The Resource Center operates the National Clearinghouse on Post-secondary Education for Handicapped Individuals and serves as an information exchange regarding educational support services, policies, procedures, adaptations and opportunities for handicapped students in American colleges, vocational-technical schools, adult education programs and other post-secondary training programs.

The fact sheet is available free of charge and includes sections directed towards the student, the instructor and the administrator as well as listing of disability accommodations and distributors and manufacturers of various aids.

Chemistry Project Booklet Available

An informative booklet entitled "A Chemistry Project from Start to Finish" has been made available by the American Chemical Society. Designed to aid teachers in assigning student projects, the booklet allows students to choose topics that interest them and to plan projects that fulfill their own personal goals.

Besides suggesting formats for carryng out projects, the booklet explains how to decide what to do and the best course of action in pursuing a topic. It also gives several ideas for references that would be helpful to students, including magazines (such as *Discover* and *Science News*), teachers and area experts.

For students interested in doing written reports, the booklet provides a basic structural outline including title, abstract and main section. It also recommends plans for written and experimental reports, oral reports and exhibitions.
