Outstanding Science Student Award

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OUTSTANDING SCIENCE STUDENT AWARD

Through a grant from the Rolscreen Company of Pella, Iowa, the Iowa Academy of Science is making available to every high school in Iowa two 2-inch bronze medals for presentation to an outstanding senior boy and girl science student. The medal, shown above, has the Iowa Academy of Science logo on the one side, and the reverse side is imprinted "Outstanding Science Student Award sponsored by Rolscreen Company" with a place for the student's name to be engraved.

The principal of a school can nominate one male and one female to receive medals. The students should meet the following criteria:

1. senior status
2. four years of science, grades 9-12, including chemistry and physics
3. minimum graderage of B in all science courses
4. rank in top one-quarter of the high school graduating class

A statement of support from a science teacher should be included in the principal's letter of recommendation. This statement should assess the following points:

1. ability to learn science as demonstrated through tests, projects, class activities, etc.
2. interest/enthusiasm for the study of science
3. potential for further study in the field of science

The Student Programs Committee of the Iowa Academy of Science will make the final selection of award recipients. **ALL RECOMMENDATIONS MUST REACH THE COMMITTEE BY APRIL 6, 1984.** Materials should be sent to:
