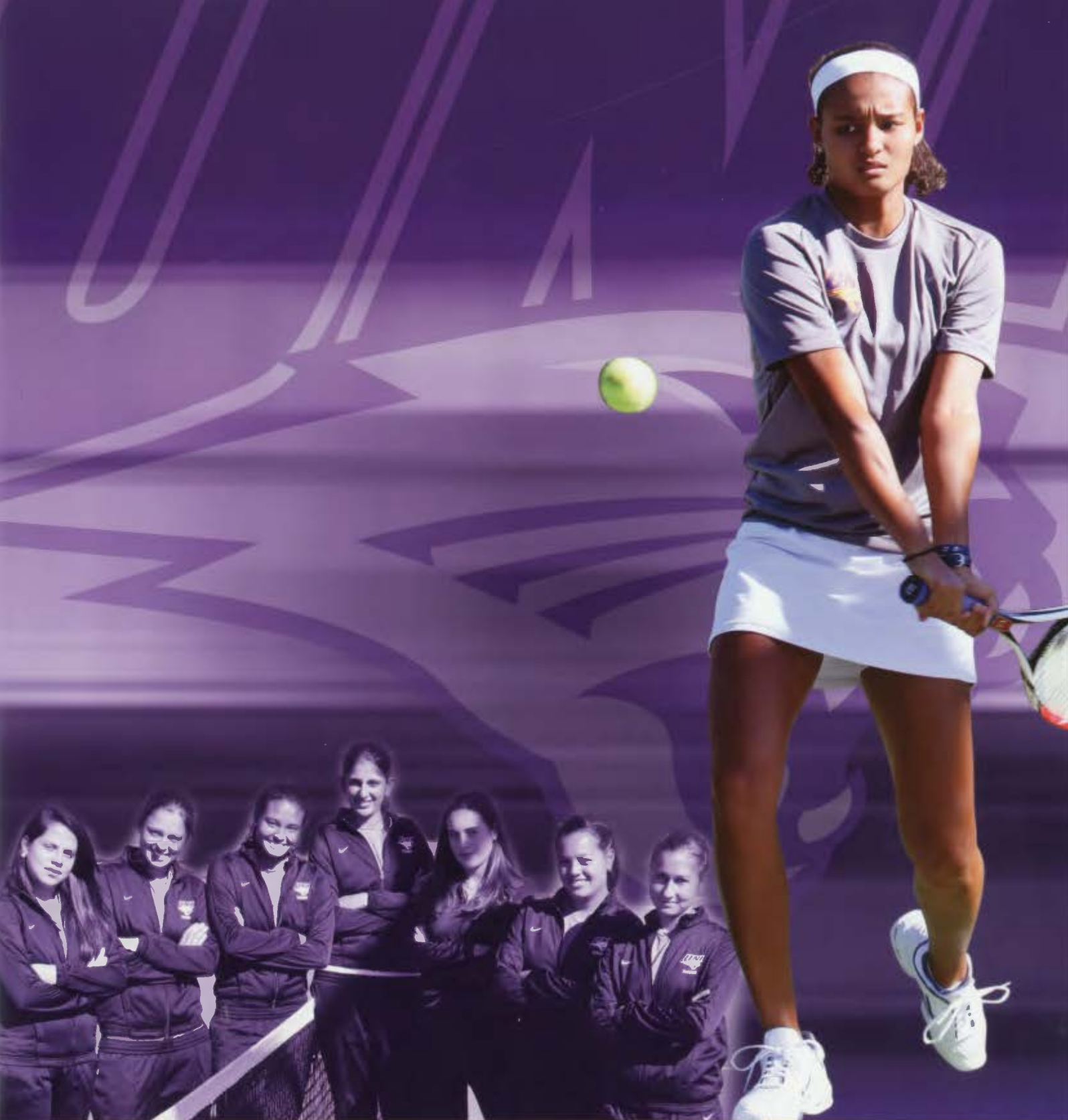

2009 PREVIEW

PANTHERS HOPE TO BUILD UPON WINNING TRADITION

A winning tradition has been established under head coach Sachin Kirtane, and the Panthers expect nothing less than another solid showing during their 2009 campaign. With a combined record of 64-26 spanning the past four years, the Panthers have found themselves in the top four of the conference in three out of those seasons.

Kirtane is confident that this year's squad will conform to the bar that has been set. The potential that Kirtane sees in the 2009 Panthers, however, could make this season even more special.

"We've had a lot of great teams here over the years, and talent-wise, this is the best team we've had from top to bottom," said Kirtane.

UNI's talented lineup is a young one. Three freshmen, two sophomores, one junior and a lone senior make up the 2009 Panthers. Kirtane feels the key component for his fairly inexperienced team will lie in how the Panthers mesh.

"We're very young, so [our success] will depend upon how we adjust. The girls are buying into the fact that they have to play together," said Kirtane.

With high expectations come lofty goals. Although the Panthers' goals this season would have been considered unthinkable five years ago, they are now very realistic.

"We want to be one of the top 75 teams in the ITA rankings," said Kirtane. "We want to play hard and compete every match. If we can do that, we can have a lot of success."

The Panthers know that they are capable of competing in every match because that's exactly what they did during the 2008 fall season. The fall also provided the youthful squad with some needed experience against tough opponents.

"We played really tough competition and held our own against them. We are a better team than we were in August, which was our goal," said Kirtane.

The 2008 fall season helped mold the current UNI lineup filled with threats from top to bottom.

Junior Sampada Kanade will most likely step up into the No. 1 singles position. The Mumbai, India, native has competed near the top of the lineup for most of her career, and Kirtane feels assured with Kanade in a leading role.

"She has all the weapons to play at the top level. The team is going to look up to her," said Kirtane.

One of the Panthers' freshest faces is looking to

compete at the No. 2 singles position. Straight out of Kensington, Australia, freshman Phoebe Walker possesses the ingredients to make a big impact early in her career.

"Phoebe's probably the most talented player I've ever recruited. She has every weapon possible and has the potential to be a tremendous player," said Kirtane.

Taynara Moraes will provide the senior leadership for the Panthers this season. Moraes hopes to make her last season her best as she utilizes the experience she has obtained in her four years. Kirtane anticipates his squad to look up to Moraes as well.

"She knows what it takes to win, and I hope she can set an example this year," said Kirtane.

Freshman Jessica Kunzelmann will play another key role for the Panthers early in her career. Hailing from Bollschweil, Germany, Kunzelmann adapted to Panther tennis quickly and had some promising performances during the fall season. Kirtane is excited to see what is in store for who he deems as the team's quickest and fiercest competitor.

"She has the desire and talent to succeed at the highest level. Nothing fazes her," said Kirtane.

Laia Gonzalez-Garrido joined the team in January 2008 and has since shown much improvement. The Vinaros, Spain, native will look to build on the potential shown during the fall season.

"The fall has been good for Laia to identify what she needs to do. Now she can use her experience to improve," said Kirtane.

Sophomore Diana Mendez will round out the top six for the Panthers and will probably do so in dominant fashion. Mendez completed the fall season with the best singles record (9-2) and top conference finish for UNI, ending up in third place in No. 6 singles.

"I fully expect Diana to have a tremendous year. She's been a fixture for us," said Kirtane.

Talia Jang-Stewart of Calgary, Alberta, is the third fresh face on the Panther squad. Battling a wrist injury since the fall, Jang-Stewart hopes to return to practice and compete this season.

The team's high expectations will be put to the test this season as the Panthers face some quality opponents. UNI will find a challenge right away, traveling to Iowa to take on the Hawkeyes in its opening match on Jan. 25.

Following a nine-match home stand, UNI will visit Lincoln, Neb. to take on the Cornhuskers. The Panthers hope to see how they stand against a squad that will most likely finish at the top of the Big 12.

UNI will then head to the Bayou in the middle of March to take on New Orleans, Southern and Southeastern Louisiana on consecutive days.

As April rolls around the Panthers will begin conference play. The Panthers will continue to compete against their MVC foes through the MVC Championships April 24-26 where they hope to fulfill their potential.

HEAD COACH SACHIN KIRTANE



Sachin Kirtane enters his seventh season as the University of Northern Iowa's women's tennis coach. Kirtane has compiled a career record of 74-49 coaching the Panthers. He is currently second in all-

time coaching wins and will have a chance to become UNI's winningest women's tennis coach this season. Kirtane needs 10 wins to surpass the current leader, Pete Mazula. Mazula also holds the all-time winning percentage mark (.664). Kirtane's all-time winning percentage is also second behind Mazula at .602.

The Panthers have achieved four consecutive winning seasons under Kirtane. In three out of the past four seasons, Kirtane has seen his team competing in or beyond the MVC semifinals. During the 2005 campaign, Kirtane led the Panthers to their first Missouri Valley

Conference championship match only to lose regular season champion Illinois State.

In 2007, Kirtane led the Panthers to a second place regular season finish in the Missouri Valley Conference with 6-2 league record. Kirtane has helped boost UNI's in-conference reputation. After having a combined conference record of 2-16 in his first two seasons, Kirtane's Panthers have boasted a 21-13 conference record over the last four seasons.

From 1998-2002, Kirtane was the assistant men's and women's tennis coach at Valdosta State University. He helped lead both teams to the finals of the Gulf South Conference Championships in 1998-99. In 2000, the men's team was ranked fourth in the nation. The women's team won the conference title and reached the semi-finals of the NCAA Division II Championship in Pensacola, Fla. In 2001, the men's team was ranked second in the nation and won its second consecutive conference title.

Kirtane graduated from VSU in 1998 with a marketing degree. In 2000, he earned his master's from VSU in business administration.

Kirtane was a scholarship athlete for VSU's tennis team from 1994-98. He was awarded

all-conference and all-America honors. He also was a member of the Student Advisory Committee. He participated in the Division II National Tournament and won the Gulf South Conference championship in 1995. He was named the team's Most Valuable Player in 1996. Kirtane was a member of the team that finished fourth in the national tournament in 1994-95. In 1992-93, he played professionally. He also played in the ITF International Junior Ranking Tournaments in 1990-91.

Kirtane was inducted into the Valdosta State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2005.

2007-08 REVIEW

It was another solid season for Panther tennis during the 2007-08 campaign. The Panthers completed the season 14-9 overall and 5-3 in the MVC, which was good enough for a fourth-place finish. This year marked UNI's fourth consecutive winning season.

"We took another step forward to establishing our team as a top conference competitor," said head coach Sachin Kirtane.

It seemed as if the Panthers were on the verge of a breakthrough during the conference tournament. After handling Southern Illinois 4-1 in the quarterfinal round, UNI fell to the eventual MVC champs No. 75 Indiana State in the semifinals.

Although the Sycamores won 4-0, the Panthers held their ground.

"We were right there toe-to-toe with Indiana State," said Kirtane. "We were close to making [our season] an even better [season], but a few close matches didn't go our way."

Leading up to the conference season, the Panthers traveled the country, boasting some impressive performances along the ride. Winning their first four meets, UNI went on to display an

8-5 record versus non-conference opponents. Some notable victories included sweeps of Missouri-Kansas City, Wisconsin-Green Bay and South Dakota State and a 4-3 defeat of Air Force. The Panthers rallied and won all three doubles matches to win a pivotal double point for the win during that contest.

UNI began its conference season by edging out in-state rival Drake 4-3. From that point, the Panthers went back and forth in wins and losses, defeating Bradley, Southern Illinois, Evansville and Creighton during their tour.

A pair of historic careers drew to a close with the season. Seniors Carolina Hannes and Meghana Paritala capped off their UNI tennis careers atop the all-time wins list.

Hannes (Sao Paulo, Brazil) bowed out with 86 career wins, the most-ever by a Panther, as she finished the season 22-12. Hannes also ended

her illustrious career as fourth all-time in singles winning percentage, winning 68 percent of her matches.

Paritala (Secunderabad, India) rode off into the sunset tied for second all-time in career singles wins behind her teammate Hannes. Winning 84 matches over her years as a Panther, Paritala accomplished the feat versus top competition, playing in the No. 1 singles position most of her career. Paritala also secured a spot as seventh in career singles winning percentage, ending victorious in 66.1 percent of her matches.

Hannes and Paritala's successes went beyond the tennis court as well. Both were named to the MVC Scholar-Athlete first team, and Hannes was honored as an Intercollegiate Tennis Association (ITA) Scholar-Athlete three times throughout her career.

"Both had outstanding careers, and they were model student-athletes as well," said Kirtane.

Hannes and Paritala were not the only Panthers with successful seasons. Freshman Diana Mendez (Bogota, Colombia) started her collegiate tennis career with a bang, obtaining the second most

singles wins on the team with a record of 20-12. Mendez was also the runner-up in No. 6 singles at the MVC Individual Championships.

There were triumphs in the doubles department

as well. The duo of sophomore Sampada Kanade (Mumbai, India) and junior Taynara Moraes (Santos, Brazil) placed second in No. 1 doubles at the MVC Individual Championships. Moraes and Paritala teamed up and compiled a record of 9-5 together

while playing at the No. 1 and No. 2 doubles spots. Freshman Laia Gonzalez-Garrido, who joined the team in January of 2008, and Hannes earned the most doubles wins as a pair a record of 10-7 at the No. 3 doubles position.

Troy Dannen
UNI Director of Athletics

Troy Dannen was named the University of Northern Iowa's Director of Athletics on May 29, 2008. He became the school's fifth director of athletics since UNI turned Division I in 1980.

It's a homecoming for Dannen, who attended UNI as an undergraduate in the 1980s. Although he's been off campus in a professional capacity for nearly 20 years, he has maintained close ties to the school.

Because of his passion to see UNI athletics continue to achieve the success it has had in recent years – and his desire to take the program to even greater heights – Dannen chose to leave his previous position as Executive Director of the Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union to lead the Panther athletic program. As he said on the day of his hiring, it took this unique opportunity to take him away from a job he enjoyed so much.

"I've had an opportunity to have two dream jobs," Dannen said. "I've enjoyed a dream job at the Athletic Union. It's one of the best jobs in the country. When the Athletic Union hired me six years ago to be their Executive Director, I was asked if there was any place I'd rather be. I told them, 'Well, some day, I'd like to go back to Northern Iowa'. Because that is THE dream job for me ... every personal and professional success in my life has its roots at Northern Iowa.

"It was never my dream to be an athletic director," Dannen said. "It was my dream to be the athletic director at Northern Iowa. There's no place I'd rather be. I'm out of dream jobs. I'm here for a good long time."

Dannen believes that Panther athletic department should value excellence in all endeavors, with its

primary objective being personal development and growth of its student-athletes.

Dannen believes in achieving that objective by focusing on the core educational mission of the University and ensuring the department acts with integrity and in a fiscally responsible manner. Through this, Panther athletics can continue to thrive, and achieve greater levels of success both on and off the course.

For the past six years, Dannen has served as Executive Director of the Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union (IGHSAU). As the governing body for high school sports in the state of Iowa, the IGHSAU oversees nearly 400 schools and more than 70,000 students, in the 11 sports offered by the Union.

Dannen has served in various capacities at the IGHSAU over the past 18 years, including serving nine years (1993-2002) as associate executive director. After taking over as executive director in 2002, Dannen formulated the first strategic plan in the Union's 82-year history, and that has led to some remarkable achievements the past half dozen years.

Dannen oversaw a 40 percent growth in the Union's budget on his watch, all the while operating the IGHSAU in the black, which has allowed for the establishment of a significant reserve fund. Sponsorship agreements have soared to new heights over the past six years, as Dannen has spearheaded expanding the Union's existing deals and developing landmark new corporate sponsors.

He was responsible for developing a new statewide, multi-media rights agreement for the IGHSAU. This new agreement – which includes radio, television and online audio and video streaming of IGHSAU state championship events – not only increased the exposure of girls' high school sports around the state, but also more than doubled the annual rights fees the IGHSAU was receiving previously from its radio and TV agreement.

The increased media exposure had a direct impact on the turnstiles at girls' high school athletic events, helping spur the interest in girls sports to

its highest levels. Softball, volleyball, track and field and five-player basketball have each set all-time attendance records at various state championship events in recent years, including the basketball tournament drawing 80,000 spectators over the six-day event.

Dannen also has been a strong advocate of recognizing academic achievement, creating several new scholarship programs. He also developed an IGHSAU academic award program that recognizes as many as 3,000 Iowa high school students each year who achieve at higher levels in the classroom while participating in sports.

With all those accomplishments, it is not surprising that the Des Moines Register listed him fourth in their 2005 ranking of the most powerful Iowans in Sports. He has received numerous honors and awards over the years, including the Pursuing Victory with Honor Award from the Iowa Institute of Character Development in 2005, and the Award of Excellence from the Iowa Girls' and Women in Sport in 1999.

In addition, Dannen has been active in community service in both the greater Des Moines area and around the state. He has been a member of the Iowa Games Board of Directors, the Greater Des Moines Sports Commission, and served on the AAU Junior Olympics Local Organizing Committee. He also has served on the Iowa Athletic Council, Iowa Referee Committee and the Drake Relays Committee. Dannen has also been active internationally, having twice in the past five years been a presenter in Malaysia – at the request of the Olympic Council of Malaysia – on the topic of youth sports and sport program development.

Born and raised on a farm near Marshalltown, Iowa, Dannen, 42, received his bachelor's degree in public relations with a minor in journalism from UNI in 1989. He and his wife, Lori, have two daughters: Emily (13) and Holly (9).



Jean Berger
Senior Associate Athletic Director/ Senior Woman Administrator

Jean Berger joined the University of Northern Iowa staff as senior associate athletic director and senior woman administrator in October 2008. At UNI, Berger is the direct supervisor of seven UNI women's sports. She also will be responsible for implementing and monitoring gender equity plans; assisting with marketing and budgeting of assigned programs; and providing support to the athletic compliance office and athletic academic advising.

Before coming to UNI, Berger worked for more than 17 years at Drake. Berger began working with the Bulldogs in 1991 as an assistant sports information director. In 1994 she took over as the senior woman administrator and assistant athletic director for internal affairs, and in 2005 she was promoted to senior associate athletic director.

Berger's responsibilities at Drake included supervision of 11 athletic programs and overseeing the department's student services, including compliance, academic support, sports medicine and strength and conditioning. She also worked as a sponsor for the Drake Student-Athlete Advisory Committee. She serves as the Missouri Valley Conference representative to the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Issues Committee, and she previously served a five-year term on the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee.

Berger also worked closely with Drake's Title IX Review and gender equity plan, the 1995 NCAA Midwest Women's Basketball Regional, two cycles of Drake's NCAA Certification self-study and the Drake Relays.

Before working at Drake, Berger spent one year as an assistant sports information director at Wichita State. From 1985-1990, Berger worked as the sports information director at Wayne State College.

Berger attended the University of Iowa, and she earned her bachelor's degree in journalism and her master's degree in physical education and sports studies. She is a native of Winterset, Iowa, and has two daughters, Jessica (22) and Jenna (14).



BENJAMIN ALLEN
University President

Benjamin J. Allen was named the ninth president of the University of Northern Iowa on April 28, 2006. President Allen assumed the duties of president at UNI on June 5, 2006.

Dr. Allen was the Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost at Iowa State University and was responsible to the President for all aspects of the academic programs of Iowa State.

Before joining the faculty at Iowa State University in 1979, Dr. Allen taught at Washington

State University and was a Brookings Economics Policy Fellow in the Office of

Transportation Regulatory Policy, U.S. Department of Transportation.

He served as chairman of the Department of Transportation and Logistics at Iowa State from 1984 to 1988. In 1988 Dr. Allen was named the first University Distinguished Professor in Business at Iowa State University.

He was the Visiting McKinley Professor of Economics and Public Utilities at the University of Illinois during the 1986-87 academic year and also held the Oren Harris Chair in Transportation at the University of Arkansas during the 1990-91 academic year.

Dr. Allen has also been a consultant for various private corporations and public agencies throughout his career. He served as Dean of the Iowa State University College of Business 1994-2000. During 2001-2002 he served as Interim Vice President for External Affairs.

He received his bachelor's degree in business economics from Indiana University and then went on to the University of Illinois for a Master's and a Ph.D. in economics.

THIS IS UNI

Building on a strong tradition of teacher education, the University of Northern Iowa has evolved into one of the finest comprehensive public universities in the country. UNI emphasizes excellence in undergraduate education and offers selected graduate programs at the master's, specialist's and doctoral levels.

UNI's heritage and philosophy place great value on providing a student-centered educational experience. The university offers a learning environment that is small enough to provide students with individualized attention, yet large enough to provide a variety of resources, including distinguished faculty. In 1961, the name was changed to State College of Iowa, and in 1967, the Iowa Legislature changed the status of the institution to that of a university under its present title.

FACILITIES

BLACK HAWK TENNIS CENTER

Beginning its ninth year of hosting the University of Northern Iowa tennis team, the Black Hawk Tennis Club (BHTC) is an all-season facility.

It boasts six indoor courts, six outdoor courts with a multilevel deck to view all the matches, an exercise room, pro shop and locker rooms. John Delorbe, owner of the BHTC since 1989 says the Club has great viewing areas both at the inside and outside courts.

The Club also hosts many special activities, such as clinics and lessons, Ladies and Men's Leagues, Junior Development Programs, mixed doubles tournaments and club meets. The club also hosts 10-15 Panther meets a season and practices.

The BHTC is the premiere facility in the Cedar Valley for year-round tennis.



During the athlete's first year on campus, baseline measures of strength, speed, power, flexibility and endurance are collected. Measures of both body composition and weight are also recorded. With this information, goals are set for development and maintenance. Programs are established for each athlete by the Strength and Conditioning coach Jed Smith who joined the Panther staff in June 2005.

SPORTS MEDICINE

The UNI sports medicine program features top-rate facilities and the outstanding services of sports and health care professionals.

The sports medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Merac strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capability and outline programs to improve an athlete's flexibility.

Athletic trainers and physicians work together to design rehabilitation programs for injured athletes. A wide variety of facilities and equipment, not only in the Sports Medicine Lab but in the Wellness and Recreation Center, including swimming pools, Merac equipment, Stairmasters and various exercise equipment, help athlete's rehabilitate injuries and minimize the loss of fitness during recuperative time.

THE HUMAN PERFORMANCE CENTER

Quality field experiences and a strong training regimen are hallmarks of a UNI education. These standards and yet another exciting opportunity for community partnership lie at the heart of a new Human Performance Center built as part of a facility adjoining the west side of the Wellness Recreation Center.

The HPC enables students and faculty from UNI's School of Health, Physical Education and Leisure Services to collaborate with area medical professionals on a daily basis. The HPC houses several of the School's academic, research and public service programs, including the National Program for Playground Safety, Camp Adventure Youth Services, Global Health Corps and Youth Agency Administration.

The new facility also has a Sports Medicine Center, including office and treatment spaces for physicians and therapists that play a vital role in UNI's fastest-growing athletic training major. The HPC, in conjunction with the proposed UNI strength and conditioning facility which will be located at the north end of the UNI-Dome, also will serve UNI's intercollegiate athletic programs by creating classrooms, coaches' offices, team rooms, conference rooms, training facilities and locker rooms for player development activities, including strength conditioning, nutritional advising, and agility/speed activities.

STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING

The UNI strength and conditioning program is a blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each student-athlete.

Throughout the year, UNI athletes can spend more time working on strength and condition than any other aspect of their sport. During the off-season, athletes work on strength improvement, speed, power, ability and conditioning.



One of the most important aspects of a future productive life is your education. Fortunately, this education period comes early in life while you have the time and energies necessary to accomplish this very worthwhile goal. Obtaining a college education and ultimately a degree is the student-athlete's responsibility. The education process means managing your time wisely so that the educational, athletic and social aspects of your life have an appropriate share of time.

At given times, students may find it necessary to ask for help in accomplishing an educational task. At UNI, the following services are available to students for obtaining guidelines and/or specific help.

EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM

The mission of the educational opportunity program is to provide supportive services which are essential for the identification, recruitment, retention and graduation of minority and educationally disadvantaged students who traditionally have not had equal access to higher educational institutions. Services provided to participants include:

- Academic and career counseling
- Tutorial services
- Financial aid counseling and advising
- Personal counseling
- Course selection and registration
- Educational planning

In order to be an EOP participant, the student must be a minority student or be educationally disadvantaged, as evidenced by having an ACT score of 15 or less and/or placing in the bottom half of his/her high school graduating class.

ACADEMIC COUNSELING

An advisor has been assigned responsibilities across the athletics department and will assist you in:

- Scheduling
- Choice of major
- Selection of a major advisor
- Tutorial services
- Maintain satisfactory progress toward a degree

The athletics academic advisor works closely with the university's academic advising services to provide a variety of services to help students achieve their personal, career and academic goals. Professional and peer advisors help students:

- Prioritize life/professional goals
- Utilize university resources
- Select appropriate courses
- Resolve academic difficulties
- Interpret institutional academic requirements

Assistant Athletics Director
for Compliance

Steve Schofield joined the UNI athletics staff in August of 2006. He is responsible for implementing and maintaining a comprehensive compliance program for UNI's student-athletes, coaches, staff, and other university constituents. He is UNI's liaison to the NCAA and Missouri Valley Conference on all compliance-related matters including recruiting, eligibility, financial aid, rules interpretations, waivers and violations. He also assists with UNI's student life initiatives.

Prior to UNI, Schofield served as assistant athletics director for compliance at Florida State University. At FSU, his duties included coordinating financial aid, rules interpretations, NCAA and Atlantic Coast Conference waivers, rules education and investigating and reporting secondary violations.

Schofield has a wide and varied background, as he has also served in the athletic department compliance offices at Maryland and Minnesota. A native of Odebolt, Iowa, Schofield received his bachelor's degree in general studies from UNI in 2000, and a master's degree in higher and postsecondary education from Arizona State in 2003.

The reading/learning strategies program provides many services for students, including free four-week courses in:

- **Speed-reading:** double your reading rate
- **Effective study strategies:** practice techniques for learning, managing time and preparing for exams
- **Study reading:** open to students referred by the teacher education program

THIS IS THE VALLEY

The Missouri Valley Conference enters its 102nd year at the start of the 2008-09 academic year, and the nation's second-oldest NCAA Division I conference continues to be a leader in college athletics.

The Valley continues to lead by example as one of college athletics' most progressive conferences. The Valley emphasizes the importance of the student-athlete and is aggressive in its approach to provide opportunities for its member institutions.

In 2007-08 the first-ever neutral site Valley women's basketball tournament was staged at the St. Charles Family Arena before good crowds, with top-seeded Illinois State earning the title and representing the league in the NCAA Tournament. The league's season-ending RPI was No. 8 of 31 conferences.

Based in St. Louis since 1985, the league is assertive in its approach to hosting NCAA basketball championship events, operating a revenue-producing in-house television network, bidding out the right to host sport championships and landing title sponsorships for those events.

The success of The Valley television package is one of the great stories in the league, in terms of the clearance of the men's basketball tournament title game on national broadcast television, the excellent national and regional coverage for basketball and other sports, and the effective sale of advertising content to more than 25 companies. The MVC Television Network has blossomed into a revenue-generating vehicle and The Valley's most visible marketing tool.

During the tenure of Doug Elgin, The Valley's ninth and longest-tenured commissioner, The Valley has been aggressive in hosting NCAA events in St. Louis. That role came to a spectacular climax in April 2005 as the conference collaborated with local partners to stage the Men's Final Four at the Edward Jones Dome.

This continuing involvement of the MVC in hosting NCAA events represents one of the most concentrated stretches of host opportunities for any university or conference in the 70-year history of the national championship tournament. The 2005 host opportunity was the sixth in eight years for The Valley in St. Louis. The league had previously hosted men's regionals in 1998, 1999 and 2004; a men's first/second round event in 2002 and the Women's Final Four in 2001. The Valley hosted a men's basketball regional in 2007 and will host a Women's Final Four in 2009 and a men's basketball regional in 2010. Additionally, Creighton and The Valley co-hosted a men's basketball first and second round in 2008 in Omaha.

And while the Missouri Valley Conference has been progressive in pursuing NCAA events, it has continued to be a national leader in the athletic arena. And starting in 1995-96, the conference broke new ground by allowing league members to bid for hosting rights for select team sport championships. By establishing uniform host criteria, the conference is able to assist a host institution in a season-long promotional campaign

and provide an avenue where hosts can acquire sponsors and achieve a profit for the event.

The 2003-04 season was a landmark season for the conference as State Farm Insurance and the league came to terms on an agreement that provides State Farm with title sponsorship of all of the league's 18 championships. That agreement was enhanced for the 2007-08 season. The conference's progressive marketing and in-house television package has helped open doors to regional and national sponsors outside of the realm of title sponsorships, as the league's men's basketball tournament sponsorship revenues continues to reach all-time highs.

Meanwhile, the league has been progressive in other areas, as it has taken its merchandise program in-house, while offering e-commerce solutions for league apparel, championship photography and a conference-wide videostreaming package.

The seeds for this vision were planted by eight administrators representing five institutions, who met at the Midland Hotel in Kansas City, Mo., on Jan. 12, 1907. The five schools which formed the Missouri Valley Intercollegiate Athletic Association were Washington University of St. Louis, and the state universities of Iowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska. Two months after the initial meeting, two more schools -- Drake University and Iowa State College -- were admitted.

In the fall of 1907, basketball became the first competitive sport. Today, the Missouri Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country and track & field (indoor and outdoor), men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, women's swimming and diving, men's and women's tennis, and women's volleyball.

While The Valley no longer sponsors football (it

did from 1907-85), six league members compete in football at the FCS (Football Championship Subdivision) level as Illinois State, Indiana State, Missouri State, Northern Iowa and Southern Illinois play in the nine-member Missouri Valley Football Conference (with North Dakota State, South Dakota State, Western Illinois and Youngstown State). That league competed as the Gateway Conference from 1985-2007. Drake plays non-scholarship football in the Pioneer Football League.

This season, the league will conduct its 98th outdoor track and field championship, its 91st tennis championship, its 55th baseball tournament, and its 71st golf championship for the men. Those programs, plus other current sponsored sports of cross country (50 years), indoor track (42), soccer (18) and swimming and diving (15), have helped solidify the Missouri Valley Conference as one of the most respected conferences nationally.

Athletic accomplishments on the men's athletics side include 10 national basketball championships, 16 trips to the NCAA Final Four, a 1989 national baseball championship and 19 College World Series qualifiers. In 2001, Missouri State added to The Valley women's accomplishments, as the Lady Bears advanced to the Women's Basketball Final Four in St. Louis. Creighton (2004) and Missouri State (2005) have claimed national championships (WNIT) in women's basketball, while MSU also has a 1992 NCAA Women's Final Four appearance, and Creighton (2003) and Drake (1999) have made semifinal trips to the WNIT postseason tournament.

Indeed, the inclusion of women's programs under The Valley banner has provided a boost. The Gateway Collegiate Athletic Conference -- which began in 1982 -- merged with the Missouri Valley Conference and was unveiled as part of the new conference on July 1, 1992.
