PUBLICATION POLICY

Publications will be received from all individuals interested in science education at any academic level. Preferential treatment will be given to Academy members and to papers with problems indigenous to the scientific and educational interest of science educators in Iowa.

All non-solicited manuscripts submitted to the editor will be reviewed by two authorities in the area concerned. All manuscripts should be typewritten, double spaced on one side of the paper, and submitted in duplicate. They must reach the editor twelve weeks prior to publication if they are to be considered for a specific issue. Publication deadlines are April, September and December.
