rials available through its mail order service.

Educational materials available through NASA CORE include videotape, slide and filmstrip programs chronicling NASA's state-of-the-art research and technology. Through the use of these curriculum supplement materials, teachers can provide their students with the latest in aerospace information. NASA materials are available for use in discussions of life science, physical science, astronomy, energy, earth resources, environment, mathematics and career education.
