Nature Photography Workshop to be Held at Springbrook State Park

Kindergarten through twelfth grade teachers will once again have the opportunity to improve their nature photography skills during a three-day program Nature Photography Workshop. Sponsored by the University of Northern Iowa (UNI) Division of Continuing Education and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR), the workshop will be held May 5-7 at the Conservation Education Center at Springbrook State Park.

Workshop participants will photograph the prairie and woodlands in and near Springbrook. Slides will be processed Saturday night, arranged for a short presentation and viewed on Sunday. Experienced photographers will assist participants in preparing slide programs for classroom use. Presenters will include Bill Witt (photo journalist, UNI), Bob Rye (Conservation Education Center Director, DNR) and Carl Bollwinkel (Associate Professor of Teaching and Science Education, UNI).

The deadline for preregistration (including a \$25 non-refundable deposit) is April 24. The number of registrants is limited and early registration is encouraged.

Total cost of the workshop is \$139. This covers room, meals, tuition and two rolls of 35mm film and processing. One semester hour of graduate workshop credit from UNI will be awarded to participants upon completion of the workshop. An optional post weekend photo assignment will be given.
