### **Fact Sheets Available from the Connecticut Sea Grant Program**

Informational fact sheets are available free of charge from the Connecticut Sea Grant Marine Advisory Program.

Based on information obtained in a study of the Long Island Sound, the materials cover such topics as hypoxia, waste water treatment, seafood issues, various forms of pollution and models used to study water pollution (particularly those used in the Long Island Sound Study).

The program coordinators are planning to combine the nine fact sheets currently available into a facts booklet for the Long Island Sound Study (including an additional fact sheet on toxics), but, until that publication is complete, the fact sheets will continue to be available.

Utilizing the materials from the Long Island Sound Study, teachers may find it possible to construct an interesting unit comparing the problems faced by ecologists on the East Coast with those currently at issue in the Midwest.
