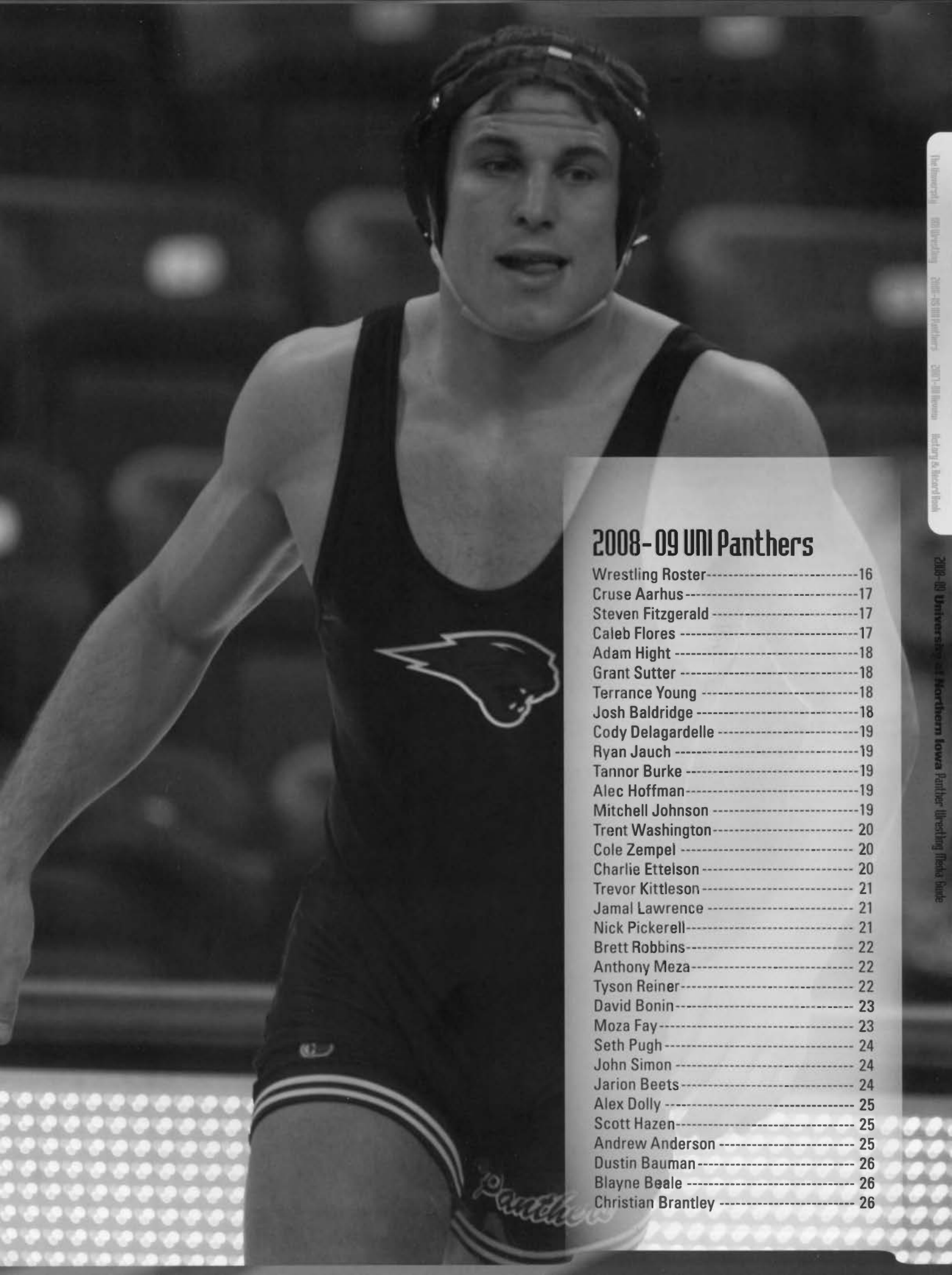

Ed Ewoldt Scholarship

In January of 1992, UNI officials announced the establishment of the Ed Ewoldt Wrestling Scholarship, the first fully-endowed scholarship in the history of the University's athletics program.

The scholarship was made possible by a \$120,000 gift to the Northern Iowa Foundation by Ron Magruder of Orlando, Florida. Each year, beginning with the 1992-93 academic year, the Panther wrestling program has awarded a full scholarship from the interest generated by the gift.

Ewoldt began attending UNI, then known as Iowa State Teachers College, in 1948 and graduated in 1954,

competing on the wrestling team his last two years. He went on to teach and coach at West Central-Maynard (Iowa) High School from 1955-58 and Wheaton (Ill.) Central High School, where he coached Magruder, from 1959-88.

"Ed has had a tremendous impact on my life," Magruder said, "and has helped me get where I am today. This is my way of thanking him for being a great teacher, mentor and friend."

The recipient of the Ed Ewoldt Scholarship for the 2008-09 season is Moza Fay.

The 2008 NWCA/Cliff Keen National Duals were named Event of the Year by the Cedar Valley Tourism Awards handed out last May.

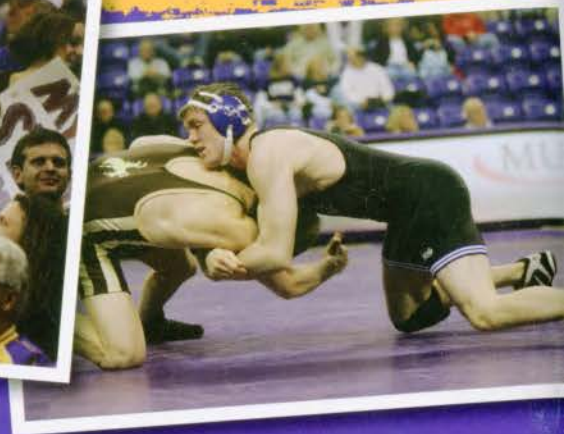
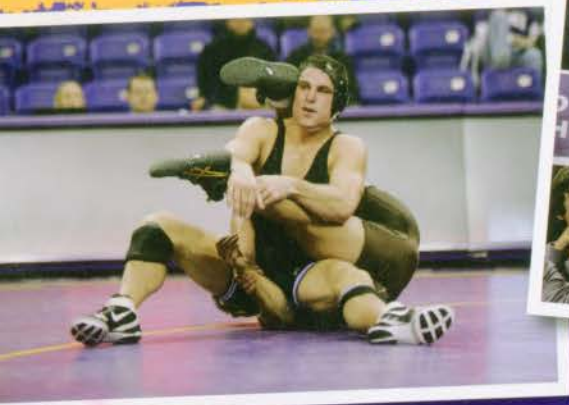
