STUDENT EVALUATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES MEETING

The Prairie College Community, Joint County (Area X), Linn County Area Science Educators, and the Iowa Science Teachers Section of the Iowa Academy of Science are co-sponsoring a meeting concerning student evaluation and environmental studies. The meeting is scheduled for March 10 at the Prairie College Community with registration beginning at 8:00 A.M. Formal and informal, large and small group discussions will be conducted. A \$1.00 box lunch (chicken) will be delivered at noon. In addition, coffee and rolls will be available.

WINTER ECOLOGY IN ACTION

Over sixty students and teachers were actively involved in the IJAS sponsored Winter Field Survey at Springbrook State Park. The Field Survey was coordinated by Frank Starr, Field Program Director of IJAS, and Dr. Eugene Brady from Perry Community High School.

The students participated in several field trips including a bird survey, Boy's Branch and Laking Slough, and Aquatic Sampling. Most of the action centered around aquatic sampling and analyzing the various physical factors that influence plankton activities. In addition, the students took advantage of the clear skies and studied the heavens during late evening.

With the assistance of Curtis Powell, Director of the Conservation Education Center, Carmen Slater and Ken Frazier of Project ECO, and other capable teachers, the weekend proved to be most rewarding. Dr. Landers from Ames gave a presentation concerning "Planet and Earth."

Several more student programs sponsored by IJAS are planned for the near future. These include a junior high and an elementary Springbrook Field Survey, Red Rock Survey, Bloody Run and a trip to Argonne National Laboratories.
