Recent issues of *Outdoor Ethics* have included articles about hunting, illegal animal collecting, wilderness expansion and camping.

The publication is provided as part of the League's Outdoor Ethics program. The program, begun in 1978, is designed to act as a clearinghouse for information on outdoor ethics. Its main focus is to promote ethical and responsible behavior among recreationists and others who enjoy the outdoor heritage.

Endangered Species Information Available

The American Gas Association is offering an endangered species information packet free of charge to science educators. Included in the packet is an activities guide for teachers and a full-color classroom poster.

The guide and the poster focus on 12 specific endangered species: the American bald eagle, Englemann's purple-spined hedgehog cactus, Florida manatees, Florida panthers, the gray wolf, grizzly bears, Hawaiian monk seals, leatherback sea turtles, the piping plover, the small whorled pogonia, whooping cranes and the wood stork. The kit can be used to support any nature-oriented study concerning endangered species and offers several suggestions for classroom activities. A reference list offers the addresses of various endangered species "information organizations." The poster features photographs of each of the 12 endangered species in their natural habitats.
